A PROCLAMATION

For bringing Ordinance, Session 7, No. 10, and "The Weights and Measures Ordinance Amendment Act, 1861," into operation within a District in the Province of Marlborough.

By His Excellency Sir George
GREY, Knight Commander of
the Most Honourable Order of
the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over
Her Majesty's Colony of New
Zealand and its Dependencies,
and Vice-Admiral of the same,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is expedient to bring into operation within a portion of the Province of Marlborough, the Ordinance intituled an Ordinance for establishing Standard Weights and Measures and for the prevention of such as are false and deficient Session VII No. 10, and an Act intituled "The Weights and Measures Ordinance Amendment Act, 1861:"

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and appoint that from the sixth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three the operation of the said Ordinance and Act shall extend to the following District situate in the Province of Marlborough in the said Colony, that is to say:—

All that part of the Province of Marlborough situated and being within a radius of

Twenty-five miles of the Town of Blenheim, in the said Province of Marlborough.

Authorising further issue of Treasury Bills.

WHEREAS by the "Loan Act, 1862," power is given to raise in Great Britian a Loan of £500,000 for the Public Service of the Colony, and it is enacted that, until the aforesaid sum of Five hundred thousand pounds shall be raised in Great Britain, it shall be lawful for the Colonial Treasurer, if thereunto authorised by an Order of the Governor in Council, from time to time to borrow and take up at Interest at a rate not exceeding six pounds per centum per annum, payable out of the Ordinary Revenue, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole One hundred thousand

pounds, on the security of Treasury Bills pay- Place for such District, namely :-able at the expiration of a term not exceeding twelve months from the date thereof. And whereas the sums of £25,000 and £30,000 have already been raised in manner above precribed in virtue of Orders in Council dated 21st November, 1862, and 17th January, 1863, respectively, and it has become necessary to borrow a further sum of £45,000 in anticipa- By His Excellency's command, tion of the said Loan;

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, of the said Colony, doth hereby authorise the Honorable Reader Gilson Wood, Colonial Treasurer of New Zealand, to borrow and take up a further sum or sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of forty five thousand pounds sterling, and to issue Treasury Bills therefor on the terms and subject to the conditions before recited.

Warrant abolishing Polling Places and appointing others in lieu thereof.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint Polling Places for each Electoral District, within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such Places to be the Principal Polling Place for the District, and all or any of such Polling Places at any time to abolish and to appoint other Polling Places in lieu thereof:

And whereas certain Polling Places were appointed for the City of Nelson District for the Election of Members for the House of Representatives ;

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the same ;

NOW KNOW YE, that I, SIR GEORGE GREY, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby abolish the Polling Places above referred to for the City of Nelson District for the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and do appoint in lieu thereof;

NEW ZEALAND MAIL SERVICE.

A BONUS of £350 will be paid by the Sub-Treasurer of the New Zealand Government at Dunedin, to the master of any steamboat which shall leave Melbourne with the New Zealand European Mails, within twentyfour hours after the arrival of the P. and O. Company's boat whenever the Aldinga has left without them, and deliver the same to the Postmaster at Dunedin, Otago, (landing the South-land portion at the Bluff, weather permitting,) within nine days of leaving Melbourne.

This Bonus will be paid for each of the months of August, September, October, November, and December of this year, immediately after the Mail Agent (for whom a free chief cabin passage must be provided) shall have certified that the service has been duly performed.

The Postmaster-General of Melbourne, or some person appointed by him, must be satisfied that any boat offering has sufficient steampower to perform the service required; and in case of there being a choice of boats, the selection to rest with that officer.


