THE following Circular from the Admiralty, relative to rewards for the apprehension of Naval Deserters, is published for general information.

Admiralty,

My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having had under their consideration the Rewards payable for the apprehension of Deserters from Her Majesty's Ships, as laid down in Article 3, Page 214, of Chapter 27, of the Queen's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, wherein it is ordered that the "sum of £3 is to be paid only for the apprehension of men who have been arrested within three months from the date of their having deserted, and £2 after the expiration of that time;" and their Lordships are pleased to direct that, after three months, and within six months, from the date of Desertion, £2 shall be paid for the apprehension of Deserters,—that after six and within twelve months, £1 only shall be paid,—and that after twelve months not any reward shall be paid, unless specially ordered by their Lordships.
