A PROCLAMATION

Altering the time for taking the Census in 1861.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Census Act, 1858," it is provided that the account of the number and condition of the Population of New Zealand, and of the Live Stock, and of the Cultivations therein, respectively which the said Act directs to be taken in every third year succeeding the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, shall be taken in the month of December, and that the forms of Returns for obtaining the required information shall be delivered by the several Sub-Enumerators at the Dwelling Houses in their respective Sub-Districts between the first and the twenty-fourth days of December (both inclusive) in the years appointed, and that the said forms shall be demanded and received by such Sub-Enumerators on the Twenty-sixth day of December, or as soon after as practicable.

And whereas it is further provided by the "Census Act Amendment Act, 1860," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to appoint any other month, or any other day or days for the purposes above cited in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, or in any or every third year after,

instead of the month or the day or days appointed by "The Census Act, 1858," and the time or times so appointed by the Governor in Council shall be declared by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and also that all the provisions of "The Census Act, 1858," relating to taking an account of the Population of New Zealand, and of the Live Stock and of the Cultivations therein, shall, except as therein provided, be deemed and taken to apply to such time or times as fully as if such month, or day or days, had been specified in the said Act.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, proclaim and declare that the forms of Returns above referred to shall be delivered by the several Sub-Enumerators at the Dwelling Houses in their respective Sub-Districts between the twenty-fifth day of November and the fourteenth day of December (both days included), in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and that the said forms shall be demanded and received by such Sub-Enumerators on the sixteenth day of December in the same year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

A PROCLAMATION

For exempting Census Forms from Postage under certain Regulations.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Post Office Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by Proclamation to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix, alter, and abolish the Rates of Postage at any time payable within the Colony, for the transmission of Letters and Newspapers by Post, either between places within New Zealand, or to or from places beyond seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly:

And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the Twenty-ninth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, made in pursuance of the said recited power, certain Rates of Postage have been fixed for the transmission of Letters in manner aforesaid: And it is expedient that Census Forms should be exempt from the operation of the said Proclamation;

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in further pursuance of the said recited power and authority, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that no postage shall be paid or payable for the transmission by Post of Census Forms if the same shall be, and shall bear upon the face or cover of them that they are posted by or addressed to either the Colonial Secretary or the Registrar-General for the time being.

And I do appoint and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the First day of October next, ensuing.

THE following Order in Council is published for general information, and the respective officers of Customs are hereby required to give effect to the same.

READER WOOD.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Wine, Ale, Beer, and Spirits to be issued to Naval and Military Officers free of Customs Duty.

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT AUCKLAND,
THE 27TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1861.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Customs Duties Act Amendment Act, 1861," that it shall be lawful for the Governor by any Order in Council from time to time to declare that any Wine, Ale, Beer, or Spirits may be delivered out of Bond, without payment of Duties of Customs, for the consumption of the Officers of Her Majesty's Troops in the Colony of New Zealand, and the Officers of Her Majesty's Navy serving on board any of Her Majesty's ships in the seas adjoining thereto, subject nevertheless to such Regulations as in any such Order in Council shall be prescribed, and such Wine, Ale, Beer, and Spirits may be delivered out of Bond accordingly;

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth by this Order declare that Wine, Ale, Beer, and Spirits may be delivered out of Bond without payment of duties of Customs, for the consumption of any such Officers as aforesaid, to any Military or Naval Mess, upon the certificate of the President that the articles required are for Mess consumption; also to the General or other Officer Commanding each Station, upon the certificate of a like character from an Officer of his or their staff, and to other Staff Officers upon the presentation of a similar certificate, signed by an Officer appointed by the Officer Commanding the Troops. The certificate in all cases to state that the articles required are for the use of the persons for whom remission of Duty is solicited.

Warrant delegating Governor's Powers under "The Gold Fields Act, 1858," to Superintendent of Province of Nelson.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Act, 1858," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council under his hand and the seal of the Colony from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all

or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections 7, 8, 15, 27 and 40 thereof, subject or not subject to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit.

Now, therefore, I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate absolutely and without restriction unto

JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esq.,

as Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, all the powers vested in me under or by virtue of "The Gold Fields Act, 1858," except the powers contained in sections 7, 8, 15, 27 and 40 of the said Act, to have, hold and exercise within the Province of Nelson, the said powers hereby given, the said John Perry Robinson so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province and no longer.

And whereas it is expedient that the persons hereunder mentioned should be also appointed as Commissioners for the Province of Taranaki in

addition to those already appointed by the said recited Commission. Now Know Ye, that I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the said Colony, have thought fit to appoint, and by these Presents do constitute and appoint the persons hereunder mentioned in addition to those already appointed by the said Commission to be Commissioners in the Province of Taranaki, for the purposes above mentioned, viz:—

Appointing limits of Port of Auckland.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN exercise of the power in me for this purpose vested by the "Customs Regulation Act 1858" I Thomas Gore Browne the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby annul the limits of the Port of Auckland as appointed by an order given under my hand at Auckland, on the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine; and do hereby appoint that from the day of the date hereof the limits of the Port of Auckland shall be and comprise the City of Auckland, with the Waters of the Waitemata River, the Harbour of Auckland, and the Rangitoto Channel, respectively, inside of a line drawn due West from the extremity of Rangitoto reef to the mainland, and of a line drawn due North from West Tamaki Head to the Island of Rangitoto, and to the Eastward of a line drawn due South from Kauri Point in the Waitemata River to the opposite shore.
