WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the "Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being Districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, doth hereby order, appoint, and declare that the Territory hereafter described shall be a District for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—All Territory lying within a boundary line commencing at the head of Waiuku Creek, thence proceeding to the Awaroa River, by the Public Road from Waiuku to the Awaroa River, thence by the Awaroa River to the Waikato River, thence by the North bank of the Waikato River to its mouth, and thence by the Coast Line to the commencing point: Excepting all land over which the Native Title has been extinguished:

WHEREAS by the "Native Circuit Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being Districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished, and any such appointment to vary or revoke :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of His Executive Council, doth hereby appoint and declare that the territory hereafter described or referred to shall be a District for the purposes of the said Act, to be called the Native District of the Bay of Islands, that is to say, all the lands north of the following line in which Native Title is not extinguished.

Line across the Island from North Head of Wangaruru on the East Coast to Mangonui Bluff on the West Coast, exclusive of lands over which the Native Title has been extinguished within the meaning of the said "Native Circuit Courts Act, 1858," And this Order shall take effect from the date hereof.

THE following Regulations for the Examination of Candidates for the Civil Service of India, are published for general information.

EXAMINATION FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

REGULATIONS.

1. In June or July, 1862, an Examination of Candidates will be held in London. Not less than eighty candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal, for that of Madras, and for that of Bombay.*—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such Examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st of May, 1862, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st May, 1862, will be above eighteen years and under twenty-two years ;

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of India ;

(c) Satisfactory proof of good moral character ;

(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge herein-after enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge : †

* The number of appointments to be made in each Presidency will be announced hereafter.

† It should be understood that candidates are at liberty to name at their pleasure any or all of these branches of knowledge (subject only to the restriction above mentioned as to Natural Science), and that no subjects are obligatory.

(2.) Electricity and Magnetism, (3.) Natural History, (4.) Geology, and (5.) Mineralogy - - - - - 500

** No candidate will be allowed to be examined in more than three of the branches of knowledge included under this head, and the total (500 marks) may be obtained by adequate proficiency in any three.

Moral Sciences ; that is, Logic, Mental and Moral Philosophy - - - - - 500
Sanskrit Language and Literature - - - 500
Arabic Language and Literature - - - 500

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of Examination, unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

7. The Examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* Examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the eighty candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India. They shall be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency to which they shall be appointed.

9. In June or July, 1863, a further Examination of the selected candidates will take place in the following subjects :—

In this, as in the preceding examination, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of Marks that can be obtained in respect to it. The Examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* Examination, as may be deemed necessary.

10. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India until he shall have passed the Further Examination, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

11. The selected candidates who at the Further Examination shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, shall be adjudged to have passed, and be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India.

12. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the Further Examination.

13. No person will, even after passing the Further Examination, be allowed to proceed to India unless he shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for the Civil Service in India, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character.—The Civil Service Commissioners will require such further evidence on these points as they may deem necessary before granting their Certificate of Qualification.

14. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.

NOTE.—(1.) All persons appointed to the Civil Service will be required to attend at the India Office, to make the necessary arrangements for entering into covenant, and for giving a bond for £1,000. jointly with two sureties, for the due fulfilment

of the same. The stamps payable by civilians on their appointment amount to £4 5s.

(2.) The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorized the Civil Service Commissioners to state that, with a view of meeting the expenses to be incurred by selected candidates during the interval which must elapse before they can proceed to India, it is his intention to allow the sum of £100 to each selected candidate who shall have passed the Further Examination in 1863, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

(3.) Candidates are at liberty to send in their names and evidence of age as soon as they think fit to do so; but evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than 1st March, 1862.
