A PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Definition of Districts Act, 1858," the Governor is empowered from time to time by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to divide the Colony into Counties, Hundreds, Parishes, or such other divisions as he may deem expedient, which shall have such limits, and shall bear and be known by such names or designations as in and by the said Proclamation constituting the same shall be prescribed.

Now, I, the Governor of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the territory hereinafter described or referred to shall be, and the same is hereby constituted a Village, that is to say, All that territory in the Province of Southland, containing by admeasurement 499 (Four hundred and ninety-nine) acres, 2 (Two) roods, and 25 (Twenty-five) perches, more or less, bounded on the North and East by the Ocean and Jacob's River Estuary, on the South and East by the South Eastern Boundary of Section 3, Block 11, Jacob's River Hundred, on the South and West by the South Western Boundary of Sections 3 and 13, Block 11, and 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, Block 1, Jacob's River Hundred, and on the North-West by the North-Western Boundary of Section 7, Block 1, Jacob's River Hundred, containing 499 (Four hundred and

ninety-nine) acres, 2 (Two) roods, and 25 (Twenty-five) perches, more or less:

And I further proclaim and declare that the said Village shall bear and be known by the name or designation of the Village of South Riverton,

A PROCLAMATION,

Abolishing Districts constituted under the "Districts Courts Acts, 1858."

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Districts Courts Act 1858," it is provided that there shall be within the Colony Courts of Record possessing Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction, to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time as he shall think fit by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the Colony, or any part thereof, Districts within

which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such Districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define, or alter, and also to declare by what local name each such Court shall be designated.

And whereas under and in pursuance of the said recited Act sundry Districts have from time to time been established and courts held in divers places in the Colony, And whereas several of such Courts have ceased to be in operation, but doubts have existed whether such Courts have been validly discontinued. And whereas it is expedient to remove such doubts and to abolish the remainder of the Courts and districts so constituted as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, in pursuance and execution of the power and authority in me vested under the provisions of the said recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Districts of Taranaki, Otago, Auckland, Nelson, Wellington, and Wanganui, so constituted as aforesaid, are and from henceforth shall be abolished, and that the Districts of Hawke's Bay, The Hutt, and Marlborough, shall be and remain abolished from and after the Twenty-eighth day of March next ensuing.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

A PROCLAMATION,

Extending the Jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrate's Court at Napier, the Lower Hutt, and Blenheim.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Resident Magistrates' Jurisdiction Extension Act 1862," it is enacted that every case of a claim for debt or damages, such as might at the passing of the said Act be lawfully tried in the Resident Magistrate's Court, where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Twenty Pounds, may be tried in any Resident Magistrate's Court with respect to which this Act shall be in operation when the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Fifty pounds.

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the

Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited Act, and of an Order in Council dated the Seventeenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, authorising the issue of Proclamations under the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said recited Act, and especially the powers conferred by sections two and three thereof, shall be exercised to the limit of jurisdiction of Fifty pounds in the Resident Magistrate's Court at Napier, in the Province of Hawke's Bay, at the Lower Hutt, in the Province of Wellington, and at Blenheim, in the Province of Marlborough.

And I do further Proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the Twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a Commission should be appointed for the purposes hereinafter mentioned: Now know ye that I, reposing special trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have thought fit to constitute and appoint, and by these presents do constitute and appoint you, William Crush Daldy, Alfred Domett, John Anderson Gilfillan, William Gisborne, Robert Graham, Charles Knight, Albin Martin, Joseph Newman, William Swainson, and Frederick Whitaker, to be Commissioners to select and determine sites, to obtain and sanction plans, and to take all such other necessary steps as you may think

fit for causing the construction without delay of the following Public Buildings, that is to say:—A Government House in the Domain, a Supreme Court House, a Custom House, and a Post Office, all in Auckland aforesaid. And by these presents I give and grant to you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority to carry into effect the purposes of the Commission by all lawful ways and means whatsoever. And I direct that you, the said Commissioners, shall from time to time prescribe all such rules as may appear to you to be necessary for giving notice of and holding meetings for the due and orderly conduct of the proceedings, and the effective despatch of the business thereat. And I direct that before proceeding to business, the Commissioners present at each meeting shall elect a Chairman for such meeting. And I further direct that you keep a record of your proceedings, and do report the same from time to time for my approval and confirmation: and for your assistance in the execution of this my Commission, I have appointed Sampson Kempthorne, Esq., to be Secretary to this my Commission, and to attend you, whose services and assistance you will from time to time use as occasion shall require.

