SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Castle Point District.

Waingongoro Block, estimated to contain 7,000 Acres.

The boundary commences at the confluence of the Makatote creek with the Mataikona river and follows the Makatote creek to Ruapekapeka and on to Tiwhanui, thence down the Waingongoro creek to the Aohanga river, thence westerly up the Aohanga river until it reaches the boundary of the land sold in 1853 to the Crown, thence southerly along the boundary of the Crown Land to the confluence of the Makatote creek and Mataikona river.

Reserve.

200 Acres on the Aohanga river for Hoera Rautu.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Wairarapa District.

Maungaraki Block.

Estimated to contain 10,200 acres.

The boundary commences at the Waioaterangi-akaaka on the Tauheru river, thence eastward to Te Potihitihi, Te Rae o Hinekaia,

Te Parakataka, Te Puta, Te Maungakainui, Te Paketete, Te Kirikaohi Tapuakia Te Koangaumu, Hineakiri Te Rae o te Hunga on the Wainui-oru river, thence up the Wainuioru river to Poki, thence eastward along the boundary of the Land sold to the Crown to Mamaupuha, thence down the Waipawa stream to its confluence with the Tauheru thence down the Tauheru river to the Rangiakaaka, where the boundaries commenced.

Reserve.

50 acres at the foot of the Pukemokitnoki Hill on the Tauheru river.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Forty Mile Bush District.

Ihuraua Block.

Estimated to contain 25,000 acres.

The boundary commences at the confluence of the Waitehoro and Ihuraua rivers, thence up the Ihuraua to its confluence with the Hoe river; up the Hoe river to a point where it strikes to the westward, and on to Mongapuka, on the Tiraumea, down the Tiraumea river to its confluence with the Mangaone, thence down the Mangaone river to Kaitiaki, thence in a line eastward to the source of the Waitehoro down the Waitehoro river to its confluence with the Ihuraua river, where the boundaries commenced.

Reserve.

21 acres at the junction of the Ihuraua and Hoe rivers for Karanama, and is more particularly delineated on a plan now deposited in the Crown Lands' Office in Wellington.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Wairarapa District.

Tupurupuru Block.

Containing about 35,000 Acres.

The boundary commences at Waihorohika on the Tauheru river, and down the Tauheru southward to Tamikiwaha, thence to the Kiki on the Makahakaha stream up the Makahakaha to Mongahua, thence eastward to Matangikahau, Kahapahapa, Pukemanga-manga, Parangiao, Te Parapara Kourarau, thence westward to Kakanui, thence down the Maringiawai to the foot of the hill, thence along the foot of the hills to Te Wharo, Te Manga o te whitau, Autokitoki, Te Whakarai, Wai-koko, Taumata Taurahingako, thence eastward to the cliffs below Hinewaka, Te Po o te rehunga, Te Manga o te Pohatu, Pari wharariki on the Maungaraki range, Te Whawhati wahine, thence down the Mangoriki creek into Wainuiora river, up the Wainuiora river northward to te Horo, thence westward, Taurangi, Waipapa, Wai o te Rangi, Te Ngutu koko, Awhenua, Waihaingangina, Te Motu o te Topuna, thence down the Umu o te Ranga creek to Waihorohika on the Tauheru river, where the boundaries commenced.

The following reserves are made within the above boundaries for the Natives and are marked off on the ground:—

- 897 acres for Wairua and others on the Wainuiora river.
- 100 acres for Maika Purakau on the Tauheru.
- 495 acres for Wiremu Kingi te Hiakai on the Tauheru.
- 50 acres for Heneri Kingi on the Tauheru.
- 100 acres for Ngairo, and others at Tupurupuru.
- 100 acres for Te Kaninamu on the Tauheru.
- 200 acres on the Makahakaha.

The foregoing reserves are more particularly delineated on the plan now deposited in the Crown Lands' Office in Wellington.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Forty Mile Bush District.

Makuri Block.

Estimated to contain 12,000 acres.

The boundary commences at Wahatuara, thence running south on Pelichet's boundary line of the Castle Point Block to Manuriki on the Tiraumea river, thence westward up the Tiraumea to the Makuri, thence up the Makuri river northward to a point westward of Wahatuara, thence in a straight line to Wahatuara, where the boundaries commenced.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Wairarapa District.

