A PROCLAMATION,

Altering the time for taking the Census in 1864.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Census Act, 1858," it is provided that the account of the number and condition of the Population of New Zealand, and of the Live Stock, and of the Cultivations therein, respectively, which the said Act directs to be taken in every third year succeeding the year One thousand Eight hundred and Fifty-eight, shall be taken in the month of December, and that the forms of Returns for obtaining the required information shall be delivered by the several Sub-Enumerators at the Dwelling-houses in their respective Sub-Districts between the First and Twenty-fourth days of December (both inclusive) in the years appointed, and that the said forms shall be demanded and received by such Sub-Enumerators on the Twenty-sixth day of December, or as soon after as practicable:

And whereas it is further provided by the "Census Act Amendment Act, 1860," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to appoint any other month, or any other day or days for the purposes above cited in the year One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-four, or in any or every third year after, instead of the month or the day or days ap-

pointed by "The Census Act, 1858," and the time or times so appointed by the Governor in Council shall be declared by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and also that all the provisions of "The Census Act, 1858," relating to taking an account of the Population of New Zealand, and of the Live Stock and of the Cultivations therein, shall, except as therein provided, be deemed and taken to apply to such time or times as fully as if such month, or day or days, had been specified in the said Act:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, proclaim and declare that the forms of Returns above referred to shall be delivered by the several Sub-Enumerators at the Dwelling Houses in their respective Sub-Districts, between the Fourteenth day of November and the First day of December (both days included) in the year One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-four, and that the said forms shall be demanded and received by such Sub-Enumerators on the Second day of December, in the same year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

A PROCLAMATION,

Intimating Her Majesty's Assent to a certain Bill passed by the General Assembly.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New Zealand until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify by speech or message to the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, intituled, "An Act to Alter the Civil List," was presented to the Governor of the said Colony for Her Majesty's assent, and the said Bill was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, Do by this proclamation signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern that the said Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

G. GREY,

His Excellency the Governor in Council.
WHEREAS it is provided by the "Gold Fields Act 1862," that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, subject to the provisions of the said Act, to make rules and regulations relating to the terms

and conditions upon which Miners' rights shall be granted, and the forms of such Miners' rights and of licences and leases to be issued under the said Act, and the modes, times, and places of issue thereof, and also touching the extent and position of any claim, and the conditions under which it shall be worked, held, assigned, or forfeited, the application and use of machinery, and all such other rules and regulations relating to the mining under Miners' rights or otherwise in any Gold Field as he may deem most beneficial: And whereas at a Council held on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the Governor in Council made certain regulations for the conduct of Gold Mining within the District of the Coromandel Gold Field, whereby amongst other things it was provided that for certain causes therein set forth, provision to retain a claim unworked may be granted by the warden or any person duly authorised, and the same shall be thereon registered for three months, during which time he shall be entitled to occupy a claim elsewhere: And whereas the Government have made certain promises or have undertaken obligations to protect the claims of companies or of individuals in the Coromandel Gold Field during the Maori insurrection, and it is expedient to make additional regulations to authorise such protection: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby make the further rules and regulations following for the conduct of the gold-mining within the District of the Coromandel Gold Field aforesaid:—Permission to retain a claim unworked may be granted by the Warden or any person duly authorised, if it shall appear to the Governor that such unworking shall be caused or shall have been caused in consequence of the Maori insurrection, whether the period for which such claim may have been registered shall or shall not have expired at the time of this regulation coming into force; or whether such claim may have been previously registered or not, and the registration of any such claim may be made or renewed from time to time for periods of three months at any time so long as in the opinion of the Commissioner the unworking of such claim shall be caused by the said insurrection.

SIR,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch, No. 34, of the 27th of February, enclosing a copy of a report from Lieutenant-General Sir Duncan Cameron of the operations of the force under his command upon the 21st and 22nd of February, which resulted in the complete rout of the Rebel Natives, and the occupation of an important position. I am fully sensible of the excellence of the arrangements which he made, and also of the admirable conduct of the officers and men under his command.

It affords me also much pleasure to notice the testimony which General Cameron has borne to the discipline and efficiency of the Colonial Defence Force, which he states is chiefly due to the example and exertions of Lieutenant-Colonel Nixon, who has the command of the Force; and I trust that by your next Despatches you will have been able to inform me that this gallant officer had recovered from his wounds.

I have also to request that you will convey to the Bishop of New Zealand an expression of my sincerest thanks for the invaluable services which, at a great personal risk and inconvenience, he had rendered to General Cameron and the troops under his command.

SIR,—I have the honor to report for the information of the Lieut.-General Commanding, that since the engagement at Te Ranga, on the 21st ultimo, I have constantly patrolled both on this and the Wairoa side without seeing any signs of hostile natives in either direction.

