A PROCLAMATION

Dissolving the Provincial Council of the Province of Marlborough.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the fourth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Province of Marlborough was constituted and established under the "New Provinces Act, 1858," and it is provided by the Constitution Act that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New Zealand, by Proclamation or otherwise, to dissolve the Provincial Council of any Province, whenever he shall think it expedient to do so:

Now therefore, I the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the said power, do by this Proclamation dissolve the Provincial Council of the said Province of Marlborough.

Given under my hand at the Government House at Auckland, and issued under the Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this twentieth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of certain persons.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Naturalization Act, 1862," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor shall as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly to be and to have been from such specified time a natural born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes, as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the dates hereinafter specified, viz. :—

HENDRIK BEUKERS,

From the ninth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, Native of

Holland, Sail-maker, residence Napier, in the Province of Hawke's Bay.

JOHN PIETERSON,
From the twentieth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, Native of Germany, Mariner, residence Port Chalmers, in the Province of Otago.

CHRISTIAN JULIUS FOXWARD,
From the seventeenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, Native of Denmark, Surveyor, residence Dunedin, in the Province of Otago.

JOHN HENRY EDWARDS,
From the eighth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, Native of the United States of America, Master Mariner, residence Kororaraka, in the Province of Auckland.

SAMUEL EDWARD SHRIMSKI,
From January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, Native of Prussia, Storekeeper, residence Oamaru, in the Province of Otago.

A PROCLAMATION

Extending Jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrates' Courts at Wellington, Wanganui, and Nelson.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Resident Magistrates' Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1862," it is enacted that every case of a claim for debt or damages such as might at the passing of the said Act be lawfully tried in a Resident Magistrate's Court, where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Twenty Pounds, may be tried in any Resident Magistrate's Court, with respect to which this Act shall be in operation, when the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Fifty Pounds:

And it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Colony declare that the limit of jurisdiction of any such Court shall be extended to One Hundred Pounds, and such limit of jurisdiction shall be in such case extended accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited Act and of an Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1862, autho-

rising the issue of Proclamations under the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said recited Act and especially the powers conferred by sections two and three thereof, shall be exercised to the limit of Jurisdiction of One Hundred Pounds in the Resident Magistrates' Courts at Wellington, Wanganui, and Nelson; and I do further proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

THE following Act received from the Government of New South Wales is published for general information.

ALFRED DOMETT.

No. IV.

AN ACT to regulate for a limited time the Exportation of Gunpowder and Warlike Stores from the Colony of New South Wales. [Assented to, 13th October, 1862.]

WHEREAS the duration of the "Gunpowder Export Restriction Act of 1861" was limited to a period of two years from the date of the passing thereof And whereas it is expedient again to regulate for a limited time the Exportation of Gunpowder and Warlike Stores from the Colony of New South Wales Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. During the continuance of this Act no vessel having Gunpowder or Warlike Stores on board in greater quantity than may in the opinion of the Collector or Chief Officer of Customs at the port of clearance be required for the ordinary use and service of such vessel or of any passenger proceeding thereby shall be cleared at any port in the said Colony without a license under the hand of the Governor or of the Colonial Treasurer And any Gunpowder or Warlike Stores shipped contrary to this Act shall be forfeited.

2. Before any Gunpowder or Warlike Stores shall be shipped under any such license as aforesaid the shipper thereof shall be required to state in writing the name of the place at which it is intended they shall be landed and to give security by bond for five hundred pounds or treble the amount of the value of the Gunpowder or Warlike Stores so shipped if it

shall exceed that amount with two sufficient sureties being resident householders to the satisfaction of the Collector or Chief Officer of Customs at the port of clearance that such Gunpowder or Warlike Stores as the case may be shall be landed at the place for which they are declared to be shipped the proof of which shall lie upon the shipper thereof by the production of the certificate of the Collector or other Chief Officer of Customs or Consul or other public officer at the place where landed or such other proof as shall satisfy the Collector or other Chief Officer of Customs at the place of shipment within a reasonable time to be mentioned in such bond and in failure thereof the shipper shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds to be recovered at the suit of such Collector or Chief Officer of Customs or of Her Majesty's Attorney General in the Supreme Court of New South Wales and that in default of payment of such penalty by the said shipper it shall be lawful for the said Collector or Chief Officer or Attorney General to put the said bond in suit in the said Court and to recover such amount or value as the case may be by information or otherwise.

