## ORDER IN COUNCIL

*Prohibiting importation of diseased Cattle into Stewart's Island, Ruapuke, &c.*

At the Government House at Wellington the 16th day of July, 1862.

PRESENT.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

**W**HEREFAS by the "Diseased Cattle Act 1861" it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to make such Regulations as to him shall seem fit for prohibiting the importation of Cattle into the Colony from Districts infected with disease within the meaning of the said Act,

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, Doth hereby order that from and after the date of this Order the several Colonies of Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, and the Cape of Good Hope, so far as relates to the importation of Diseased Cattle into the Southern or Stewart's Island and the Island of Ruapuke and other Islands in, near to, and to the South of Foveaux Straits, be deemed to be infected Districts within the meaning of the said Act, and the Governor with such advice and consent as aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say,

No Cattle after the date hereof until further notice shall be imported from any such Districts into the said Stewart's Island, Ruapuke and the other Islands in, near to, and to the South of Foveaux Straits under a Penalty for each offence not exceeding five hundred Pounds (£500).

**A**DDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS to Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of Our Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Our Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Our Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies. Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twenty eighth day of March 1862, in the twenty fifth Year of Our Reign.

**W**HEREAS We did by Our Commission under the Great Seal of Our United

Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland bearing date at Westminster the twelfth day of August one thousand eight hundred and sixty one in this twenty fifth year of Our Reign constitute and appoint you to be Our Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Our Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies during Our Will and Pleasure, and did thereby authorize and empower you to do and execute all things in the manner that should belong to your said Command, and to the trust We have reposed in you according to and in pursuance of an Act made and passed in the Session holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth year of Our Reign intitled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand" and according to the several powers and directions granted or appointed unto by Our said Commission and the Instructions and Authorities therewith given you, or by such further Powers Instructions and Authorities as should at any time thereafter be granted or appointed you under Our Sign Manual and Signet or by Our Order in Our Privy Council or by Us, through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such reasonable Laws as were then in force in Our said Colony, or should thereafter be made by the General Assembly of Our said Colony.

AND WHEREAS it did in pursuance of the said recited Act and in the exercise of the power thereby vested in Us, by Our Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet accompanying Our said Commission and bearing even date therewith, authorize you in Our Name to summon from time to time to the said Legislative Council such person or persons as you should deem to be prudent and discreet Men either in addition to the then existing Members of the said Council, or for supplying any vacancies which might take place therein by death or otherwise, but so that the whole number of the Council should not at any time exceed Twenty.

Now know you that We have revoked and determined that part of Our aforesaid recited Instructions but no more by which We have limited to Twenty the number of persons who may be summoned by you to the said Legislative Council and the same is hereby revoked and determined accordingly And further know you that We do by these Our Additional Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet authorize and empower you in Our Name from time to time to summon to the said Legislative Council as you shall think fit, either for supplying vacancies or otherwise such additional number of prudent and discreet persons as you may think expedient.
