A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of certain persons.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by the "Naturalization Act, 1862," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor shall as from the time in such Pro-clamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly to be and to have been from such specified time a natural born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes, as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the dates hereinafter specified, viz. :-

eight hundred and sixty-three, Native of the Western Islands near Portugal, settler, residence Matakana, in the Province of Auckland.

Now know ye, that I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby appoint the following places to be Polling Places for the Electoral Districts hereinafter specified, as constituted by the "Representation Act, 1862," for the Election of Members of the House of Representatives, namely,—

For the District of Dunedin and Suburbs North,

The Court House, Dunedin.

For the District of Dunedin and Suburbs South,

The Court House, Dunedin.

And I do further appoint the Polling Place hereinafter specified to be the principal Polling Place for such Districts namely,—

The Court House, Dunedin.




