A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of J. F. J. HAAST.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Naturalization Act, 1860," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been from such specified time, a Natural-born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the person hereinafter mentioned, shall come within the operation of the said Act from the date hereinafter specified, viz. :—

JOHANN FRANZ JULIUS HAAST,

—From the eighteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, Native of Prussia; geologist; residence, Christchurch, Province of Canterbury.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

Warrant abolishing a Polling Place and appointing another in lieu thereof.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETING:

WHEREAS by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint

Polling Places for each Electoral District within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such Places to be the Principal Polling Place for the District, and all or any of such Polling Places at any time to abolish, and to appoint other Polling Places in lieu thereof:

And whereas by Warrant under the hand of the Governor, bearing date the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, the Schoolroom, Lower Moutere, was appointed a Polling Place for the Motueka District for the election of Members of the House of Representatives: and whereas it is expedient to abolish the same:

Now KNOW YE, that I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby abolish the above named Polling Place for the Motueka District for the election of Members of the House of Representatives, and to appoint in lieu thereof the Schoolhouse, Upper Moutere.

James Williamson -	Mangawhai - - -	This is a derivative claim under original claim No. 383 (c), of William Mayhew, alleged to have been purchased from the Natives by J. R. Clendon in 1839. Commissioner Godfrey, 24th March, 1843, recommended no grant, the purchase having been completed after the Proclamation of 1840; but recommended, as compensation for outlay in the purchase, a Grant to William Mayhew, for 200 acres of any land of average value. No Grant issued. Derivative claim admitted, and notification filed under the Acts.
Rev. Thomas Buddle -	Kopua, Waipa - - -	This is a claim under Pre-emption Certificate, No. 248, issued 12th November, 1845, in favour of James Wallis, on behalf of the Wesleyan Missionary Society. Commissioner Matson reported, 28th March, 1848, that no Survey had been sent in. Claim thereupon disallowed, 6th April, 1848.
Robert Twaites -	Ngunguru - - -	This was an original claim, No. 303 & 303 (a.) Commissioner Godfrey, 1st December, 1842, recommended no Grant, claimant not appearing. Pre-emption Certificates, Nos. 176 & 177, dated 28th February, 1845, were issued in favour of claimant for a fresh purchase of the land. Commissioner Matson reported, 27th March, 1848, that no Survey had been sent in. Claim thereupon disallowed, 6th April, 1848.
Robert Hardiman -	Okopa Creek, Hokianga	This was an original claim, No. 400. Commissioner Richmond, 17th April, 1843, recommended no Grant, claimant not having appeared. Excuse for non-appearance admitted, and notification filed.
John Leef -	Whirinaki Riv., Hokianga	This was an original claim, No. 133. Commissioner Richmond, 17th April, 1843, recommended no Grant, claimant not having brought forward evidence. Claim admitted and notification filed.
John Marmon -	At Rawhia, Hokianga -	This was an original claim No. 158 (d). Commissioner Richmond, 17th April, 1843, recommended no Grant, claimant not having brought forward evidence. The claim was subsequently brought before Commissioner Fitzgerald for investigation: but claimant not producing Native witnesses the Commissioner declined going into the case. Pre-emption Certificate, No. 165, dated 4th February, 1845, issued to claimant for a fresh purchase of the land. Claim admitted and notification filed.
Henry Sturley -	Waikare River - - -	Alleged to have been purchased from the Natives, 4th November, 1837, and was not before former Commissioners. Notified to the Government by claimant on the 13th March, 1856. Notification now filed by claimant.

PROVINCE OF MARLBOROUGH.

I, WILLIAM ADAMS, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand, hereby give notice that at the next sitting of the General Assembly for the Colony of New Zealand, a Petition will be presented on behalf of the said Province of Marlborough, for leave to introduce a Bill to empower the Superintendent of the said Province of Marlborough, to construct and maintain a Railway for the transport of persons, animals, goods, produce, merchandise, parties, matters, and things, leading from the Sea at the Government Reserve at the end of the street called High-street, in the Town of Picton to and across the Wairau River at a place called Goulard's Ferry, passing through

and over certain Reserves and other Waste Lands of the Crown, and through and over certain private lands, and along across under or over certain Public Roads and streets within the said Town of Picton, viz., London-quay, High-street, Dublin-street, Broadway, Auckland-street, Otago-street, Scotland-street, Cambridge Terrace, Oxford-street, South Terrace, Garden Terrace, York-street, Devon-street, Kent-street, Durham-street, Dorset-street, Angle or Cornwall-street, and Wairau Road, and from the Town of Picton passing through and over other certain Private Lands, certain Reserves, and certain Waste Lands of the Crown, and along across under or over the Public Road called the Wairau Road, and other Public Roads to the East side the Wairau River at Goulard's Ferry aforesaid, with power to the said Superintendent on behalf of the said Province of Marlborough, to take and purchase such portions of the private lands aforesaid as may be necessary for the purposes of the said Railway.

And notice is hereby further given that Plans and Books of Reference showing the proposed line of the said Railway and the names and additions of the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of such Private Lands as aforesaid, will within six weeks from this date be deposited at the following places, viz., at the Office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the said Province of Marlborough, at the Office of the Superintendent of the said Province of Marlborough, and at the Office of the Resident Magistrate, Blenheim, in the said Province of Marlborough, and that copies of such Plans and Books of Reference as aforesaid, will within eight weeks from this date be deposited at the Office of the Colonial Secretary for the said Colony, and at the Office of the Clerk of the House of Representatives for the said Colony.