CRIMINAL PROSECUTIONS.

THE Law in reference to Criminal Prosecutions is the same in New Zealand as in England. Some person in all cases is or ought to be bound over to prosecute, and that person has a right to conduct the prosecution in the Supreme Court, or to employ a Solicitor and Counsel to do so.

It has been thought advisable not to alter the Law here, but, having regard to the difference of circumstances between England and New Zealand, there are certain details for which some special provision should be made, and especially specific instructions given to those whose duty it is to conduct prosecutions both before Justices of the Peace and in the Supreme Court. The following Regulations will for the future be acted on:—

1. In all prosecutions, except in special cases, where Solicitors are employed by direction of the Government, or by prosecutors, the management of the case in the usual

manner before Justices of the Peace will be left to the Police.

2. An allowance will be made to Prosecutors and witnesses of expenses actually and necessarily incurred by them in attendance before Justices: the amount to be fixed by the Committing Justices immediately after the hearing of the case, and a certificate granted. The amount stated in the certificate will be paid on presentation at the Colonial Treasury or Sub-Treasury.

3. The Committing Justice, or his Clerk, shall ascertain from the prosecutor, as soon as a committal for trial takes place, whether he intends to take charge of the conduct of the prosecution, or authorises a Solicitor appointed by the Crown to act on his behalf.

4. If the prosecution is left to such Solicitor, the Committing Justice or his Clerk will make a memorandum on the depositions to that effect, and forthwith transmit them to the Registrar of the Supreme Court of the District in which the trial is to take place.

5. On receipt of the depositions, the Registrar will cause a copy to be made without delay, and transmit the same to the Crown Solicitor for the District.

6. It will be the duty of the Crown Solicitor to carefully consider the depositions at once, and prepare the case for the Supreme Court, taking special care that any additional witnesses that can be obtained in support of the case are subpoenaed. The Police will render assistance in serving subpoenas.

7. The Crown Solicitor or Counsel employed by him will conduct the prosecution at the trial. The Police will render assistance in procuring the attendance of witnesses and having them ready to be examined when required, but the Solicitor will be responsible that this duty is properly performed.

8. It will be competent for the Judge presiding at the trial to give such directions as he may think fit as to the disallowance of the whole or any part of the costs of the prosecution, including allowances to witnesses.

9. Subject to such directions, the Solicitor who has conducted the prosecution, whether at the instance of the Prosecutor or of the Crown, will make out a Bill of Costs, including allowances to witnesses.

10. The Registrar of the Supreme Court at the place at which the trial takes place will tax the Bill of Costs, giving effect to any directions the presiding Judge may have given, and grant a certificate of the amount allowed in each case.

11. The amount allowed to the Crown Solicitor will be according to the following scale; and the amount specified in such certificate will be paid at the Treasury or Sub-Treasury on presentation of the certificate to the Solicitor having charge of the prosecution, who will pay the witnesses their allowances.

THE following Proclamation, issued by His Honor the Superintendent of Canterbury under the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," is published for general information.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated Oct. 30th, 1862, the Province of Otago was declared to be an infected district within the meaning of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and it was declared that no cattle should be imported from the said Province either by land or sea: Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL

BEALEY, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the following Regulations for the destruction of diseased cattle and for preventing the introduction of cattle out of the said infected district into the Province of Canterbury.

- I. If any person shall drive or remove, or cause to be driven or removed, or assist in driving or removing any cattle from the said infected district into the Province of Canterbury, such person shall be liable to a penalty of fifty pounds for every head of cattle so driven into the Province of Canterbury.
- II. It shall be lawful for any Inspector of Cattle or Police Constable to destroy or cause to be destroyed any cattle which shall pass into this Province from the District of the Province of Otago.
- III. If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any Inspector or any Police Constable acting under the authority of these Regulations, every person so offending shall and may be seized and detained by such person so acting as aforesaid, or any person or persons he may call to his assistance, until such offender or offenders can be taken before two Justices of the Peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty Pounds.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Despatch, with its enclosures from Lieutenant-General Cameron, C. B.

