A PROCLAMATION

Appointing a Circuit Court to be held at Taranaki.

By His Excellency Sir Grorge Grey, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is provided that "there shall be held Circuit "Courts for the despatch of Civil and "Criminal business of the Court before one "of the Judges thereof, at such places and "times as the Governor in Council may from "time to time appoint,"

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and appoint that a Circuit Court shall be held at New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki, in the Northern District of the said Colony, upon the thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, or so soon after such day as conveniently may be.

A PROCLAMATION

To provide for the Protection of certain Birds lately introduced into the Colony.

> By His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the 9th section of the "Protection of certain Animals Act, 1861," it is provided that the Governor of New Zealand may, by Proclamation, declare that any Animals or Birds other than those specified in the said Act shall be protected and come under the operation of such of the provisions of the said Act as may be specified in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that certain Birds recently imported into this Colony, and the increase arising therefrom, should be pro-

tected for a certain period:

Now, therefore, I, George Grey, in virtue of the provision before recited, do hereby proclaim and declare that all Birds of the species hereinafter named respectively, that is to say, the Bird known as the "Indian Goose," and the Bird known as the "Diver," shall henceforth be protected and come under the operation of the Second, Sixth, Seventh, Eight, Eleventh, Twelfth, and Thirteenth Sections of the said Act.

IS Excellency the Governor doth by this Order in Council revoke the Orders in Council in respect to the appointments of the Native District of Mongonui under the "Native Circuit Courts Act, 1858," and the "Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858," bearing date respectively the 21st of July, 1859, and the 21st of July, 1859.

Appointing District of the Bay of Islands under "Native Circuit Courts Act."

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT AUCKLAND, THO 7TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1861.

Present :-

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. HEREAS by the "Native Circuit Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being Districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished, and any such appointment to vary or revoke:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of His Executive Council, doth hereby appoint and declare that the territory hereafter described or referred to shall be a District for the purpose of the said Act to be called the Native District of the Bay of Islands, that is to say, all the lands north of the following line in which Native Title is extinguished.

Line across the Island from North Head of Wangaruru on East Coast to Mongonui Bluff on West Coast, exclusive of lands over which the Native Title has been extinguished within the meaning of the said "Native Circuit Courts Act, 1858," and this Order shall take effect from the date hereof.

Appointing District of the Bay of Islands under "Native Districts Regulation Act."

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT AUCKLAND, THE 7TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1861.

Present :-

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "Native Districts W Regulation Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being Districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished, and any such appointment to vary or revoke:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Gover nor, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, doth hereby appoint and declare that the territory hereafter described or referred to shall be a District for the purpose of the said Act to be called the Native District of the Bay of Islands, that is to say,—all the lands North of the following line in which Native Title is extinguished.

Line across the Island from North Head of Wangaruru on East Coast to Mongonui Bluff on West Coast, exclusive of lands over which the Native Title has been extinguished within the meaning of the said "Native Districts Regulation Act Act, 1858," and doth declare that this Order shall take effect from the date hereof.

Appointing Upper Waikato District under "Native Circuit Courts Act."

> By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, K. C. B., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c., With the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the Native Circuit Courts Act 1858," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being Districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of His Executive Council, doth hereby order, appoint, and declare that the Territory hereafter described shall be a District (to be called the Upper Waikato District), for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—All Territory lying within a boundary line commencing at the Mission Station at Taupiri, on the River Waikato; thence running up the Eastern bank of the river till it meets the boundary of the land belonging to the Ngatihaua tribe, and thence following the boundary of the land belonging to the Ngatihaua and Ngatiraukawa tribes (crossing the river Thames), till it returns to the Waikato river, thence running restable along the Taurangerkeley range and westerly along the Taurangakohu range and crossing to the summit of Pirongia Mountain (so as to enclose the sources of the Waipa river), thence running northerly along the ranges skirting the Western bank of the Waipa and Waikato Rivers to the commencing point at the Mission Station at Taupiri:

And doth hereby declare that this Order shall take effect from and after the 1st day of January, 1862.