On the 23rd ultimo, Captain Pye, whilst patrolling with his Defence Force, came upon a large and very strong pa, situated about 14 miles due south of this station. It was an old one repaired and strengthened with a palisading of ti tree and post and rails, and an embankment of about 20 feet high and rifle-pits between it and the palisading. The pa extended completely across a tongue of land with a ravine on either side of it, and from the rear of it there was a path leading direct to the woods, which were distant about half-a-mile.

Captain Pye had the whole of the wood-work pulled up and burned.

THE following Report of the Assessors appointed to investigate the cause of the wreck of the schooner "Waverley," with a minute respecting charts of Port Waikato for sale, are published for general information.

We, the undersigned, having been appointed assessors to investigate the cause of the loss of the schooner "Waverley" at Waikato Heads, and having heard the whole of the evidence, do make the following report :—

That the loss of the vessel is to be attributed

1st, To an error of judgment in the master endeavouring to take the harbour with a scant northerly wind and ebb tide.

2nd, In neglecting to use the lead.

3rd, To the want of a chart of the latest survey, showing the beacons and their magnetic bearing, as both master and mate were ignorant of beacons being placed here as leading marks over the bar.

As it appears from the evidence of the master that charts of the late survey could not be procured in Auckland, we would suggest that this want be attended to by the proper authorities.

ROCK IN HAWKE'S BAY.

THE Harbour-Master at Napier has reported to the Marine Board, that he has

discovered a rock in Hawke's Bay, having a depth of only 12½ feet on it at low water spring tides. He gives the following bearings:

From rock to east end of Ahuriri Bluff S. by E.

From rock to west point of Bluff S.W. by S.

From rock to Cape Kidnappers S.E. ½ E.

The above bearings place the rock on the inner or southern portion of the shoal marked in Captain Drury's charts with 4½ and 4 fathoms on it bearing N. by W. from Ahuriri Bluff, about five cable lengths distant.

A buoy has been placed ten fathoms north of the rock, by keeping outside of which vessels will clear the shoal east of the Bluff.