Pihautea Block, area 518 acres.

Bidwell's Homestead.

BOUNDARIES.

Commencing at the Ruamahanga river at Manawawiri, thence westerly in a straight line (bearing by compass) $249^{\circ} 9'$ to the Whare-

huata, thence in a N.W. direction to the Pushi, thence in a straight line to the west end of the Waiapokopoko swamp and through the swamp in a straight line (bearing by compass) $290^{\circ} 30'$ to Te Maire up the Maire stream to the Kokoti stream and up the Kokoti to a marked stake thence to the Wakapaua, thence easterly in a straight line (bearing by compass) $27^{\circ} 30'$ to a stake on the Ruamahanga, thence following the course of the Ruamahanga river to Manawawiri, the point of commencement.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Waikanae District.

Wainui Block, area 30,000 acres.

BOUNDARIES.

Commencing on the sea coast at the mouth of the Whareroa stream, up the stream to the Whareroa settlement, thence in a straight line over the hills to Papapauponga, thence southerly along the boundary of the land formerly ceded by the Ngatekahungunu to the Crown, to Pawakataka, whence it turns in a westerly direction in a straight line over the hills to Ponawa and on to Tunupo crossing the road and running in a straight line (bearing by compass) to the Ana-a-hau on the sea coast, and along the sea coast (north) to Paekakariki, Wainui, and to the mouth of the Whareroa stream, the point of commencement.

Reserves.

Whareroa Settlement	17 acres.
Wainui Township.....	135 "
Paekakariki Settlement... ..	135 "
Ngapaipurus Cultivations.	280 "
Te Rongo o te wers.....	160 "
Te Puka.....	60 "

A piece of land situated at Paekakariki six and a half acres in extent is conveyed by Deed of Gift from the aboriginal owners to the half cast children of John and Peti Nicol.

A piece of land situated also at Paekakariki two and a half acres is conveyed by Deed of Gift from the aboriginal owners to Henry Flurgent.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Wairarapa District.

Trohanga Block, area 1700 acres.

BOUNDARIES.

Commencing at the confluence of the O-whangai stream with the Ruamahanga river, running in a north-easterly direction (bearing by compass $49^{\circ} 00'$) to Mangapungapunga on the Kopuaranga river, thence down the river to its confluence with the Ruamahanga, thence up the Ruamahanga to the mouth of the O-whangai stream, being the point of commencement.

PROVINCE OF WELLINGTON.

Wairarapa District.

Manaia Block, area 5500 acres.

BOUNDARIES.

Commencing at the Waihirere on the Wai-ngawa river, thence down that river to where it empties itself into the Ruamahanga river, thence

up that river to a small grassy plain named Pukohiwi, thence in a westerly direction through the forest to the Kuripuni stream, thence up the stream to the bridge, thence to a trigonometrical station of Captain Smith's and on in a straight line to the outer or south point of Mr. Donald's fence, thence in a straight line to a point 1540 links due north of the Waihirere, being the point of commencement.

A section of a hundred acres is reserved for Ngatuere Tawhao, at the Pukohiwi within the above boundaries.

CUSTOMS-COMMISSIONER'S ORDER,
No. 3.

WHEREAS by the Seventeenth (17th) Section of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," it is enacted, that the Commissioner of Customs may order and direct in which ports or places goods cleared for drawback, or from the warehouse, shall be carried or waterborne to be put on board any ship for exportation—or goods carried or waterborne from any importing ship to, or to be landed at, any wharf, quay, or other place, shall be so carried or waterborne only by persons authorised for that purpose by license of the Commissioner.

Now, therefore, I, the Commissioner of Customs, in exercise of the power in this behalf given me by the herein before in part recited, Act do hereby order and direct, that from and after the First day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the Ports of Auckland, Wellington, and Lyttelton, shall be Ports in which goods cleared for drawback, or from the warehouse, shall be carried or waterborne to be put on board ship for exportation, and also goods carried or waterborne from any importing ship to, or to be landed at any wharf, quay, or other place, shall be so carried or waterborne—only by persons authorised for that purpose by license of the Commissioner.
