#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS
GORE BROWNE, Companion of the
Most Honorable Order of the
Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's
Colony of New Zealand, and its
Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral
of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette to divide the Colony of New Zealand for the purposes of the said Act into such and so many Districts as he may think fit, and that every such District shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into Districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of Districts, as from time to time he may think requisite. And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued bearing date the sixth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did divide the said Colony for the purposes of the said Act into Districts, the names and boundaries whereof are therein set forth, comprising amongst others the "Raglan District," the "Kawhia District," and the "Rangiawhia District." And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said Three Districts:

Now, therefore, I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and further exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, so far as relates to the said "Raglan District," "Kawhia District," and "Rangiawhia District," and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such Districts shall be divided for the purposes of the said Act into Two Districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

# RAGLAN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line passing midway between the North and South head of Whaingaroa Harbour, thence passing up the mid-channel of the Northern branch of the said Harbour to its junction with the Waitetuna River, thence along the mid-channel of the Waitetuna to where the road to the Native Village of Wata Wata crosses it; thence along the road to Wata Wata to the summit of the Ridge of hills lying on the West bank of the Waipa River. On the East by the Ridge of the Waipa and Pirongia hills on the Western side of the Waipa, extending to the source of that River. On the South by a straight line running from the source of the Waipa to the source of the Mokau River, thence down the mid-channel of the Mokau to the sea. On the West by the Sea.

## RANGIAWHIA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the mid-channel of the Horotiu branch of the Waikato River to its junction with Lake Taupo, thence by the Eastern shore of Lake Taupo and by the mid-channel of the Upper Waikato unto its junction with the Southern boundary of the Province. On the West by the Ridge of the Pirongia and Waipa hills, lying on the West of the Waipa River, and extending from the junction of the Waipa and Horotiu Rivers to the source of the former, thence by a straight line to the source of the Mokau River, thence by the Western boundary of the Province to its junction with the Tunua River, and along the Thirty-ninth degree of South latitude, being the Southern boundary of the Province, to its junction with the Upper Waikato.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the First day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty.

W HEREAS by "The Registration Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to divide the Colony of New Zealand for the purposes of the solid Act into contact. purposes of the said Act into such and so many Districts as he may think fit, and that every such District shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into Districts, or increasing the number, or altering the boundaries of Districts, as from time to time he may think requisite. And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did divide the said Colony for the purposes of the said Act into Districts, the names and boundaries whereof are therein set forth, comprising amongst others the "Raglan District," the "Kawhia District," and the "Rangiawhia District."

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said Three Districts:

Now, therefore, I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and further exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as relates to the said "Raglan District," "Kawhia District," and "Rangiawhia District," and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such Districts shall be divided for the purposes of the said Act into Two Districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

#### RAGLAN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line passing midway between the North and South head of Whaingaroa Harbour, thence passing up the mid-channel of the Northern branch of the said Harbour to its junction with the Waitetuna River, thence along the mid-channel of the Waitetuna to where the road to the Native Village of Wata Wata crosses it; thence along the road to Wata Wata to the summit of the Ridge of hills lying on the West bank of the Waipa river. On the East by the Ridge of the Waipa and Pirongia hills on the Western side of the Waipa extending to the source of that river. On the South by a straight line running from the source of the Waipa to the source of the Mokau river, thence down the mid-channel of the Mokau to the sea. On the West by the Sea.

#### RANGIAWHIA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the mid-channel of the Horotiu branch of the Waikato river to its junction with Lake Taupo, thence by the Eastern shore of Lake Taupo and by the mid-channel of the Upper Waikato unto its junction with the Southern boundary of the Province. On the West by the Ridge of the Pirongia and Waipa hills lying on the West of the Waipa River and extending from the junction of the Waipa and Horotiu Rivers to the source of the former, thence by a straight line to the source of the Mokau River, thence by the Western boundary of the Province to its junction with the Tunua River, and along the Thirty-ninth degree of South latitude, being the Southern boundary of the Province, to its junction with the Upper Waikato.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the First day of September, One thousand

eight hundred and sixty.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS Gore Browne, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by Superintendent as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof; and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within Three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill; and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas the Ordinance hereinafter specified has been enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, with the advice and consent of the Provincial & ouncil thereof; and the said Ordinance was received by the Governor on the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinance should be disallowed:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Ordinance, passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, viz:—

"The Trespass of Cattle Ordinance."

E. W. STAFFORD.

Onehunga, 27th July, 1860, 10 a.m. Sir,-I have the painful duty to report to Bath, Governor and Commander- your Honor that I have just received information from Hugh Evans (signalman) that my son Edward, on Wednesday last, after my leaving the Station, in charge of the "Airedale," discovered the stern frame of a Vessel on the beach, about four miles North of Manukau Heads, and on further inspection, saw the name, "Union," of Sydney, but no trace of her crew, except an imperfect shoe mark on the beach abreast of the wreck.

I am also informed that my son is making further search Westward respecting this unfor tunate circumstance, and now proceed to the Heads with all possible despatch, employing extra boatmen, as part of my crew is sick.

## COMMISSIONER'S ORDER.

No. 5.

WHEREAS by the seventeenth (17th) section of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," it is enacted that the Commissioner of Customs may order and direct in which ports or places, goods cleared for drawback, or from the warehouse, shall be carried or waterborne to be put on board any ship for exportation, or goods carried or waterborne from any importing ship to, or to be landed at any wharf, quay, or other place, shall be so carried or waterborne only by persons authorised for that purpose by license of the Commissioner. Now, therefore, I, the Commissioner of Customs, in exercise of the power in this behalf given me by the herein-before in part recited Act, do hereby order and direct that from and after the thirtieth day of September next, the Port of Dunedin shall be a Port in which goods cleared for drawback or from the Warehouse, shall be carried or waterborne to be put on board ships for exportation; and also goods carried or waterborne from any importing ship to, or to be landed at any wharf, quay, or other place, shall be so carried or waterborne—only by persons authorised for that purpose by license of the Commissioner.
