**A PROCLAMATION**

*Appointing Circuit Courts to be held at Napier.*

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Supreme Courts Act, 1860," it is provided that there shall be held Circuit Courts for the despatch of Civil and Criminal business of the Court before one of the Judges thereof, at such times and places as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint; And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, Circuit Courts were appointed to be held for the Middle District of the said Colony at the town of Wellington, and at the town of Nelson, on the several days therein respectively mentioned, and it is expedient that Circuit Courts shall be also held for the said District at the town of Napier.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, in pursuance and further exercise of the said power and authority do hereby proclaim and appoint that a Circuit Court shall be held at Napier, in the Middle District of the said Colony, on the eighth day of October next, for the despatch of Civil

and Criminal business of the Court, before the Judge thereof to whom the said District has been assigned. Provided that the hereinbefore recited Proclamation and the appointments thereby made shall not be annulled, varied, or altered by this Proclamation.

**A PROCLAMATION**

*Disallowing Pleuro-Pneumonia Ordinance, Canterbury.*

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by

the Superintendent as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill, and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas the Ordinance hereinafter specified has been enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Ordinance was received by the Governor on the Twentieth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinance should be disallowed:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, viz. :—

“Pleuro-Pneumonia Prevention Ordinance, 1861, Lesson XVI., No. 1.

#### PROCLAMATION.

*Establishing District Courts Wellington, Hutt, Wanganui, Nelson and Marlborough.*

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the “District Courts Act, 1858,” it is enacted that there shall be within the Colony of New Zealand, Courts of Record, possessing Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time as he shall think fit by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette* to constitute throughout the Colony or in any part thereof Districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such Districts to abolish and the boundaries thereof to define or alter,

and also to declare by what local name such Courts shall be designated:

And whereas by certain Proclamations made in pursuance of the said recited power, issued under the public seal of the Colony on the 23rd day of February, the 30th day of June, and the 30th day of June respectively, all in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the District of Nelson, the district of Wanganui, and the district of Wellington, were constituted to be district within which Courts should be held under the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said Districts and to establish other Districts in lieu thereof, and to constitute additional Districts in other parts of the Colony:

Now, therefore I, the Governor, in pursuance and execution of the aforesaid authority do hereby abolish the said Districts and do proclaim and constitute the several Districts of the Colony hereinafter described or referred to to be Districts within which District Courts shall be held under the said Act:

And in further pursuance and exercise of the authority aforesaid, I do hereby declare that the said Courts shall be designated by the names which are hereunder respectively specified, that is to say:

Designation of Court.	Description of District.
The District Court of Wellington.	So much and such part of the Province of Wellington as is comprised within the Electoral Districts of Wellington City and Porirua for the election of Members of the House of Representatives.
The District Court of the Hutt	So much and such part of the Province of Wellington as is comprised within the Electoral Districts, as aforesaid, of the Hutt and Wairarapa.
The District Court of Wanganui.	So much and such part of the Province of Wellington as is comprised within the Districts, as aforesaid, of Rangitikei and Wanganui.
The District Court of Nelson.	The Province of Nelson.
The District Court of Marlborough.	The Province of Marlborough.

## WARRANT.

*Fixing times for holding District Courts at Wellington, Napier, Wanganui, Nelson, Marlborough, and the Hutt.*

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the District Courts Act, 1858, it is provided that there shall be within the Colony Courts of Record possessing Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time by notification in the *New Zealand Gazette* to fix times and places within the District at which every such Court shall be held :

Now, therefore, I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the Colony, do hereby, in pursuance and execution of the said power and authority fix that Sessions of the several District Courts hereinafter mentioned shall be held at the times and places hereunder respectively set forth, or as soon as conveniently may be after each such day respectively, that is to say :

For the District Court of Wellington at the Resident Magistrate's Court at Wellington, on the 3rd Wednesday in every month.

For the District Court of Hawke's Bay, at the Resident Magistrate's Court at Napier, on the 3rd Wednesday in every alternate month, commencing on the 20th day of November next.

For the District Court of Wanganui, at the Resident Magistrate's Court at Wanganui, on the 3rd Wednesday in every alternate month, commencing on the 20th day of November next.

For the District Court of Nelson, at the Resident Magistrate's Court at Nelson, on the 3rd Wednesday in every alternate month, commencing on the 20th day of November next.

For the District Court of Marlborough, at Picton, on the 3rd Wednesday in every alternate month, and at the Resident Magistrate's Court, Blenheim, on the 3rd Wednesday in each intervening month the first session being held at Picton on the 20th day of November next.

