**A PROCLAMATION,**

*Prohibiting the Importation of Diseased Cattle, &c., into the Colony of New Zealand.*

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance and exercise of the power and authority for this purpose vested in me by the "Customs Regulation Act, 1858," I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby proclaim and declare that all Cattle and parts of Cattle are from and after the date hereof prohibited from being imported into the Colony, unless and until the person desirous of importing any Cattle or parts of Cattle shall procure and produce to the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port at which the same are to be imported a certificate under the hand of some person to be appointed and authorised in this behalf by the Commissioner of Customs or by a Superintendent for any Port within the Province of which he is Superintendent to the effect that he has examined such Cattle or parts of Cattle and that they are respectively clean and free from the disease called Pleuro Pneumonia

or from any infectious or contagious distemper or disease.

Given under my hand, at the Government House, at Auckland, and issued under the Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this twenty-first day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.

**AUCKLAND MILITIA REGULATIONS.**

**B**Y virtue, and in exercise of the authority in me vested by the "Militia Act, 1858," and "Militia Act Amendment Act, 1860," I Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make and issue the following orders for the Regulation of the Auckland Regiment of Militia.

1. The Auckland Militia District, shall be divided into three divisions the boundaries whereof respectively shall be as follows:

The 1st Division, a line commencing at the point where the Karangahape road crosses the Scoria creek at a stone bridge, thence eastward along the centre of that road to its junction with the Cabbage-tree swamp road; thence along the Cabbage-tree swamp road eastward to its junction with the Mount Eden road; thence southward along the centre of the Mount Eden road to the junction of the scoria quarry road; thence eastward along the centre of the scoria

quarry road to its junction with the Epsom road, thence southward along the centre of the Epsom road to the junction of the Great South road; thence south-eastwards along the centre of the Great South road to the "Harp of Erin" Hotel; thence in a direct line northward to that branch of the Oraki creek which bounds the sheep quarantine ground; thence down the said creek to the sea; thence westward along the high water mark of the Waitemata harbour to the Scoria creek; thence southward along the Scoria creek to the point first above described.

The 2nd Division, a line commencing at the point where the Karangahape road crosses the Scoria creek at a stone bridge, then eastward along the southern boundary of the 1st Division, as above described, to the "Harp of Erin" hotel; thence south-eastward along the centre of the Great South road to Saint Anne's bridge; thence westward along the high water mark of the north side of the Manakau harbour to the point where it would be cut by the circumference of a circle having a radius of 15 miles from the point where the Great South road intersects the western boundary line of "Clendon's" Grant, thence northward along the circumference of such circle until it cuts the high water mark of the Waitemata harbour, thence along the high water mark of the Waitemata harbour to the Scoria creek; thence up the Scoria creek to the point first above described.

The 3rd Division, a line commencing at the "Harp of Erin" Hotel on the Great South road, thence northward along the east boundary of the 1st Division, as before described, to the sea; thence generally eastward along the high water mark of the Waitemata harbour to the point where it would be cut by the circumference of a circle having a radius of 15 miles from the point where the Great South road intersects the Western boundary of "Clendon's Grant," thence southward along the circumference of such circle until it cuts the high water mark of the Manakau harbour to Saint Anne's bridge on the Great South road; thence north-westward along the centre of the Great South road, being part of the boundary of the 2nd Division, to the "Harp of Erin" Hotel the point first above described.

2. The Militiamen resident in each such Division shall constitute a Battalion.

3. Each Battalion shall be divided into three classes. The first class shall consist of all unmarried men, and all widowers without children, between the ages of sixteen years and forty years, both inclusive, who shall be called first class service men. The second class shall consist of all married men and widowers with children between the same ages who shall be called second class service men; and the third class shall be called the reserve men.

4. The men of each class shall be formed by the senior officer of each Battalion, into one or more company or companies, he having regard in such formation to secure as far as

possible contiguity of residence of the men in each company.

#### TARANAKI MILITIA REGULATIONS.

**B**Y virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested by the Militia Act, 1858, and the Militia Act Amendment Act, 1860, I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make and issue the following orders for the regulation of the Taranaki Regiment of Militia:—

1. The Taranaki Militia District shall not be divided, but the Taranaki Regiment shall constitute one Battalion.

2. Such Battalion shall be divided into three classes.

3. The first class shall consist of all unmarried men and all widowers without children between the ages of sixteen years and forty years, both inclusive, who shall be called the first class service men. The second class shall consist of all married men and widowers with children between the same ages, who shall be called second class service men; and the third class shall consist of all men between the ages of forty years and fifty-five years, who shall be called the reserve men.

4. The men of each class shall be formed by the Senior Officer of the Battalion into one or more Company or Companies, he having regard in such formation to secure, as far as possible, contiguity of residence of the men in each Company.