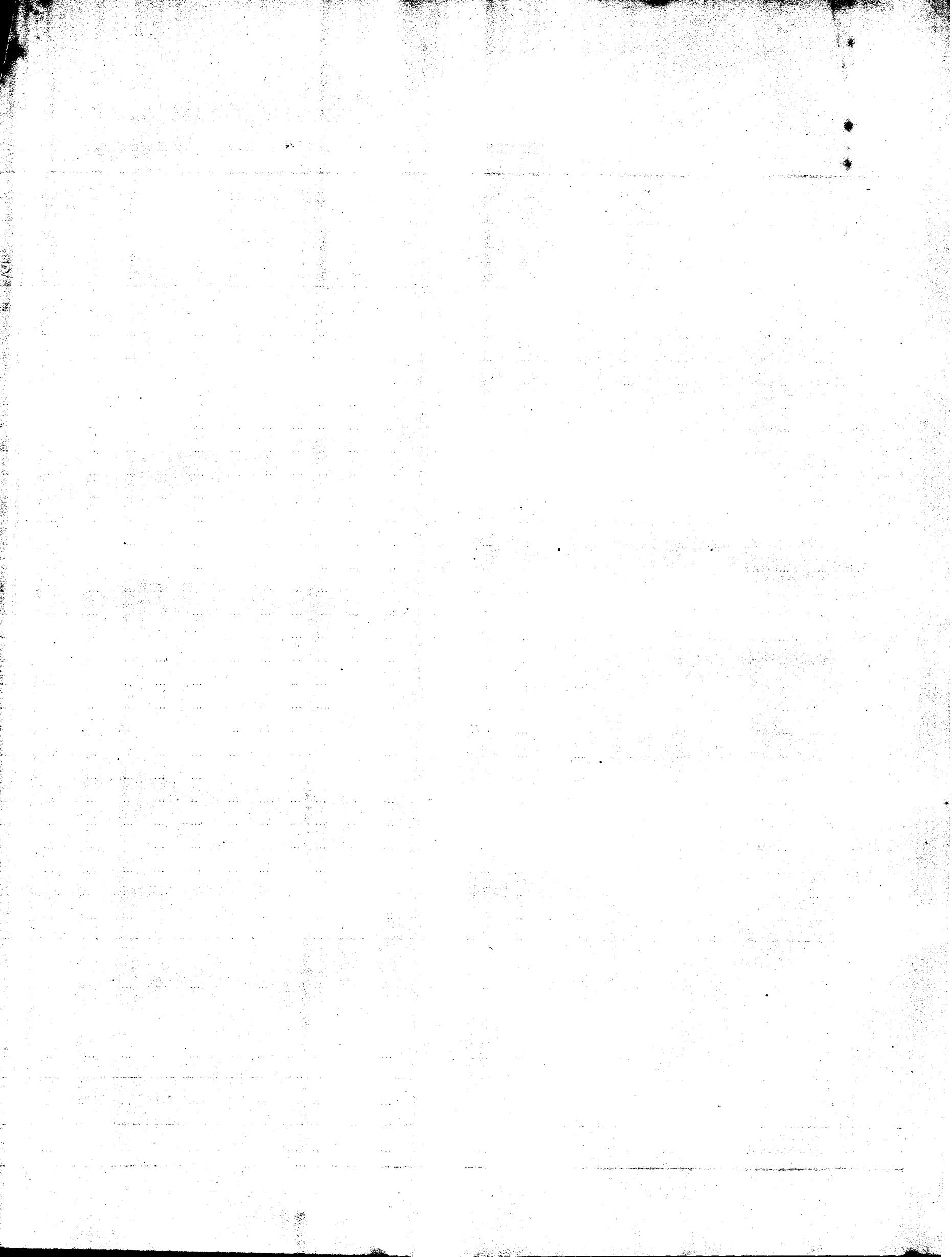

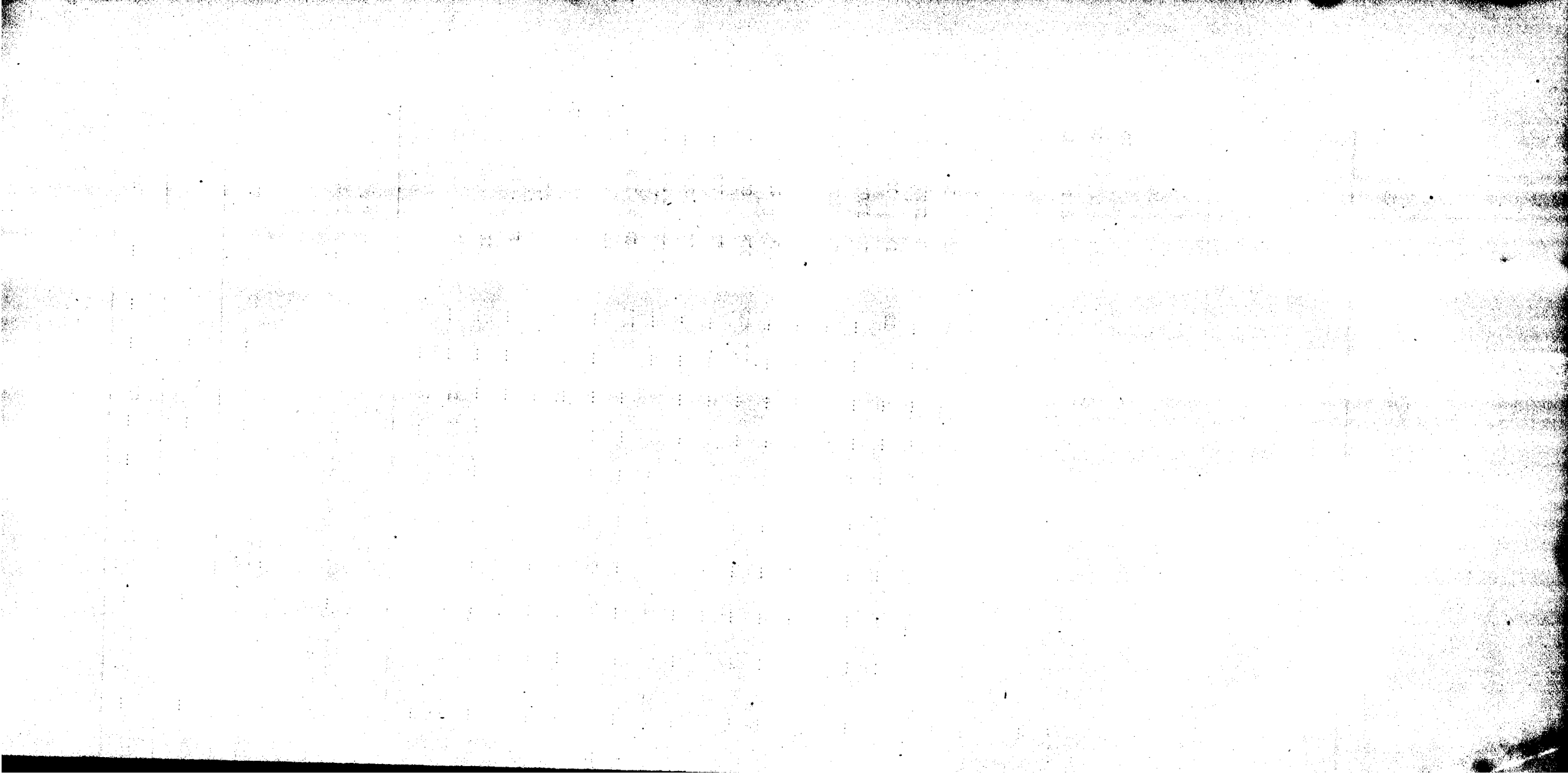
