Colonial Secretary's Office, Auckland, 12th March, 1863. THE following despatch from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies is published for general insormation.

READER WOOD,

In the absence of Mr. DOMETT.

Downing-street, 18th December, 1862.

Sir,—A difficulty has been experienced in a recent case in apprehending in this country an offender who had absconded from one of Her Majesty's Colonies, taking with him public moneys. That difficulty arose from the omission to transmit to this country the document necessary to legalize his arrest in this country. I therefore thought it right to obtain from the serve as a guide to Colonial Governments in future cases, showing the nature of the documents which should be sent to England, and the course which should be pursued in order to secure the commital here of any persons who might have fled to this country from a British Colony in order to escape from justice.

The Imperial Acts which bear upon this subject, appear to be the Acts, 6 and 7 Victoria, cap. 34, and the 16th and 17th Victoria, cap. 118, copies of which are enclosed, and from which it will be collected that under these Acts the following steps are proper and necessary to be observed.

I. A Warrant must have been issued against the offender by some person having lawful authority to issue it in that part of Her Majesty's dominions where the offence was committed.

2. This Warrant must be sent to England to be endorsed by the Secretary of State.

3. But the Secretary of State cannot endorse it until it is proved by Oath, or Affidavit, that the seal, or signature is the seal or signature of the person having lawful authority to issue such Warrant (whose seal or signature the same purports to be).

It is necessary, therefore, to send witnesses, or affidavits, or both, sufficient for such proof.

4. The Warrant must have been issued upon depositions; and these depositions must be such as appear sufficient to warrant the commital of the offender for trial.

5. Sufficient evidence must be forthcoming in England before the Magistrate, to prove the criminality of the offender to an extent such as, if the offence had been committed in Eug-Treasury Solicitors a statement which might land, would have justified the Magistrate in committing the offender for trial in this country. But besides oral witnesses the Act 6 and 7 Victoria, cap. 34, enables the Magistrates to receive, in evidence, copies of the depositions upon which the original Warrant issued, provided that they are certified under the hand of the person or persons who issued the Warrant, and are attested upon the Oath of the party producing them to be true copies of the original depositions.

> If it is intended therefore to offer the depositions in evidence, instead of, or in addition to, oral testimony, they must be authenticated as above mentioned.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Temporary Lighthouse on Point Lonsdale.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Auckland, 10th March, 1863.

THE following Notice to Mariners respecting a Temporary Lighthouse on Point Lonsdale, Port Phillip, is published for general information.

READER WOOD, In the absence of Mr. Domett.

Masters of vessels and others navigating the entrance of Port Phillip are hereby informed that in order to warn vessels of their approach to the recently discovered dangers (notice of which appeared in the Gazette of the 22nd of December, 1862, No. 148) and the Point Lonsdale Rock, at the entrance to Port Philip, a temporary fixed harbor light will, on and after the evening of the 19th instant, be exhibited from a site close to the tidal flagstaff on Point Lonsdale.

This light will be colored green to seaward, and red towards the harbor and Point Nepean.

Vessels inward or outward bound, when they have the green light full in view, will be outside of these dangers, and when they have the red light full in view, they will be inside of these dangers. The blending of the two colors when seen from a vessel will indicate that she is in the vicinity of these dangers.

The Point Lonsdale Light will only illumi-

nate an arc of about fifty degrees of the horizon, and be visible, the green light at a distance of about four miles, the red light about seven miles, within the following bearings:—

Green light, from about N.W. ½ W. to N.

W. by N.

Red light, from about W. 1 N. to N.W. 1

The bearings are magnetic, and are given from the ship, not from the lights.






