## POSTAL.

### A PROCLAMATION

*For exempting from Postage Letters and Packets on the Public Service of the Colony under certain Regulations.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Post Office Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by Proclamation to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix, alter, and abolish the rates of Postage at any time, payable within the Colony for the transmission of Letters and Newspapers by Post either between places within New Zealand, or to and from places beyond Seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly. And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of December, one-thousand eight-hundred and sixty, made in pursuance of the said recited power, certain rates of postage have been fixed for the transmission of Letters in manner aforesaid: And it is expedient that

all Letters and Packets on the Public Service of the Colony should be exempt from the operation of the said Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor, in further pursuance of the said recited power and authority, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, Do hereby Proclaim and Declare that no Postage shall be paid or payable for transmission by Post of Letters or Packets which shall be solely on the Public Service of the Colony of New Zealand shall be franked by the Governor or by any one of such officers of the Government of the Colony as shall from time to time be authorized by the Governor to frank Official Letters and Packets: Provided that there be endorsed on any such Letter or Packet the words, "On Public Service only," and that the signature of the Governor or such officer as aforesaid franking the same be subscribed thereto:

And I Do Appoint and Declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of April next, ensuing.

*For requiring the Pre-payment of Letters and Packets posted for transmission within the Colony.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Post Office Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by Proclamation to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix, alter, and abolish the rates of Postage at any time, payable within the Colony for the transmission of Letters and Newspapers by Post either between places within New Zealand, or to and from places beyond Seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the Postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly. And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand eight-hundred and sixty, made in pursuance of the said recited power, certain rates of Postage have been fixed for the transmission of Letters in manner aforesaid :

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in further pursuance of the said power and authority, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, Do hereby Proclaim and Declare that the Postage payable on all Letters and Packets posted in any part of New Zealand for any other part of New Zealand shall be paid before the same shall be transmitted by Post :

And I Do Appoint and Declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of April next ensuing.

## A PROCLAMATION

*For the Naturalization of Jan Willem Van Beek, alias John Smidt.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Ma-

jesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Naturalization Act, 1861," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been from such specified time, a Natural-born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the person hereinafter mentioned, shall come within the operation of the said Act from the date hereinafter specified, viz. :—

JAN WILLEM VAN BEEK, *alias* JOHN SMIDT,

from the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, Native of Holland, Mariner; residence, Lyttelton, in the Province of Canterbury.

## A PROCLAMATION

*Disallowing certain Ordinances of the Province of Otago.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent as in the said Act provided the Superin-

tendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation or any subsequent day to be named therein:

And whereas the Ordinances hereinafter specified have been enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Ordinances were received by the Governor on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinances should be disallowed:

Now therefore I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Ordinances passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, such disallowance to take effect on and from the 1st day of March next, viz. :—

“The Port Chalmers’ Municipal Estate Ordinance, 1861”

“Water Police Ordinance, 1861”

“The Criminals Ordinance, 1861.”

in the Province of Southland, to be all the territory comprised within the limits of the Province of Southland, exclusive of the buildings used as the Provincial Gaol, the Lunatic Asylum, and the Provincial Hospital and their respective precincts.

**T**HE attention of Postmasters throughout the Colony is called to the following despatches from the Secretary to the General Post Office of the United Kingdom.

SIR,—It has been brought to the notice of the Postmaster-General that a practice prevails to some extent, in the Colonies, of forwarding to England in Book Packets, and prepaid at the Book Rate of Postage, Photographs in cases containing glass.

As the regulations, however, of the Book Post do not allow of glass being enclosed in Book Packets, I am directed by the Postmaster General to call your attention to this irregularity, in order that you may take steps for preventing its recurrence.

I am, at the same time, to point out that Photographs in glass cases can only be sent through the Post, even as Letters, and at Letter Rates of Postage, when packed so securely that no damage can be done to the

correspondence in the Mails, or to the Officers of the Department.

SIR,—I am directed by the Postmaster General to acquaint you that the British postage of letters forwarded by Packet between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Venezuela has been reduced.

Upon letters, therefore, forwarded from New Zealand through the United Kingdom to Venezuela, the reduced rate of 5d. only for a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, and so on, according to the usual scale, must in future be accounted for to this office.
