ORDER IN COUNCIL

Appointing a Circuit Court to be held in New Plymouth.

G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House, at Auckland, on the 13th day of January, 1865.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Supreme Court Act 1860," it is provided that "there shall be held Circuit Courts for the dispatch of civil and criminal business of the Court before one of the Judges thereof, at such places and times as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby fix and appoint that a Circuit Court shall be held at New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki, in the Northern District of the said Colony, on Tuesday the thirty-first instant, or so soon after as may be convenient, for the dispatch of Criminal business; and on Friday, the third day of February next, or so soon after as may be convenient, for the dispatch of Civil business of the Court, before the Judge thereof to whom the said District has been assigned.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Constituting Oamaru and Waikouaiti Militia Districts, and altering the Northern Boundary of the Dunedin Militia District, in the Province of Otago.

G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House at Auckland, on the 6th day of January, 1865.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Militia Act 1858," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Militia Districts, and such Districts from time to time to vary, and to designate the Militia of any such Districts by the name of a Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Company:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the above power, doth by this present Order constitute the following several Militia Districts, to be called and known by the names following, viz:—

THE OAMARU DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Waitaki River; towards the East by the Ocean; towards the South by the Southern Boundary Line of Blocks 3, 5, and 8 Otepopo Survey District, and the said line extended in an easterly direction until it intersects the circumference of a circle whose radius is fifteen miles in length, and

centre the south-west corner of Block 2 Oamaru Survey District; and towards the West, by the circumference of the said circle.

THE WAIKOUAITI DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Oamaru Militia District; towards the East by the Ocean; towards the South by a line extending from Brinn's Point in a north-westerly direction until it intersects the circumference of a circle whose radius is fifteen miles in length, and centre the south-west corner of Block 9 Moeraki Survey District; and towards the West by the circumference of the said circle.

THE DUNEDIN MILITIA DISTRICT.

The boundaries of the Dunedin Militia District, as amended, now comprise all that area bounded towards the North by the Waikouaiti Militia District; towards the East by the Ocean; and towards the South and West by the circumference of a circle whose radius is twenty miles in length, and centre the Police-Office in the Town of Dunedin.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Ordering issue of Crown Grants to certain Natives.

G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House, at Auckland, this 13th day of January, 1865.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, by "The Crown Grants Act (No. 2) 1862," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time to fulfil any contract, promise or engagement heretofore made with or to any of the Native Inhabitants of New Zealand by or on behalf of Her Majesty, whether there is evidence in writing or not of such contract, or promise, or engagement, with respect to any Land ceded by such Natives to Her Majesty on the faith of such contract, or promise, or engagement, on the Governor in Council being satisfied with the evidence produced on behalf of such contract, or promise, or engagement: And whereas certain of the Native Inhabitants of New Zealand, residing within the Province of Nelson, have at various times ceded Lands to the Crown, and the Officers negotiating on behalf of Her Majesty for the cession of such Lands have made promises or engagements that Crown Grants should be issued for certain Lands held by Natives within the said Province: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of his Executive Council, and in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the said in part recited Act, being satisfied with the evidence which has been produced on behalf of such contract, promise, or engagement, doth hereby Order that Crown Grants shall be issued for the pieces or parcels of Land which are described in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

A PROCLAMATION

Extending the power of Franking.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Post Office Act, 1858, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix, alter, and abolish the Rates of Postage at any time payable within the Colony for the transmission of letters and newspapers by post, either between places within New Zealand or to and from places beyond seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Twentieth day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty, certain rates of postage were fixed for the transmission of letters in manner aforesaid:

And whereas by Proclamations, dated respectively the Fourth day of February and the Twelfth day of February, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty Two, all letters and packets on the public service of the Colony, addressed and marked as therein provided, were exempted from the operation of the said Proclamation of the Twentieth day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the Twentieth day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-four, all letters and packets on the public service of the Colony of New Zealand, addressed to certain officers therein named, and marked as therein provided, were declared to be exempt from the payment of postage; and such officers were thereby authorized to Frank official letters and packets, provided that the same be endorsed as "On the Public Service only":

And whereas it is expedient further to extend such exemption and privilege:

Now therefore I, the Governor, in further pursuance of the said recited power and authority, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that no postage shall be payable for transmission by Post of letters or packets on the public service, and so marked which shall be addressed to or be franked as aforesaid, by the following Officers, namely:

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

Warrant authorising the issue of Debentures under the "New Zealand Debentures Act, 1864."

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Debentures Act, 1864," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New Zealand to borrow any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of One Million Pounds, in anticipation of the loan of Three Million Pounds authorised to be borrowed under the provisions of the "New Zealand Loan Act, 1863," and to take up the same on Debentures from time to time as he may deem expedient: And it is further enacted that every such Debenture shall be in such form and for such sum, and shall be signed and issued by such Agent or Agents, as the Governor shall appoint: And whereas by a Warrant under his hand, dated the second day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, His Excellency the Governor did appoint Falconer Larkworthy, Robert Porter, and William Smellie Grahame, jointly, and each of them severally, to be Agents and Agent in England for raising the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, part of the said sum of One Million Pounds authorised to be raised as aforesaid, and for signing and issuing Debentures under the provisions of the said recited Act: And whereas by a further Warrant

under his hand, dated the second day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, His Excellency the Governor did appoint David Limond Murdoch, Alexander Kennedy, James Williamson, and Robert Waterston, jointly, and each of them severally, to be Agents and Agent in Australia and New Zealand for raising the further sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Pounds, part of the said sum of One Million Pounds authorised to be raised as aforesaid, and for signing and issuing Debentures under the provisions of the said recited Act:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, in further exercise of the said power and authority, do hereby appoint that there shall be borrowed and raised under the authority of the said Act the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Pounds, the residue of the said sum of One Million Pounds sterling; and that the same shall be raised by Debentures, in the form hereunder written, in sums of not less in amount than Twenty Pounds nor more than One Thousand Pounds, at the discretion of the Agent or Agents; and that the same shall bear interest at the rate of Eight Pounds per centum per annum; and that Frederick Aloysius Weld, William Fitzherbert, Henry Sewell, John Larkins Cheese Richardson, Walter Baldock Durrant Mantell, and Harry Albert Atkinson, jointly, and each of them severally, shall be the Agents and Agent in New Zealand for raising such sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Pounds, and for signing and issuing such Debentures. And I do hereby direct that Coupons in the form hereunder written may be appended to the said Debentures or not, as such Agents or Agent in their or his discretion shall think fit. And I do direct that such Agents or Agent shall have all the powers under the said Act in reference to the raising the said sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Pounds.

Rules relating to payment of Militia Pensions.

THE following Rules are published for the information of persons entitled to Pensions, under the Regulations of the 17th November last for granting Pensions to persons discharged from the Militia Service.

H. A. ATKINSON.

Rules relative to the payment of Pensions under the "Militia Acts Amendment Act, 1862."

1. In every instance of a Pension being granted to a man belonging to any of the Militia Regiments or Volunteer Corps, the same will be notified to the Sub-Treasurer of the Province where the Pensioner resides.
2. The notification to the Sub-Treasurer will be accompanied by a Certificate containing, among other particulars, a description of the Pensioner.
3. The Pensions will be paid quarterly at the Colonial Treasury, or at the Sub-Treasury of the Province in which the Pensioner resides.
4. Any Pensioner is at liberty to remove to any Province in the Colony, at his discretion; but he must bear in mind, if he does so without first apprising the Treasurer of the Province in which he resides of his intention, and signing a Transfer Certificate, no provision can be made for paying him in the Province to which he may remove.
