A PROCLAMATION

Dissolving the Provincial Council of the Province of Hawke's Bay.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 1st day of November, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the Province of Hawke's Bay was constituted and established under the "New Provinces Act, 1858," and it is provided by the Constitution Act that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New Zealand, by Proclamation or otherwise, to dissolve the Provincial Council of any Province, whenever he shall think it expedient to do so:

Now therefore, I the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the said power, do by this Proclamation dissolve the Provincial Council of the said Province of Hawke's Bay.

Given under my hand at the Government House, at Auckland, and issued under the Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of certain persons.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Naturalization Act, 1862," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor shall as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly to be and to have been from such specified time a natural born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes, as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the dates hereinafter specified, viz. :—

SAMSON DOUCET,

From the seventeenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, Native

of Normandy, Shepherd, residence Napier, in the Province of Hawke's Bay.

HENRY LEPIEN,

From the nineteenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, Native of Germany, Shoemaker, residence Wellington, in the Province of Wellington.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Authorising additional Postal Regulation.

At the Government House, at Auckland, the first day of December, 1862.

Present :—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make Rules and Regulations for the managing of the several Post Offices of the said Colony; for the receiving, depatching, conveying and delivering of Letters (including the imposition of Fees for Private Boxes and deliveries); for the detaining, opening and return, or other disposal of irregularly posted, unclaimed, and refused letters, or such as from any cause whatsoever cannot be delivered or forwarded, and the contents thereof respectively, and for the publication of the Lists of the same; for the making, custody, and sale of Postage Labels; for the receiving and paying of money in connection with the said Postal Service; and for the conduct of Post Officers; and any such Rules and Regulations at any time in force to alter, vary, or revoke: and, for the purpose of giving effect to the Rules and Regulations so to be made, further power is given to the Governor in Council by the said Act to impose any penalty not exceeding ten pounds for any one offence against such Rules and Regulations.

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby make the following additional Post Office Regulation; and doth declare that the same shall be in force from and after the first day of January 1863, and that in addition and without prejudice to the Regulations published in the Government Gazette, No. 9, dated the 6th February, 1862.

Regulation No. 82.

Newspapers for transmission within the Colony or for Overland Mails shall be posted in single numbers, so put up that the date of

publication may be readily seen. Packages of Newspapers consisting of more than one number, shall be treated as Book Packets.

THE following correspondence respecting an important error in the signals at the Flagstaff, Otago Heads (*New Zealand Gazette* of the 4th ultimo, No. 37, page 312), is published for general information.

SIR,—In returning the enclosed regulations for the ports and harbors of Otago, I have the honor to direct your attention to an error which appears in the Signals at the Flagstaff, Otago Heads, by which the bar is made fit to take, whereas it should be "NOT fit to take."

This error, which is one of some magnitude, was unfortunately repeated in the *Provincial Government Gazette* of the 5th instant before it was discovered. I have however caused hand bills to be printed, pointing out the mistake, and have caused them to be forwarded to all the Custom Houses in the different Provinces of New Zealand, as well as the Australian Colonies, and I therefore trust no serious accident may result.

SIR,—I have to acknowledge the receipt of Your Honor's letter No. 688 of the 18th ulto.,

returning the Otago Harbour Regulations forwarded in the letter from this office dated the 28th October last, and drawing attention to an error which appears in the "Signals at the Flagstaff, Otago Heads," by which the Bar is made "fit to take," whereas it should be "NOT fit to take."

In reply, I have to point out to your honor that the mistake to which you refer occurred in the Draft Regulations forwarded in Your Honor's letter of the 22nd July last, requesting they might be proclaimed by His Excellency, and that they bore on the face a note that they had been revised by the Provincial Authorities.

In order to obviate as much as possible the spread of this error (in my opinion a very culpable one), I have, in addition to the steps already taken by Your Honor, directed the publication of this correspondence and of the "Notice to Mariners," transmitted by you in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

IN the Harbour Regulations, published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 214, dated 5th November, 1862, page 180, eighth line, second column from the top, for "Blue with a White St. Andrew's Cross, Ebb Tide and Bar fit to take," read "Bar NOT fit to take." (It is probable that the same error may have appeared in the New Zealand General Government Gazette.)

The following are the correct Signals at the Flagstaff Otago Heads.

Blue Peter: Keep to sea, the Bar is not fit to take.

Red Flag: Take the Bar, there is no danger.

Blue, with a White St. Andrew's Cross: Ebb tide, and Bar not fit to take.

White Flag: First quarter Flood.

The following Signals are in use at the Port.

Pilot: The Union Jack at the fore.

Customs Boat: The Union Jack at the Peak.

Gunpowder on Board: The Union Jack at the main,

Medical Assistance: The Union Jack over the Ensign at the peak.

Government Emigrants on Board: Ensign at the mizen mast head.

Mails on Board: White flag at the fore.

Boarding Officer: Blue flag at the main.

Clearing Officer: White flag at the main.

Police: The Ensign at the main.

Do. at night: Two lights vertical at the peak, having five feet between the two.
