We have taken every opportunity of trying the coal sent us and find it to be of a very superior quality, and a good coal for getting steam. It gives a great heat where there is a proper draft, burns quick and gives a clear and full fire with little smoke. It leaves clean firebars, is free from clinkers and does not require much stirring, burning to a white ash, for engine fires we would recommend it to consumers, mixing it with a little firewood we find answers well. It is a good smiths' coal; giving a first rate weld and our smiths prefer it to New South Wales Coals. The sample sent us was small coals.
