A PROCLAMATION

Constituting the "Otago Gold Fields" a District under the "District Courts Act, 1858."

> By His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that there shall be within the Colony of New Zealand Courts of Record, possessing Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction, to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time as he shall think fit by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such Districts to abolish and the boundaries thereof to define and alter, and also to declare by what local name each such Court shall be designated.

Now, therefore, I, the said Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the aforesaid authority, do hereby proclaim and constitute all the territory comprised within the Gold Fields proclaimed, or hereafter to be proclaimed, in the Province of Otago, to be a District within which a District Court shall be held under the said Act.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the authority aforesaid, I do hereby declare by the name of "The District Court of the Otago Gold Fields."

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858," power was given to the Governor to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and to make and put in force regulations within such Districts in manner and subject to the provisions of the said Act: And by that the aforesaid Court shall be designated the same Act it was provided that such

regulations should be made as far as possible | with the general assent of the Native population affected thereby, to be ascertained in such manner as to the Governor might seem fitting: And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-fifth day of January, 1862, the Governor hath appointed a District therein described to be a District for the purposes of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, do here-

by appoint

WILLIAM BERTRAM WHITE, Esquire, to be a Commissioner for the said District, to be termed "The Civil Commissioner for the District of Mangonui," for the purpose of ascertaining such assent of the Native population as aforesaid, and for such other purposes as shall be hereafter prescribed by law, to act in all things subject to such instructions and regulations as shall be from time to time given in that behalf by the Governor.

DESPATCHES FROM THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

IIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Despatches from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonics.

WILLIAM FOX.

Downing Street, 23rd March, 1864.

SIR,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch, No. 3 of the 4th receipt of your Despatch, No. 3 of the 4th of January, enclosing letters from Colonel Carey, commanding the Thames Expeditionary Force, reporting that he had successfully performed the duty for which he had been detached of establishing a line of Military Posts, and opening the communication between the Firth of the Thames and the River Weilbets Waikato.

I am glad to observe that out of the 843 men under Colonel Carey's command, 340 belong to different Colonial corps, and I notice with satisfaction the valuable assistance afforded by the Naval Volunteers.

I have also to acknowledge your Despatch, No. 4 of the 4th of January, enclosing a report from Captain Jackson, commanding the Forest Rangers, of his having surprised a party of Natives in the bush, who were in possession at the time of a great amount of property which had been plundered from Europeans.

I quite concur in Sir D. Cameron's opinion that Captain Jackson and those who acted with him deserve great credit for the manner in which they followed up the track of these Natives, who were clearly more or less im-plicated in the outrages which have been committed.

PROCLAMATION,

Prohibiting the Importation of Cattle from the Colony of Tasmania.

By the Honourable John Hyde HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

Government Gazette, issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago at Dunedin, the eighteenth day of January last, I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, by virtue of the powers delegated to and vested in me in that behalf, did thereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date thereof all the Australian Ports, with the exception of Gipps Land and Mornington, should be deemed infected districts, places, or ports, within the meaning and for the purposes of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861." And whereas by another proclamation in the said Gazette, issued as aforesaid upon the sixteenth day of February thereafter, I, by virtue of the said powers, did thereby rescind the said exceptions, and did proclaim and declare that from and after the date thereof Gipps Land and Mornington should be deemed to be infected districts, ports, or places within the meaning and for the purposes of the aforesaid Act. And whereas doubts have arisen whether by the proclamation first above recited the importation of Cattle from the Colony of Tasmania into the Province of Otago was prohibited, and it is expedient to remove these doubts. Now therefore I the said John Hyde Harris, by virtue of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof the Colony of Tasmania and all ports and places therein shall be deemed infected districts, ports, or places, within the meaning and for the purposes of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and that no cattle from and after the date hereof until further notice shall be imported into the Province of Otago from the Colony of Tasmania aforesaid.
