ORDER IN COUNCIL,

Proclaiming certain Lands under "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863."

G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House, at Auckland,
 the 29th day of December, 1864.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863" it was enacted amongst other things that whenever the Governor in Council should be satisfied that any Native Tribe or Section of a Tribe or any considerable number thereof have since the first day of January 1863, been engaged in rebellion against Her Majesty's authority, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to declare that the District within which any land being the property or in the possession of such Tribe or Section or considerable number thereof should be situate, should be a District within the provisions of the said Act, and the boundaries of such District in like manner to define and vary as he should think fit.

And whereas the Governor in Council, is satisfied that certain Native Tribes or Sections of Tribes, having respectively as their property or in their possession the lands hereunder described, have been engaged in rebellion against Her Majesty's Authority.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power vested in him by the said recited Act, doth hereby with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, declare that from the date hereof, the land described in each of the eight schedules to this Proclamation shall be a District within the Provisions of the "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and shall be designated by the name mentioned in such schedule and doth declare that the said lands are required for the purposes of the said Act and are subject to the provisions thereof and doth order that the said Lands shall be and the same are hereby set apart and reserved as sites for Settlement and Colonization agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

LANDS ABOVE REFERRED TO

SCHEDULE 1.—MILITARY SETTLEMENTS.

All that land bounded on the North by a straight line running East from the junction of the Waipa and Horatiu Rivers, to the Eastern boundary of the lands described in the Proclamation of December 17, 1864, and by a prolongation of the same line, running West from the junction of the Rivers Horatiu and Waipa to the summit of the Hakarimata Range; on the West by the summits of the Hakarimata, the Kapa mahunga, and the Pirongia Ranges; on the South by the Southern boundary of the aforementioned proclaimed lands; and on the East by the Eastern boundary of the afore-mentioned proclaimed lands, to a point due East of the junction of the Waipa and Horatiu Rivers aforesaid.

SCHEDULE 2.—PATUMAHOE.

All that Land known as the Patumahoe Reserve, containing 701 acres, bounded on the North by land sold to the Queen, 7100 links; on the East by land sold to the Queen, 5970 links; on the South by land sold to the Queen, 2450 links, 6325 links, and 3260 links; on the West by land sold to the Queen, 1403 links, 3551 links, and 3377 links, and by a road 105 links.

SCHEDULE 3.—PUKEKOE.

All that Land known as the Pukekohe Block, containing 5381 acres, bounded on the North-west by the Karaka Block, 21,040 links; on the North-East by lots 4, 12, and 16, in the Pukekohe purchase, and by other lands in the same purchase, 29,400 links; on the South-east by other land in the same purchase, 13,180 links, and the South-west by a cut line, bearing N. 38° W. 33,550 links.

SCHEDULE 4.—POKENO.

All that Land, estimated to contain 19000 acres, and known as the Pokeno Block, bounded on the West by land sold to the Queen in the parish of Mangatawhiri, by the Great South Road, and by the Ramarama purchase; on the North by the Ramarama and

Hunua purchases; on the South by the Mangatawhiri Creek and Swamp; and on the East by a line bearing N. 36 W. 53,600 links.

SCHEDULE 5.—TUAKAU.

All that Land known as the Tuakau Block, estimated to contain 10,887 acres, bounded on the South by the Waikato River; on the West by the Waikato River, and by land sold to the Queen, by a cut line 1775 links, by a creek and a line 850 links, by a cut line 3100 links, by a cut line 7550 links, by a cut line 11,100 links; on the North by the Tirikohua Creek, and by land sold to the Queen 600 links, 1250 links, 450 links, 456 links, 1800 links, 2750 links, 1700 links; by a road 200 links, by land sold to the Queen 5400 links, 6850 links, 10,450 links, 200 links, and 8500 links; on the East by land sold to the Queen 8100 links, 1400 links, and by the Waikato River.

SCHEDULE 6.—WAIUKU NORTH.

All that Land known as the Waiuku Block North, bounded on the North by the Ramaroa and Rangiriri purchases; on the West by the Sea; on the South by land formerly sold to Dalziel; and on the East by the Town of Waiuku and the Waiuku Creek.

SCHEDULE 7.—WAIUKU SOUTH.

All that Land known as the Waiuku Block South, bounded on the North by Dalziel's claim; on the East by the town of Waiuku and its suburbs, and by the Awaroa; on the South by the Waikato River; and on the West by the Sea.

SCHEDULE 8.—TUIMATA.