And whereas it is expedient that the District hereinafter described should be appointed a District for the purposes of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, doth hereby order, appoint, and declare that the Territory hereafter described shall be a District for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say :- All Territory lying within a boundary line commencing at the Mission Station at Taupiri on the River Waikato, thence running up the Eastern bank of the said river till it meets the boundary of the land belonging to the Ngatihaua tribe, and thence following the boundary of the land belonging to the Ngatihaua and Ngatiraukawa tribes (crossing the River Thames) till it returns to the Waikato River, thence running westerly along the Taurangakohu ranges and crossing to the summit of Pirongia Mountain (so as to enclose the sources of the Waipa River), thence running northerly along the ranges skirting the Western bank of the Waipa and Waikato Rivers to the commencing point at the Mission Station at Taupiri:

And doth hereby appoint and declare that the said District shall be called the Upper

Waikato District:

And doth declare that this Order shall take effect from and after the 1st day of January, 1862.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Prohibiting Sale or Removal of Spirituous Liquors in Upper Waikato District.

> By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, K. C. B., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c., With the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony.

W HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the 'Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being Districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished: And by the same Act it is further provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make and put in force within any such District Regulations (among other things) for the prevention of drunkenness, and for the sale, removal, and disposal of spirituous and fermented liquors, and for the restriction or prohibition of such sale, removal, and disposal: And by the same Act it is further provided that it shall be lawful by any such Regulation to impose penalties not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach or non-observance of any such Regulation; and that any such Regulation shall be made as far as possible with the general assent of the Native population affected thereby, to be ascertained in such manyer as the Governor may deem fitting: And whereas by Order in Council bearing even date herewith, a District (to be called the Upper Waikato District) hath been appointed for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to make and put in force within such District the following Regulations relating to the sale, removal, and disposal of spirituous and fermented liquors, and the general assent thereto of the Native population affected thereby has been ascertained

to the satisfaction of the Governor:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, doth hereby make and put in force within the said Upper Waikato District, the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. No person shall sell or dispose of spirituous or fermented liquors within the said District; and every person offending against this Regulation shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds.

2. No person shall remove any Spirituous or Fermented Liquors from any place outside the said District into any place within the same, or from any place within the said District to any other place within the same, without a License in that behalf previously had and obtained in manner hereinafter mentioned: and every person offending against this Regulation shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds.

3. It shall be lawful for any Resident

3. It shall be lawful for any Resident Magistrate, with the concurrence of at least one Native Assessor, acting within such District, to grant Licences for the Removal of Spirituous or Fermented Liquors into or within

the said District.

4. All Fines levied by virtue of the preceding Regulations will, pursuant to the Native Circuit Courts Act, 1858, be appropriated and disposed of, from time to time, by the Governor in Council, for the purposes of Government within the said District, or otherwise for the common benefit of the inhabitants thereof.

And His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, do h hereby further declare, that this Order shall take effect from and after the 1st day of January, 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, entitled "The Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858," power was given to the Governor to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and to make and put in force regulations within such Districts in manner and subject to the provisions of the said Act. And by the same Act it was provided that such Regulations should be made as far as possible with the general assent of the Native population affected thereby, to be ascertained in such manner as to the Governor might seem fitting. And whereas by an Order in Council dated the seventh day of December, 1861, the Governor hath appointed a District described in the Schedule hereto, to be a District for the pur poses of the said Act; Now His Excellency the Governor doth hereby appoint George Clarke, senr., of Waimate, near the Bay of Islands, Esquire, to be a Commissioner for the said District to be termed "The Civil Commissioner" for the District of the Bay of Islands, for the purpose of ascertaining such assent of the Native population as aforesaid, and for such other purposes as shall be hereafter prescribed by law, to act in all things subject to such Instructions and Regulations as shall be from time to time given in that behalf by the Governor.
