#### PROCLAMATION.

GORE BROWNE, Companion of the
Most Honourable Order of the
Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's

of the same, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by an Ordinance enacted by the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, Session III., No. 1, intituled "An Ordinance for establishing a Supreme Court," it is provided that there shall be holden Circuit Courts for the despatch of Civil and Criminal business of the Court, before one of the Judges thereof, at such places and at such times as the Governor shall, with the advice of the Executive Council, by profession, from time to time appoint.

NOW 2 JEREFORE, I, the Governor, with

Now LIEREFORE, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby Proclaim and appoint that Circuit Courts shall be holden at Dunediu, in the Southern District of the said Colony, on the fifteenth day of January and the fifteenth day of July, in every year, or as soon after the said day as conveniently may be. And in case any one of the said days, so fixed as aforesaid, shall happen to be a Sunday or holiday, then the Court appointed for such day shall be holden on the day following.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare, that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the dates hereinafter specified, viz.,

#### ABRAHAM HONORE,

From the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine. Native of Denmark. Assistant Missionary. Residence—Jacob's River, in the Province of Otago.

#### CARSTEN HEINRICH HORMANN,

From the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine. Native of Germany, Sawyer. Residence—Invercargill, in the Province of Otago.

JOHANN GE RG GOHL,

#### WARNAMBOOL HABBOR LIGHT.

The lighthouse at Warrnambool is situated on Middle Island; its approximate position is lat. 38 ° 26' S., long. 142 ° 32' E.

The light is a fixed white light elevated seventy-eight (78) feet above the mean level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather at the distance of about thirteen (13) nautic miles allowing ten (10) feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The light will be visible to seaward from all

points of the compass.

Caution.—Vessels from the westward should not bring the light to bear to the southward of E.  $\frac{3}{2}$  S., nor to the westward of N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. if from the eastward.

No stranger should attempt to enter this harbor at night, nor should the light be approached within one (1) mile.

Bearings taken from the lighthouse and the approximate distances :-

S.E. extremity of reef S.E. by E. D., 5 cables length.

Southern extremity of E. 1 S., 2 miles. Hopkins Reef
