A PROCLAMATION

For the Dissolution of the Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, cap. 72, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," the several Provinces of Auckland, New Plymouth, Wellington, Nelson, Canterbury, and Otago, are thereby established, and it is enacted that for each of the said Provinces there shall be a Superintendent and Provincial Council;

And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that every Provincial Council shall continue for the period of Four Years from the day of return of the Writs for choosing the same, and no longer: Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New Zealand, by Proclamation or otherwise, to dissolve the same whenever he shall think it expedient so to do;

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do by this Proclamation dissolve the Provincial Council of the said Province of Canterbury accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of Joseph Fuchs.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Naturalization Act, 1861," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been from such specified time, a Natural-born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and

authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the person hereinafter mentioned, shall come within the operation of the said Act from the date hereinafter specified, viz:—

JOSEPH FUCHS,

from the third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, Native of Prussia, Cabinet Maker; residence, Christchurch, in the Province of Canterbury.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Increasing Rates of Pilotage at Otago.

G. GREY,

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT AUCKLAND, THE SEVENTH DAY OF MARCH, 1862.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Harbour Regulations Ordinance, No. 15, of Session II., of the Legislative Council of New Zealand, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make all such regulations respecting Pilots and Pilotage, Quarantine and Harbours, as in the said Ordinance provided: And whereas by an Order in Council, made in pursuance of the said power on the twenty-first day of February, 1861, certain regulations were made, and certain rates of Pilotage fixed, for the Ports and Harbours of the Province of Otago: And whereas it is expedient to increase such rates of Pilotage within the Harbour of Otago, but not in any other Ports or Harbours of the said Province: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby, in further pursuance and exercise of the said recited power and authority, order that the rates of Pilotage for the said Harbour of Otago shall be as follows:—

In lieu and instead of the rates fixed by the said Order in Council of the 21st day of February, 1861, the sum of One Shilling per Ton (that is sixpence per Ton on entering and a like sum on leaving Harbour,) shall be paid as Pilotage in respect of every ship or vessel (not exempt from Pilotage according to the said regulations) coming into or going out of the said Harbour, together with the further sum of Ten Shillings per mile for every mile beyond one league from the Pilot Station, and

the further sum of Twenty-one Shillings upon each occasion that a vessel is shifted from one part of the said Harbour to another.

All ships and vessels exempt according to the said regulations, shall pay one full Pilotage at the above rates inwards and outwards every six months.

Provided that this Order shall not alter or affect the rates of Pilotage fixed by the said Order in Council of the 21st day of February, 1861, in respect of any other Harbours in the said Province except the Harbour of Otago.

And His Excellency with such advice and consent as aforesaid, doth order that this Order shall take effect on and from the first day of April next.

ORDER IN COUNCIL,

For ascertaining assent of Natives to Regulations under "Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858."

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT AUCKLAND ON FRIDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF MARCH, 1862.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the "Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being Districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished:

And by the same Act it is further provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make and put in force within any such District, Regulations for various purposes in the said Act described: And that all such Regulations shall be made as far as possible with the general assent of the Native population affected thereby, to be ascertained in such manner as the Governor may deem fitting:

And whereas in order to ascertain such assent it is expedient to provide in the first instance for the orderly and deliberate framing of such Regulations by the Natives themselves, whenever practicable, through the Native Institution of the Runanga, and that specific powers in that behalf should be conferred upon the Runanga accordingly:

And whereas it may be expedient that Regulations to be so put in force within any such District should be either General Regulations applicable to the whole District, or Local Regulations applicable only to a portion of such District, as the case may be:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers so vested in him as aforesaid, doth hereby order, appoint, and declare that the assent of the Native population to any such

Regulations to be put in force within any District as aforesaid shall be ascertained in manner following, that is to say:

1. If the Governor shall think fit at any time by Order in Council to constitute within any District or group of Districts or part of a District appointed under the said Act, a Native Runanga for the purpose of ascertaining such assent as aforesaid, such Runanga shall be termed the "District Runanga of _____," or the "Village Runanga of _____," as the case may be: and every such Runanga shall continue during the Governor's pleasure.