All that Land known as the Tuimata Block, containing 640 acres, bounded on the North by lot 41, of the Parish of Opaheke, 8250 links; on the East by lot 47, 800 links, and by lots 47 and 49, 6100 links, and by 2900 links; on the South by land sold to the Queen, 2000 links; and on the West by lot 81, 6750 links.

Debentures under "Debentures Act, 1864."

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Debentures Act, 1864," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New Zealand to borrow any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of One Million Pounds, in anticipation of the loan of Three Million Pounds authorised to be borrowed under the provisions of the "New Zealand Loan Act, 1863," and to take up the same on Debentures from time to time, as he may deem expedient: And it is further enacted that every such Debenture shall be in such form and for such sum, and shall be signed and issued by such Agent or Agents, as the Governor shall appoint:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said power and authority, do hereby appoint that there shall be borrowed and raised under the authority of the said Act the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, part of the said sum of One Million Pounds sterling; and that the same shall be raised by Debentures in the form hereunder written, in sums of not less than Twenty Pounds nor more than One Thousand Pounds, at the discretion of the Agents or Agent; and that the same shall bear interest at the rate of Eight Pounds per centum per annum; and that Falconer Larkworthy, Robert Porter, and William Smellie

Grahame, Esquires, jointly, and each of them severally, shall be the Agents and Agent in England for raising such sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, and for signing and issuing such Debentures. And I do hereby direct that Coupons in the form hereunder written may be appended to the said Debentures or not, as the said Agents or Agent in their or his discretion shall think fit. And I do direct that such Agents or Agent shall have all the powers under the said Act, in reference to the raising the said sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor, and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Debentures Act, 1864," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New Zealand to borrow any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of One Million Pounds, in anticipation of the Loan of Three Million Pounds authorised to be borrowed under the provisions of the "New Zealand Loan Act, 1863," and to take up the same on Debentures from time to time as he may deem expedient. And it is further enacted that every such Debenture shall be in such form and for such sum, and shall be signed and issued by such Agent or Agents as the Governor shall appoint.

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor

as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said power and authority do hereby appoint that there shall be borrowed and raised under the Authority of the said Act, the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Pounds, part of the said sum of One Million Pounds Sterling; and that the same shall be raised by Debentures in the form hereunder written, in sums of not less in amount than Twenty Pounds nor more than One Thousand Pounds, at the discretion of the Agents or Agent, and that the same shall bear interest at the rate of Eight Pounds per centum per annum; and that David Limond Murdoch, Alexander Kennedy, James Williamson, and Robert Waterston, jointly, and each of them severally, shall be the Agents and Agent in Australia and New Zealand, for raising such sum of £250,000, and for signing and issuing such Debentures. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Defining a Naval Reserve in the Province of Auckland.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "Waste Lands Act 1858" it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time, and from time to time to except from sale and reserve to Her Majesty, or dispose of in such other manner as for the public interest may seem best, such of the Waste Lands of the Crown in any of the Provinces of New Zealand as may be required for the purpose of Military Defence, or for the construction of Trunk Lines of Road, or as sites for Public buildings for the use of the General Government, or for other purposes of public utility or convenience:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby except from sale, and reserve to the use of Her Majesty, for Naval purposes, the allotment or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto annexed.

And His Excellency the Governor doth hereby notify to the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, that the land defined in the Schedule hereto has been reserved in terms of the Act before cited.

SCHEDULE.

All that allotment or parcel of land situated in the parish of Takapuna, county of Eden, in the Province of Auckland, being allotment No. 22B or Section No. 2, and containing by admeasurement one (1) acre and eleven (11) perches, be the same more or less; bounded towards the North by a public road five hundred and eleven (511) links; towards the West by a public road four hundred and twenty one (421) links; and towards the South-east by a public road six hundred and sixty (660) links.

ORDER IN COUNCIL,

Establishing Regulations for the granting of Gold Mining Leases in the Province of Otago.