T. RUSSELL.

Head Quarters,
Te Awamutu, 25th Feb., 1864.

SIR,—I have the honor to report, for your Excellency's information, that at 11 o'clock on the night of the 20th instant, I marched with the force named in the margin from Te Rore towards Te Awamutu, by a track which crosses the Mangapiko at Waiari.

I left Colonel Waddy at Te Rore in command of the remainder of the troops, with orders to continue in the entrenched camp in front of Paterangi Pah until the following night.

I arrived at Te Awamutu at daybreak on the 21st, and immediately pushed on to Rangiaohia, which I found nearly deserted. The few natives who were in the place were completely taken by surprise, and refusing to lay down their arms, fired on the Mounted Royal Artillery and Colonial Defence Force, whom I sent on in advance of the column. The natives were quickly dispersed, and the greater part escaped, but a few of them taking shelter in a whare, made a desperate resistance, until the Forest Rangers and a company of the 65th Regiment surrounded the whare, which was set on fire, and the defenders either killed or taken prisoners.

I regret to say that several casualties occurred on our side, and amongst them Colonel Nixon, commanding the Defence Force, who was severely wounded in endeavouring to enter the whare. Our loss was two killed and 6 wounded. About 12 natives were killed and 12 taken prisoners.

I have detained 21 women and children who were found in the village.

Immediately after the settlement was cleared I marched the troops back to Te Awamutu.

At 4½ o'clock on the morning of the 21st, a large convoy, escorted by the 50th Regiment, under Colonel Weare, left Te Rore, and following the track through Waiari, which I mentioned above, arrived at Te Awamutu at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

Early on the morning of the 22nd, the officer of the advanced picquet reported that he had seen 700 natives passing along the road from Paterangi to Rangiaohia, where they halted. Natives were also seen on our right at Kihikihi. I therefore determined to march on Rangiaohia the following morning, and in order that my force might be sufficient to occupy that place as well as Te Awamutu, I ordered Colonel Waddy to march the same evening from Paterangi with

the force named in the margin.* But as it was reported to me about noon the same day that a considerable body of natives had advanced from Rangiaohia, and were fortifying themselves on the site of an old pah called Haeirini—a position extremely strong by nature, and blocking the road between Te Awamutu and Rangiaohia—I determined to attack them immediately.

At 1½ o'clock p.m. I advanced on their position with the force named in the margin.†

Small detached parties of the enemy, who were posted about a mile in front of Haeirini, having been driven back by the skirmishers, which were composed of companies of the 50th and 70th Regiments, I brought up the two six-pounder Armstrong guns, under the command of Bt.-Lieut.-Colonel Barstow, to a commanding height about 500 yards from the position.

After several rounds had been fired from these guns with good effect, I ordered Colonel Weare with the 50th Regiment to carry the position at the point of the bayonet, having the 65th in support and the 70th in reserve, while the cavalry were formed up on the right, behind the brow of the hill, ready to pursue the enemy.

The 50th were exposed to a very heavy fire in advancing towards the position, which they carried with great gallantry, and I beg to enclose a copy of Colonel Weare's report describing the attack.

The natives fell hurriedly back before the leading files of the 50th could reach them with the bayonet, and retired through a

swamp in the direction of the Mangatautari Road. The cavalry had an opportunity of charging them as they retreated, and did some execution. They made no further stand, but fled precipitately towards Mangatautari, leaving almost everything but their arms behind them.

I enclose Returns of our casualties on this occasion and on the day previous.

I estimate the number of natives who defended the position at Haeirini at 400. Their loss I have not been able to ascertain, but they must have had at least 30 killed.

Leaving the 50th Regiment and two guns under Colonel Weare, near the Catholic Church at Rangiaohia, I withdrew the remainder of the troops to Te Awamutu, where Colonel Waddy arrived with his force at 11 o'clock that night; having, before he left Te Rore, taken possession of the Paterangi pa, which, as well as the one at Pikopiko, was deserted by the enemy in the morning.

