A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of CHRISTIAN FREDERICK HANNEKE and FREDERICK LONNEKER.

By His Excellency COLONEL THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Naturalization Act, 1860," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been from such specified time, a Natural-born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now therefore I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act from the dates herein-

after specified, viz. :—

CHRISTIAN FREDERICK HANNEKE,
—From the Twenty-sixth day of November, One Thousand eight-hundred and sixty, native of Germany, Shepherd,—residence Wellington, in the Province of Wellington.

FREDERICK LONNEKER,
—From the Twentieth day of October, One Thousand eight hundred and sixty, native of Hanover, Settler,—residence Riverton, in the Province of Otago.