3. All sums recovered in virtue of this Act shall go and be paid to the Colonial Treasurer for the purpose of the Consolidated Revenue of the said Colony.

4. This Act shall come into effect from the passing thereof and shall continue in force for two years thereafter and shall be styled and may be cited as the "Gunpowder Export Restriction Act of 1862."

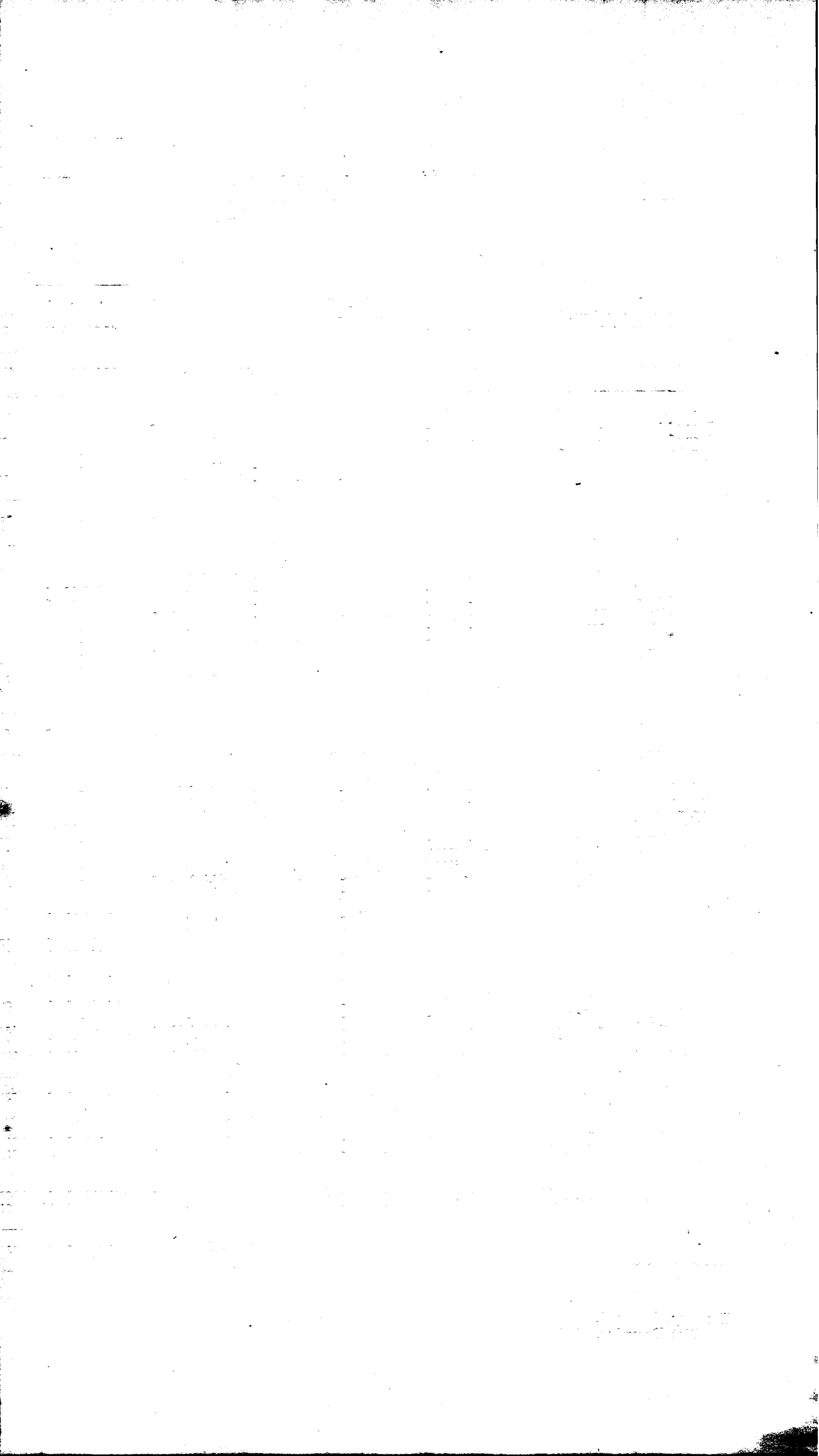

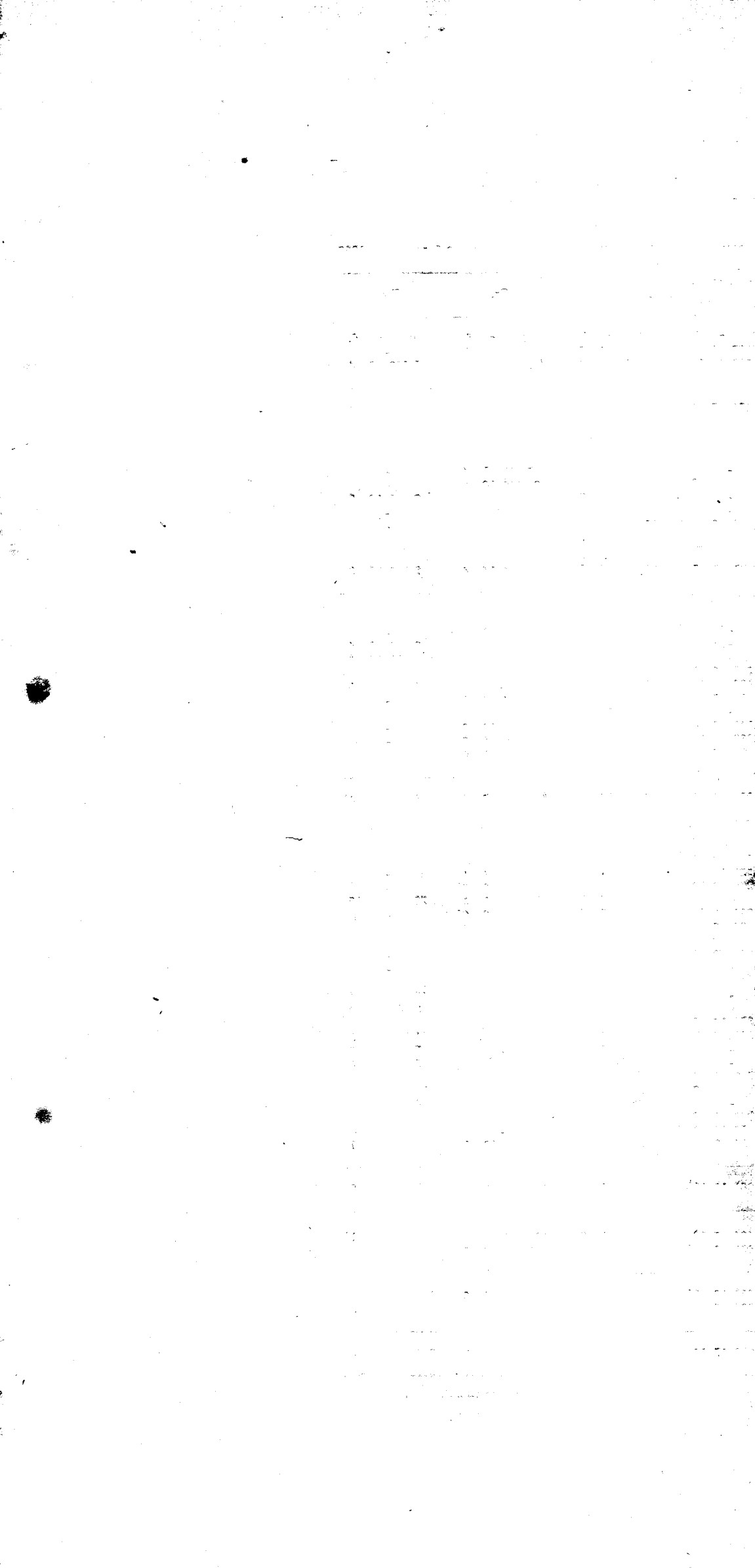
