HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Supreme Court Act 1860," it is provided that "there shall be held Circuit Courts for the dispatch of civil and criminal business of the Court before one of the

Judges thereof, at such places and times as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby fix and appoint that a Circuit Court shall be held at New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki, in the Northern District of the said Colony, on Tuesday the thirty-first instant, or so soon after as may be convenient, for the dispatch of Criminal business; and on Friday, the third day of February next, or so soon after as may be convenient, for the dispatch of Civil business of the Court, before the Judge thereof to whom the said District has been assigned. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intitutled "The Militia Act 1858," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Militia Districts, and such Districts from time to time to vary, and to designate the Militia of any such Districts by the name of a Regiment, Battalion,

Corps, or Company:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the above power, doth by this present Order constitute the following several Milltia Districts, to be called and known by the names fol-

lowing, viz. :

THE OAMARU DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Waitaki River; towards the East by the Ocean; towards the South by the Southern Boundary Line of Blocks 3, 5, and 8 Otepopo Survey District, and the said line extended in an easterly direction until it intersects the circumference of a circle whose radius is fifteen miles in length, and

centre the south-west corner of Block 2 Oamaru Survey District; and towards the West, by the circumference of the said circle.

THE WAIKOUAITI DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Oamaru Militia District; towards the East by the Ocean; towards the South by a line extending from Brinn's Point in a north-westerly direction until it intersects the circumference of a circle whose radius is fifteen miles in length, and centre the southwest corner of Block 9 Moeraki Survey District; and towards the West by the circumference of the said circle.

THE DUNEDIN MILITIA DISTRICT.

The boundaries of the Dunedin Militia District, as amended, now comprise all that area bounded towards the North by the Waikouaiti Militia District; towards the East by the Ocean; and towards the South and West by the circumference of a circle whose radius is twenty miles in length, and centre the Police-Office in the Town of Dunedin.

Ordering issue of Crown Grants to certain Natives. G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House, at Auckland, this 13th day of January, 1865.

Present :-

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.
WHEREAS, by "The Crown Grants Act (No. 2) 1862," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time to fulfil any contract, promise or engagement heretofore made with or to any of the Native Inhabitants of New Zealand by or on behalf of Her Majesty, whether there is evidence in writing or not of such contract, or promise, or engagement, with respect to any Land ceded by such Netices to Her Majesty on the faith of such contract. Natives to Her Majesty on the faith of such contract, or promise, or engagement, on the Governor in Council being satisfied with the evidence produced on behalf of such contract, or promise, or engagement: And whereas certain of the Native Inhabitants of New Zealand, residing within the Province of Nelson, have at various times ceded Lands to the Crown, and the Officers negociating on behalf of Her Majesty for the cession of such Lands have made promises or engagements that Crown Grants should be issued for certain Lands held by Natives within the said Province: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of his Executive Council, and in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the said in part recited Act, being satisfied with the evidence which has been produced on behalf of such contract, promise, or engagement, doth hereby Order that Crown Grants shall be issued for the pieces or parcels of Land which are described in the Schedule hereunto annexed. A PROCLAMATION

Extending the power of Franking.

By His Excellency Sir George Grev, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Post Office Act, 1858, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the New Zealand Gazette, to fix, alter, and abolish the Rates of Postage at any time payable within the Colony for the transmission of letters and newspapers by post, either between places within New Zealand or to and from places beyond seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Twenty-ninth day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty, certain rates of postage were fixed for the transmission of letters in manner afore-

said:

And whereas by Proclamations, dated respectively the Fourth day of February and the Twelfth day of February, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty Two, all letters and packets on the public service of of the Colony, addressed and marked as therein provided, were exempted from the operation of the said Proclamation of the Twenty-ninth December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the Twenty-ninth day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-four, all letters and packets on the public service of the Colony of New Zealand, addressed to certain officers therein named, and marked as therein provided, were declared to be exempt from the payment of postage; and such officers were thereby authorized to Frank official letters and packets, provided that the same be enletters and packets, provided that the same be endorsed as "On the Public Service only":

And whereas it is expedient further to extend

such exemption and privilege:

Now therefore I, the Governor, in further pursuance of the said recited power and authority, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that no postage shall be payable for transmission by Post of letters or packets on the public service, and so marked which shall be addressed to or be franked as aforesaid, by the following Officers, namely:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, in further exercise of the said power and authority, do hereby appoint that there shall be borrowed and raised under the authority of the said Act the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Pounds, the residue of the said sum of One Million Pounds sterling; and that the same shall be raised by Debentures, in the form hereunder written, in sums of not less in amount than Twenty Pounds nor sums of not less in amount than Twenty Pounds nor more than One Thousand Pounds, at the discretion of the Agent or Agents; and that the same shall bear interest at the rate of Eight Pounds per centum per annum; and that Frederick Aloysius Weld, William Fitzherbert, Henry Sewell, John Larkins Cheese Richardson, Walter Baldock Durrant Mantell, and Henry Albert Athingan in the same ask of the contraction. THE following Rules are published for the information of persons entitled to Pensions, under the Regulations of the 17th November last for granting Pensions to persons discharged from the Militia

Rules relative to the payment of Pensions under the "Militia Acts Amendment Act, 1862."

- 1. In every instance of a Pension being granted to a man belonging to any of the Militia Regiments or Volunteer Corps, the same will be notified to the Sub-Treasurer of the Province where the Pensioner resides.
- 2. The notification to the Sub-Treasurer will be accompanied by a Certificate containing, among other particulars, a description of the Pensioner.
- 3. The Pensions will be paid quarterly at the Colonial Treasury, or at the Sub-Treasury of the Province in which the Pensioner resides.
- 4. Any Pensioner is at liberty to remove to any Province in the Colony, at his discretion; but he must bear in mind, if he does so without first apprising the Treasurer of the Province in which he resides of his intention, and signing a Transfer Certificate, no provision can be made for paying him in the Province to which he may
