Proclamation Revoking a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of December, 1864, Fixing Rate of Postage on Newspapers.

By His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the power and authority in me vested under section 8 of the "New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," I, SIR GEORGE GREY, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, do hereby revoke a Proclamation dated at Government House at Auckland, the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, fixing Rate of Postage on Newspapers, and do hereby proclaim and declare the rate of postage thereby fixed for the transmission of Newspapers by post to be and the same is hereby abolished.

And I do further declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

A Proclamation Disallowing certain Canterbury Ordinances.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over her Majesty's Colony of

New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c.

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent, as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor, at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill, and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas the Ordinances hereinafter specified have been enacted by the Superintendent of Canterbury, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Ordinances were received by the Governor on the twentieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinances should be disallowed.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Ordinances passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, viz. :—

"The Wilson Mill Dam Ordinance, No. 1, 1864."
"The Wilson Mill Dam Ordinance, No. 2, 1864."

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Appointing a Special Circuit of the Supreme Court to be held at Invercargill.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is provided that "there shall be held Circuit Courts for the dispatch of Civil and Criminal Business of the Court before one of the Judges thereof, at such places and times as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint."

And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, Circuit Courts were appointed to be held at the Town of Invercargill, in the Province of Southland, on the days therein specified.

And whereas it is expedient to alter the time at which the next Circuit Court shall be held at the place aforesaid.

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby fix and appoint that a Circuit Court shall be held at Invercargill aforesaid, on Tuesday the second day of May next, or as soon after as may be convenient for the dispatch of Civil and Criminal business, instead of on the twelfth day of April next as in the said Proclamation contained.

Regulations.

There shall be only one copy of each of the said Stamps for stamping Coupons under the Coupons Act 1864, in the Province of Canterbury, which Stamps shall be kept in the custody of the Provincial Treasurer of the Province of Canterbury in a strong box having two keys. One thereof to be in the keeping of the Colonial Treasurer, or of the Colonial Sub-Treasurer at Canterbury, and the other in the keeping of the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury. The Stamps shall only be delivered out to the Superintendent upon his requisition in writing, for the purpose of stamping a certain number of Coupons mentioned in such requisition, and shall be returned by the Superintendent to the above custody immediately after having been so used. No Debentures or Coupons shall be stamped with such stamps, nor shall

they be in any way used except in the presence of the Superintendent or the Provincial Secretary, or some person or persons to be appointed in writing for that purpose by the Superintendent.

Such appointed person shall keep an account of the number of Debentures and Coupons stamped, and shall not suffer the Stamps to be used after the number or amount of Debentures from time to time authorised by law shall have been stamped, nor otherwise than for the purpose of stamping such Coupons.

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the same;

Now know ye, that I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the

said Act, do hereby abolish the above named Polling Places for the District of the Gold Fields for the election of Members of the House of Representatives, and do appoint in lieu thereof:

The Court House,—Clyde Lawrence, Queenstown, Waitahuna, Waipori, Mt. Benger.

The Court House—Arrow, Alexander, Hamilton, Mt. Ida, Maori Point, Hindow, Cromwell.

The Camp,—Dunstan Creek, Nokomai, Cardona, Nevis, Hyde, Blackstone Hill.

The School House, North, Dunedin.

WHEREAS by the "New Zealand Loan Act, 1863," authority is given for the borrowing and raising of sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of £3,000,000, and it is provided that for the purpose of creating a sinking fund for the liquidation of the principal monies so raised there shall be paid yearly out of the ordinary revenue of the Colony to such persons as the Governor shall appoint, such sum as shall be equal to one per cent. per annum on the total of the said principal from time to time borrowed, which sum shall be set apart as a sinking fund and shall be invested by such person or persons in such manner as the Governor shall from time to time direct.

Now, therefore, I, SIR GEORGE GREY, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and execution of the said Act, do hereby appoint

PENROSE GOODCHILD JULYAN and
WILLIAM CHARLES SARGEANT

to be the persons who shall receive the said sinking fund as aforesaid, and the persons who shall invest the same in manner set forth in the said recited Act.
