And therefore, We command you and each and every of you that to keep the Peace and all Laws, Ordinances, and Statutes, and all and singular other the Premises you diligently apply yourselves, and that, at certain days and places duly appointed or to be appointed for these purposes, into the Premises to make enquiry, and all and singular the Premises hear and determine and perform and fulfil them, doing therein what to justice appertains, according to the Law and custom of England and of Our said Colony.

And we command all Our Sheriffs in Our said Colony, at certain days and places appointed or to be appointed, to be aiding by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the Premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of Our Colony to be hereunto affixed.

Witness Our Trusty and Well Beloved Thomas Gore Browne, Esquire Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, at Government House, at Auckland, in New Zealand aforesaid, this 2nd day of July, in the twenty-fifth year of Our reign, aud in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.