G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House, at Auckland, the 29th day of December, 1864.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the "Gold Fields Act, 1862," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make such Regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, as he shall think fit, for regulating the granting of Leases for mining purposes, and the terms and conditions on which such Leases shall be granted, and such Regulations from time to time to alter and abolish:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the Fifteenth day of September, 1863, certain Regulations were made for Gold Mining within the Otago Gold Fields, and it was thereby provided that applications might be made for Gold Mining Leases on the payment of a deposit of Twenty pounds (£20), and on the performance of certain things in the said Order set forth, such Leases might be granted as therein mentioned:

And whereas much inconvenience has arisen in consequence of persons making applications for leases and subsequently abandoning the same:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the said recited power and authority, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, make the following additional Rule for the granting of Leases for Gold Mining within the District of the Otago Gold Fields:—

"Out of the sum of twenty pounds (£20) deposited by any person making application for a Gold Mining Lease, shall be deducted the sum of five pounds (£5) in addition to the previously authorised costs and expenses, in case such person shall withdraw his application, or forfeit or abandon his claim, or within one month after notice by the Warden that the Lease is prepared, shall not accept the same."

And doth further declare that this Order shall take effect from the day of date hereof.

Costs of Management of the Auckland Gold Fields, to be regulated by Acts of Provincial Council.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the "Gold Fields' Act, 1862," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council by the said Act, except the powers conferred by Sections Nineteen, Thirty-one, Thirty-two, Thirty-three, and Sixty-one thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

And whereas it is further provided that whenever the Governor shall have delegated to the Superintendent of any Province all or any of the aforesaid powers, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to appoint and declare that all costs, charges, and expenses incident to the management and administration of the Gold Fields within such Province shall be regulated by Acts or Ordinances to be passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of such Province:

And whereas by an instrument in writing, of even date herewith, issued under the Seal of the Colony, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, and in exercise of the before recited power, hath delegated to

ROBERT GRAHAM, ESQUIRE,

as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the said Colony, all the aforesaid powers, excepting those before recited to be excepted, to hold and exercise the said powers within the Province of Auckland aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority for this purpose by the said Act conferred, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, appoint and declare that all the costs, charges, and expenses incident to the management and administration of the Gold Fields within the Province of Auckland, shall be regulated by Acts to be passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the said Province.

Delegation of the Governor's Powers, under the "Gold Fields' Act, 1862," to the Superintendent of Auckland.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, entitled "The Gold Fields' Act, 1862," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or in the Governor in Council by the said Act, except the powers conferred by Sections Nineteen, Thirty-one, Thirty-two, Thirty-three, and Sixty-one thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire,

as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland all the powers vested in me under or by virtue of the "Gold Fields' Act, 1862," except the powers contained in Sections Nineteen, Thirty-one, Thirty-two, Thirty-three, and Sixty-one of the said Act, to have, hold, and exercise within the Province of Auckland the said powers hereby given the said Robert Graham so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province and no longer:

Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the Delegation aforesaid, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the Sixty-third Clause of the "Gold Fields' Act, 1862."

Delegation of the Governor's powers under the "Gold Fields' Act, 1862," to the Superintendent of Auckland.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by section 19 of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields' Act, 1862," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold Field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens as Judges of such Courts, with power to act alone, or with Assessors or Juries, and in such

manner and to exercise all or any of the powers hereinafter mentioned as the Governor shall think fit to direct :

And whereas, by the 5th section of an Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Gold Fields' Act Amendment Act, 1863," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, and under such restrictions as he shall think fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by section 19 of the said Act, and to alter or revoke by said delegation.

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

ROBERT GRAHAM, Esquire, as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all the powers vested in me by the 19th section of the "Gold Fields' Act, 1862," to have, hold, and exercise within the Province of Auckland the said powers hereby given the said Robert Graham so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer, and to have, hold, and exercise such powers subject to the Regulations hereunder written namely:—

REGULATIONS.

All acts and appointments done and made by the said Superintendent under the foregoing Delegation shall be provisional until the same shall have been confirmed and allowed by the Governor; and the Governor shall have power to disallow the same.

The Superintendent shall report without delay to the Governor all such acts and appointments.

The Superintendent shall lay before the Provincial Council of the said Province every such act and appointment at the Session of the said Council next following.

The Provincial Council of the said Province may, through their Speaker, transmit to the Governor any resolutions respecting any such act or appointment.

Warrant appointing a Polling Place in Marlborough.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting :

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint Polling Places for each Electoral District within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the Principal Polling Place for the District, and all or any of such Polling Places at any time to abolish, and to appoint other Polling Places in lieu thereof. And whereas by another Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that,

subject to certain provisions therein contained, every Election of the Superintendent or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by "The Regulation of Elections Act 1858" aforesaid, and all the provisions of the said last mentioned Act shall apply to the Elections of Members of Provincial Councils.

Now know ye, that I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Acts, do hereby appoint the following places to be Polling Places for the District of Tua Marina, for the Election of Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Marlborough, namely—