I cannot praise too highly the admirable conduct of all the troops, regular and colonial, during the fatiguing night march of the 20th, and the operations of the two following days; but particularly of the Mounted Royal Artillery, under Lieut. Rait; of the Colonial Defence Force, under Lieut.-Colonel Nixon, and afterwards under Captain Walmsley; and of the 50th Regiment, under Colonel Weare.

I deeply regret that the severe wound received by Lieut.-Colonel Nixon has deprived me, though I trust only for a short time, of his valuable services. The high

state of discipline and efficiency of the Colonial Defence Force, and the eagerness which they invariably manifest to come into contact with the enemy, are chiefly due to the example and exertions of that able and zealous officer.

I beg to bring under your favourable notice the invaluable services rendered to the force under my command by Mr. Edwards, of the Native Department, whose information regarding the roads and tracks of this part of the country I have always found most correct. Without his assistance to guide the column, the night march of the 20th could not have been undertaken.

I beg to enclose copy of a Report received from Colonel Waddy, C.B., regarding the evacuation of the Paterangi pa.

SIR,—I have the honor to report for the information of the Lieut.-General Commanding the Forces, that this morning, about 7 o'clock, Captain Saltmarshe, 70th Regiment, commanding at Waiari Redoubt, informed me that he believed the enemy had evacuated the Pa of Paterangi. I then sent Lieut.-Colonel Sir H. Havelock, D.A.Q.M.G., to take a nearer look at the place, and as he also reported that he believed the place was evacuated, I proceeded thither with the inlying picquets (about 120 men), and advanced on the south side, sending 100 men of the 70th on the east side, under the direction of Sir H. Havelock: we entered and occupied the place without seeing one Maori. I have placed 200 men of the 40th Regiment, under Major Blyth, on the highest point of the hill on which the Pa is situated; but I have not given them tents.

I found the works of the enemy very strong and intricate; in the centre of the place is a deep well,—and I found large stores of potatoes.

I have further to report, that I advanced to a place belonging to a man named McFarlane, about half way between the Pas of Paterangi and Piko Piko; this man, McFarlane, reported to me that the enemy had evacuated Piko Piko during last night, and that they had proceeded towards Rangiaohia.

The Pa of Paterangi was evacuated at about 7 o'clock this morning.

SIR,—I have the honor to report for the information of the Lieutenant-General commanding the Forces, that with reference to his instructions, conveyed to me personally, for storming the enemy's works on the 22nd instant, I proceeded to carry out his directions in the following manner:—

The enemy's works could only be approached by a narrow road, hemmed in on either side by high fern, through which it was impossible for the men to advance in line or skirmishing order, and necessitating the position being stormed with only a front of four deep, until within a few yards of the trench and rifle pits. This compelled me to advance the whole Regiment in a column of four, at the double, over some 350 to 400 yards, under a very severe and concentrated fire from the enemy, most trying to troops in that formation. I ordered a small storming party of 20 men, under Lieut. White, 50th Regt., to break cover, in the first instance, to endeavour to draw out the first fire of the enemy; this party was almost simultaneously followed up by the storming party, consisting of Nos. 1 and 10 Companies, 50th Regt., under command of Captain Johnson and Captain Thompson respectively, and these three officers entered the enemy's works at the head of their men, at the same time closely followed by the remainder of the regiment.

The nature of the ground and formation left little for the Commanding Officer to do, but to place the men in the first instance, and leave the officers commanding companies to fight their men; and I am proud to say that officers and men nobly did their duty under very trying circumstances, and while exposed to a fire that must have caused a very large increase to the list of casualties had it not been for the dense dust raised by the men doubling, which partially concealed them.

I beg to bring to the notice of the Lieut.-General commanding the Forces the names of Captains Johnson and Thompson, and Lieut. White, 50th Regt.

The medical officers of the Regiment, Drs. Davis and Dempster, accompanied the Regiment into action, and shared their lot, attending to the wounded as they fell.

I much regret to say that Ensoun Doveton, 50th Regt., fell dangerously wounded by the side of Captain Thompson, while gallantly performing his duty.

Swift had been killed and Lieut. Butler severely wounded.
