A PROCLAMATION

Intimating Her Majesty's assent to a certain Bill passed by the General Assembly.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that no Bill shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New Zealand until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify, by speech or message to the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, intituled "An Act to provide for the ascertainment of the Ownership of Native Lands, and for granting Certificates of Title thereto, and for regulating the disposal of Native Lands, and for other purposes," was presented to the Governor of the said Colony for Her Majesty's Assent, and the said Bill was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon :

Now therefore I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do, by this Proclamation, signify and proclaim to all to whom it may concern that the said Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent the same.

A PROCLAMATION

Constituting the Auckland Land Registry District.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN virtue of the powers conferred on me by the "Land Registry Act, 1860," I do hereby constitute within the Province of Auckland, a Registrar's District under the said Act, to be called "The District of Auckland," such district to comprise the Electoral

Districts of the City of Auckland East and the City of Auckland West, as defined in the Schedule to the "Representation Act, 1860."

A PROCLAMATION

Extending the Jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrate's Court at New Plymouth.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Resident Magistrates' Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1862," it is enacted that every case of a claim for debt or damages such as might at the passing of the said Act be lawfully tried in a Resident Magistrate's Court where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Twenty pounds may be tried in any Resident Magistrate's Court with respect to which this Act shall be in operation when the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Fifty pounds.

And it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the Colony, declare that the limit of Jurisdiction of any such Court shall be extended to one hundred pounds, and such limit of Jurisdiction shall be in such cases extended accordingly.

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited Act, and of an Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, authorising the issue of Proclamations under the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said recited Act, and especially the powers conferred by sections two and three thereof, shall be exercised to the limit of Jurisdiction of One hundred pounds in the Resident Magistrate's Court at New Plymouth; and I do further proclaim and declare that this proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

WHEREAS by the "Militia Acts Amendment Act, 1860," it is provided that if all the men of any class be not required, the men to be drawn out shall be taken by Ballot, according to such rules as the Governor shall from time to time make for that purpose.

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, in execution of the said recited Act, do hereby make the following Rules for the Ballotting of Militiamen; that is to say,—

1. The name of each Militiaman liable to be drawn is to be written on a separate piece of paper or card of a uniform size.
2. All the pieces of paper or card so inscribed are to be placed in a bag together.
3. The Officer Commanding in the District, in the presence of a Justice of the Peace, is to draw from the bag, one by one, as many pieces of paper

card as there are Militiamen required.

4. If any Militiamen are drawn and not liable to serve, from any sufficient reason, the drawing is to continue until the full number of serviceable Militiamen is obtained.
5. The names so drawn are to be written in a list, which list is to be signed by the Officer Commanding and the Justice.
6. Any Militiamen liable to be drawn may be present at the drawing.

The Officer Commanding in the District respectively is charged with the execution of these Rules.

Correspondence respecting publication of a
Manual of New Zealand Flora.

THE following correspondence with Dr. J. D. Hooker, Kew Gardens, respecting the preparation and publication by him of a "Manual of New Zealand Flora," is published for general information.

SIR,—Dr. Knight having represented to the Government of this Colony that you had expressed your willingness to prepare for publication as early as possible, a Manual of the New Zealand Flora, to be written in English, for which the sum of three hundred pounds (£300) would be payable by the Government to you for the labor thereby devolving on you, and to purchase one hundred (100) copies on the day of publication, the Government, fully sensible of the importance, in the interests of science of such a work, proposed the necessary vote to the House of Representatives, who cheerfully granted it.

It was understood from the information furnished by Dr. Knight that this work was not originally intended to include the description of the New Zealand Sea Weeds, and the Government were so impressed with the conviction that the usefulness of the work would be much increased by the comprisal of those plants that they took a vote for five hundred pounds (£500) in all, being fifty pounds (£50) in excess of the sum which it was understood would be necessary to meet the expense of the original work including the purchase of the one hundred (100) copies above referred to.

Should, however, the sum of five hundred pound (£500) be insufficient to meet the expense of the enlarged work, the Government will undertake to make good the deficiency providing the extra expense does not altogether exceed one hundred pounds (£100).

SIR,—I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of October 31st, 1862, informing me that the Government of New Zealand had done me the honor of directing that I should prepare and publish a Manual of the New Zealand Flora, and had placed on the estimates a sum of (£500) to meet the necessary expenses of authorship, and the purchase of 100 copies together with the liberal offer of another £100, should the former sum not be sufficient.

In answer, I have to request that you will make known to the Government of the Colony and the House of Representatives that I feel very much gratified by this mark of their confidence in my attainments and zeal in the cause of New Zealand science, and that I have already made some progress in the work in question which I shall hope to finish for the sum specified, viz., £500; also that I shall make it my endeavour to render the work in every respect worthy of their liberality and produce it at as cheap a selling rate as I possibly can, consistently with its containing full descriptions of the plants of the colony, their uses as far as is known to me, and their places of growth. I shall hope to finish it in two stout parts, forming two small 8vo. vols. or one thick 8vo. volume; and if possible so to arrange it with the publisher, I will endeavour to have one part published before the end of the present year.

THE following letter with its enclosure from the Assistant Military Secretary, respecting the Electric Telegraph between Auckland, Otahuhu, and Drury, being open to the public is published for general information.

SIR,—I am directed by the Lieutenant-General Commanding to acquaint you that as the Electric Telegraph is now in operation between Auckland, Otahuhu, and Drury, it is the wish of the Lieutenant-General that the community at large may benefit by it; and with this view he desires that it may be notified in the *New Zealand Gazette* that the line will be open to the Colonial Government, and the public, for the transmission of messages between the places alluded to above, at the hours and rates specified in the enclosed extract from the Regulations for the Electric Telegraph.

I am also to add, that this scale of charges has been adopted in order to meet the increased expenditure incurred, when making the line available for the public generally.

For any distance above 2 miles, a special arrangement must be made for delivery by a civilian messenger, and the expense (which will be ascertained by telegraph) must be defrayed by the person sending the message previous to its despatch.

Tenders are required by the Government of New Zealand for the performance of the undermentioned services.

1. A steamer to leave Melbourne within 24 hours after the due date of the arrival of the European Mail Contract Boat, for Port Chalmers, Otago, calling at the Bluff. To wait in Melbourne, for the Mail, if detained, not more than four days, after its due date.