2. Every District or Village Runanga shall consist in the first instance of such Native Chiefs as may be appointed by the Governor to be members thereof, and of such other members as may be afterwards added by election or otherwise in pursuance of any General or Local Regulation in that behalf: and any member may resign or be removed by the Governor.

3. Every Regulation proposed by any District or Village Runanga to be put in force within any such District, whether the same shall be a General Regulation for the whole District, or a Local Regulation for any part thereof, shall be considered at a meeting of the District or Village Runanga to be specially held for the purpose: and the final adoption thereof at such meeting by a majority of such Runanga, shall be held to be the ascertainment of the general assent thereto of the Native population to be affected thereby, within the meaning of the said Act: Provided that if on the presentation to the Governor of any such Regulations he shall think fit to return the same to the Runanga with any amendments therein, the Runanga shall consider such amendments in like manner as aforesaid, and the final adoption in manner aforesaid of the Regulations as so amended shall be held to be the ascertainment of the general assent thereto as aforesaid.

4. Whenever the Governor shall not have constituted any District or Village Runanga within any District appointed under the said Act, the assent of the Native population to any Regulations to be put in force therein shall be ascertained by the Civil Commissioner of the District (if any), or by such other Officer, assisted by not less than two Native Assessors, as may be designated by the Governor in that behalf.

And His Excellency, with the advice and consent aforesaid, doth declare that this Order shall take effect from and after the thirty-first day of March, 1862.

PROCLAMATION.

PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Queensland and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to Prevent the Introduction of Diseased Cattle into the Colony of Queensland and to Check the Progress of Malignant Diseases in Cattle," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to prohibit or put restrictions on the introduction or importation of Horned Cattle into the Colony of Queensland, or into any District thereof, from such places, and during such time, as may appear necessary, and any such Proclamation to alter or revoke by a similar Proclamation. And whereas the disease known or described as Pleuro-Pneumonia has appeared amongst Horned Cattle in certain parts of the neighboring Colony of New South Wales, and it is necessary to take measures to prevent the introduction into this Colony of the said disease: Now, therefore, I Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, prohibit the introduction or importation into this Colony of any Horned Cattle whatsoever, unless the person or persons in charge of the same shall have first obtained from the Commissioner for Diseases in Cattle, or one of the Inspectors appointed under the provisions of the above recited Act, a Certificate to the effect that the Cattle in his or their charge are not affected with the disease known or described as Pleuro-Pneumonia. And I do hereby also notify and proclaim that all Horned Cattle which may be introduced or imported into the said Colony from any District of any of the Australian Colonies which shall be known to be, or to have been, infected with the said disease, shall be liable to be seized, and may be forfeited, although such Cattle may not be infected with the said disease, and the Commissioner or any Inspector may at his discretion refuse to give such Certificate in respect of any Cattle coming from any infected district, although the same may not be infected with the said disease. And I do hereby notify and proclaim that, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, Inspectors will be stationed at the following townships, namely, Warwick, Goondiwindi, and at or near the junction of the Mooni and Macintyre Rivers; and all persons travelling to this Colony with, or in charge of, Horned Cattle are hereby directed to give timely notice thereof to the said Commissioner,

or to some one of such Inspectors And I do hereby further notify and proclaim that the persons at present severally holding the office of Scab Inspector at the ports of Brisbane, Maryborough, Gladstone, and Rockhampton, shall be the persons to whom notice shall be given, and of and from whom the necessary Certificate that all Horned Cattle arriving at the said ports are not affected as aforesaid shall be obtained. And I do further notify and proclaim that, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, all Horned Cattle imported or introduced into this Colony without such Certificate, contrary to this Proclamation, may be seized, and will thereupon be forfeited, and may be sold as provided by the said Act; and every person concerned in importing or introducing, or in attempting to import or introduce, any Horned Cattle into this Colony, in violation of this Proclamation, will, for every such offence, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty Pounds, and not less than Ten Pounds, to be recovered as in the said Act is provided.
