MILITIA NOTICE.

THE Government having been informed that Rifles issued to Militiamen and Volunteers have been tampered with and altered, by filing the Tumblers to try to make them, what is termed "Hair Triggers," and that the sights have been also filed, thereby destroying their efficiency, all Militiamen and Volunteers are warned that, by so doing, they render themselves liable to the penalty for wilfully

damaging arms entrusted to their care, which will be enforced, also that if, on the examination of arms, after the competition for Government prizes, it is found that the Rifle used by any winner of a prize has been in any way tampered with or altered, the prize to which he would otherwise have been entitled will be withheld.