#### WANGANUI MILITIA REGULATIONS.

**B**Y virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested by the Militia Act, 1858, and the Militia Act Amendment Act, 1860, I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make and issue the following orders for the regulation of the Wanganui Regiment of Militia:—

1. The Wanganui Militia District shall not be divided, but the Wanganui Regiment shall constitute one Battalion.

2. Such Battalion shall be divided into three classes.

3. The first class shall consist of all unmarried men, and all widowers without children between the ages of sixteen years and forty years, both inclusive, who shall be called the first class service men. The second class shall consist of all married men and widowers with children between the same ages, who shall be called second class service men, and the third class

shall consist of all men between the ages of forty years and fifty-five years, who shall be called the reserve men.

4. The men of each class shall be formed by the Senior Officer of the Battalion into one or more Company or Companies, he having regard in such formation to secure, as far as possible, contiguity of residence of the men in each Company.

#### WELLINGTON MILITIA REGULATIONS.

**B**Y virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested by the Militia Act, 1858, and the Militia Act Amendment Act, 1860, I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make and issue the following orders for the Regulation of the Wellington Regiment of Militia :—

1. The Wellington Militia District shall be divided into two Divisions, namely the Wellington Division and the Hutt Division.

The Wellington Division shall comprise all parts of the District not contained within the Electoral District of the Hutt, for the election of Members for the House of Representatives.

The boundaries of the Hutt Division shall be those prescribed for the Hutt Electoral District, as described in the schedule to the "Representation Act, 1860."

2. The Militiamen resident in each such Division shall constitute a Battalion.

3. Each Battalion shall be divided into three classes.

4. The first class shall consist of all unmarried men and all widowers without children, between the ages of sixteen years and forty years, both inclusive, who shall be called the first class service men. The second class shall consist of all married men and widowers with children, between the same ages, who shall be called second class service men; and the third class shall consist of all men between the ages of forty years and fifty-five years, who shall be called the reserve men.

5. The men of each class shall be formed by the Senior Officer of each Battalion into one or more Company or Companies, he having regard in such formation to secure, as far as possible, contiguity of residence of the men in each Company.

#### NAPIER MILITIA REGULATIONS.

**B**Y virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested by the Militia Act, 1858, and the Militia Act Amendment Act, 1860, I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make and issue the following orders for the regulation of the Napier Battalion of Militia :—

1. The Napier Militia District shall not be divided, but the Militiamen resident therein shall constitute one Battalion.

2. Such Battalion shall be divided into three classes.

3. The first class shall consist of all unmarried men and all widowers without children between the ages of sixteen years and forty years, both inclusive, who shall be called the first class service men. The second class shall consist of all married men and widowers with children between the same ages, who shall be called second class service men; and the third class shall consist of all men between the ages of forty years and fifty-five years, who shall be called the reserve men.

5. The men of each class shall be formed by the Senior Officer of the Battalion into one or more Company or Companies, he having regard in such formation to secure, as far as possible, contiguity of residence of the men in each Company.

#### NELSON MILITIA REGULATIONS.

**B**Y virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested by the Militia Act, 1858, and the Militia Act Amendment Act, 1860, I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make and issue the following orders for the regulation of the Nelson Regiment of Militia :—

1. The Nelson Militia District shall be divided into two Divisions.

The 1st Division shall comprise the District contained within the following boundaries :

South—The stream at Stoke (suburban South) and a straight line continued in the same direction from its source to the boundary line to the Province of Marlborough.

East—The Province of Marlborough to Mount Duppa (suburban North.)

North—A stream from Mount Duppa falling into Blind Bay.

West—The waters of Blind Bay.

The 2nd Division shall comprise the District contained within the following boundaries :

North—The waters of Blind Bay, the stream at Stoke (suburban South), and a line continued in the same direction from its source to the boundary of the Marlborough Province.

East—A line thence to the head of Quail Valley.

South and West—A line thence to Fox Hill, thence to the junction of the Wangapika with the Motueka River, thence to the head of the Rewaka, and down that river to the sea.

2. The Militiamen resident in each such Division shall constitute a Battalion.

3. Each Battalion shall be divided into three classes.

4. The first class shall consist of all unmarried men and all widowers without children, between the ages of sixteen years and forty years, both

inclusive, who shall be called the first class service men. The second class shall consist of all married men and widowers with children between the same ages, who shall be called second class service men; and the third class shall consist of all men between the ages of forty years and fifty-five years, who shall be called the reserve men.

5. The men of each class shall be formed by the Senior Officer of the Battalion into one or more Company or Companies, he having regard in such formation to secure, as far as possible, contiguity of residence of the men in each Company.

*Rules for Debtors' Prisons, 22nd May, 1861.*

The Judges of the Supreme Court, by virtue of the provisions of the Prisons Ordinance, Session 7, No. 7, sec. 6,

ORDER that on and after the 1st day of July, A. D., 1861, the Debtors confined in any Gaol within the Colony shall, if not otherwise provided for, receive rations upon the most liberal scale allowed by the rules in force in such gaol in the case of convicted criminals;

Provided that no person receiving gaol rations shall be allowed, except upon certificate of the medical officer attending the Gaol, to receive any additional food from without the prison:

Provided, also, that in case of any breach of prison discipline, or any insubordinate, threatening or insulting language or conduct committed or used by any debtor within such gaol, the gaoler may apply to any two Visiting Justices, who may thereupon order that such debtor shall be allowed rations on a lower scale.