For the District Court of the Hutt, at the Lower Hutt and at Grey Town, on the 3rd Tuesday and the 3rd Friday respectively in every alternate month, the first Session being held at the Lower Hutt on the 19th day of November next.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

*Regulations respecting delegation of powers to Superintendents under "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."*

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT AUCKLAND,  
THE SIXTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1861.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Warrants under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the sixth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the Governor did with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegate to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of Auckland, Taranaki, Wellington, Hawke's Bay, Nelson, Canterbury, Otago, and Southland, certain powers conferred on him by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," subject to certain Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, under the recited Act;

Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, by virtue of the authority given to him by the 14th section of the above-recited Act, doth hereby make and ordain the following Regulations:—

1. The Delegation of Powers under the said Warrants shall continue to be in force for the period of one year from this date, subject to be rescinded according to the provisions of the above-recited Act.

2. Each Superintendent shall, immediately after exercising any of the Delegated Powers, notify the same to the Governor, and he shall transmit to the Governor particulars of all Appointments, and copies of all Regulations made by him.

3. He shall, so soon as conveniently can be, notify all Regulations made by him to the Colonial Secretary, or Chief Secretary of each of the Australian Colonies, and cause the same to be published in England in the *Times* newspaper.

4. In the exercise of powers, delegated under the 9th Section of the said Act, the Superintendent of any Province may either in the first instance, or afterwards from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Province except out of any District proclaimed as infected under the said Act any Port or Place within the limits of such District. And every such excepted Port and Place shall be deemed not to be within the proclaimed District; and the Superintendent may also from time to time by Proclamation as aforesaid rescind any Proclamation of an infected District wholly or as to any part thereof, and also the Proclamation of any such exception as aforesaid.

5. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 10th Section of the Act, the Superintendent of any Province may prohibit the importation either by land or by sea of Cattle into such Province from any other

Province or any particular Port or Place in any other Province, or across the borders of a Province or any particular part thereof.

6. In all such last-mentioned cases, such Superintendent shall cause notice as speedily as possible of such prohibition to be given to the Superintendent of the Province from which importation shall be prohibited, and also to the Governor.

7. The Superintendent of any Province may, in his discretion, suspend or forbear to exercise all or any of the powers delegated to him under the said Act.

8. The Superintendent of each Province shall, as soon as can be after the commencement of each sitting of the Provincial Council of such Province, lay before such Council copies and particulars of all appointments, regulations, acts, and proceedings whatever issued, made, or done by him under the delegated powers of the said Act.

9. If the Provincial Council of any Province shall by resolution declare their dissent from all or any of such appointments, regulations, acts, and proceedings, such resolution shall be forthwith transmitted by the Speaker to the Governor for his consideration.

*Warrant Delegating to the Superintendent of Southland the Governor's power to appoint Returning Officers, &c.*

**WHEREAS** by the "Provincial Elections Act, 1858," the Governor is empowered to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province the power of appointing and removing Returning Officers, and also of appointing and establishing Polling Places for the election of Members of the Provincial Council of such Province, Now, therefore, I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the said Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, do hereby delegate to James Alexander Robertson Menzies, Esquire, the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, in the said Colony, the above recited powers, to be held and exercised by him from time to time as he shall think fit, so long as he shall hold the said office of Superintendent.

SIR,—You are already aware that the Queen is desirous of observing the strictest neutrality in the contest which appears to be imminent between the United States and the so-styled Confederate States of North America. I have now to inform you that in order to give full effect to this principle, Her Majesty has been pleased to interdict the armed Ships and also the Privateers of both parties from carrying prizes made by them into the Ports, Harbours, Roadsteads, or Waters of the United Kingdom, or of any of Her Majesty's Colonies or Possessions abroad.

It is Her Majesty's desire that this prohibition should be forthwith notified to all proper authorities within Her Dominions, and I am to desire that you take measures to secure its effectual observance within the limits of your Government.

No. 3, WAIHOPAI COMPANY.

Within a line commencing at the Red Hills, at the intersection of the boundary of the electoral district of Picton with the boundary of the Militia district; thence running eastward along the boundary of the electoral district of Picton, to the north-east corner of the electoral district of the Upper Wairau; thence southward along the eastern boundary of the Upper Wairau district to the dividing ridge between the Wairau and Awatere Valleys; thence westward along the said dividing ridge to the boundary of the Militia district; thence northward along the boundary of the Militia district to the commencing point.

No. 4, AWATERE COMPANY.
