ORDER IN COUNCIL

Delegating certain powers in respect of Native Reserves at Dunedin and Port Chalmers, to A. R. C. Strode, Esq.

Present—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Native Reserves Amendment Act, 1862" it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council from time to time delegate all or any of the powers competent to the Commissioners appointed under "The New Zealand Native Reserves Act 1856" unto any person or persons for any period and subject to such regulations and restrictions or stipulations as may be specified in such Order, and every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony doth hereby delegate unto Alfred Rowland Chetham Strode, of Dunedin, in the Province of Otago, Esquire, all of the powers competent to be exercised by Commissioners appointed under "The New Zealand Native Reserves Act, 1856" in respect of the Native Reserves set apart within the Towns of Dunedin and Port Chalmers in the said Province, subject to such regulations, restrictions or stipulations, as His Excellency the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council issue in that behalf.

Notifications to Claimants for Compensation under authority of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863."

WHEREAS by Orders in Council made under the authority of Sections 3 and 4 of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," His Excellency the Governor has declared that certain lands belonging to Rebellious Tribes, were required for the purposes of the said Act, and were subject to the provisions thereof: And whereas it is provided by the said Act that compensation shall be granted to all persons who shall have any title, interest, or claim to any Land taken under the said Act, provided always that no compensation shall be granted to any of the persons following—that is to say,

(1.) Who shall, since the 1st of January, 1863, have been engaged in levying or making war, or carrying arms against Her Majesty the Queen, or Her Majesty's Forces in New Zealand; or

(2.) Who shall have adhered to, or aided, assisted, or comforted, any such persons as aforesaid, or

(3.) Who shall have counselled, advised, induced, enticed, persuaded, or conspired with any other person to make or levy war against Her Majesty, or to carry arms against Her Majesty's Forces in New Zealand, or to join with or assist any such persons as are before mentioned in sub-sections (1) and (2); or,

(4.) Who, in furtherance or in execution of the designs of any such persons as aforesaid, shall have been, either as principal or accessory, concerned in any outrage against person or property; or

(4.) Who, on being required by the Governor, by Proclamation to that effect in the Government Gazette, to deliver up the arms in their possession, shall refuse or neglect to comply with such demand after a certain day to be specified in such Proclamation.

And it is further provided that compensation shall be granted according to the nature of the title, interest, or claim of the person requiring compensation, and according to the value thereof: Provided always that no claim shall be entertained unless the same shall have been

preferred in writing to the Colonial Secretary by the Claimant, if residing in the Colony, within six months, and if not residing within the Colony then within eighteen months, after the Land in respect of which the claim is made has been proclaimed under Section 4 as required for the purposes of this Act.

Now, therefore, it is hereby notified, that such claims for compensation arising prior to the taking of any of the Lands comprised within the limits referred to in the said Orders in Council, and hereunder described or referred to, shall be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, addressed to him at Wellington, within the periods respectively prescribed, as before mentioned.

SCHEDULE.

East Wairoa Block.

All that land known as East Wairoa Block, bounded on the North by the Wairoa River and the Northern boundary of the lands intended to be confiscated, as set forth in the Proclamation of 17th December, 1864; on the East by the Eastern boundary of such confiscated lands; on the South by the Mangatawhiri River, from the Surry Redoubt to the Eastern boundary of the Pokeno Block, as described in the Proclamation of the 29th December, 1864; and on the West by the said Pokeno Block.

SCHEDULE.

West Pukekohe Block.

All that land known as the West Pukekohe Block, supposed to contain 1133 acres; Bounded on the North by lot No. 38, Parish of Pukekohe, 7,100 links; on the East, by the Pukekohe Native Reserve, 30,084 links; on the South by lot 44, Parish of Pukekohe, 2,160 links; and on the West by lot No. 78, Parish of Pune, 2,640 links, and 4,660 links, and by a road 28,030 links to commencing point.

SCHEDULE.

Middle Taranaki.

All that Block of land at Taranaki, bounded on the North and West by the Sea, on the East by the Waitara river from its mouth to the junction of the Manganui river, and by the Manganui from the Waitara to the crossing place of the Kairoa and Waimate road, thence by the South of the said road to its junction with the Wanganui and Taranaki coast road, and thence by a straight line from the said junction of roads to the sea at its nearest point.

Excepting all lands within the said boundaries held under Grant from the Crown.

SIR,—I have the honor to report for the information of the Lieutenant-General Commanding, that, agreeably with his orders, the Field Force under my command moved out from our position on the Patea river at 7 a.m., on the 13th instant, with the object of advancing to this village. After advancing some three miles the right flank of our line of march was commanded by a range of hills, affording a very strong position, which the enemy did not fail to occupy and from which they opened fire. The advance guard, composed of the 57th Regt., under command of Major Butler, then changed direction to the right, and supported by a portion of the 68th Regt., commanded by Lieut.-Colonel Morant, and a company of the 50th Regt., in charge of Captain Johnson (the remainder of the Regt., under command of Major Lock, being held in reserve) advanced upon the enemy and drove them from their position, after a stout resistance, while a few rounds were fired, under the direction of Lieut.-Colonel Williams, from the Armstrong guns.

During the whole of the skirmish the Mounted Military Train and the few Wanganui Defence Corps attached to them, under the command of Captain Witchell, were to be seen with the advance availing themselves of all ground that admitted of their closing with the enemy.

A company of the 57th Regt., with Captain Sir Robert Douglas, followed up a portion of the enemy on the extreme right, along a range of hills overhanging the river, which separated them from the main body, and I was much pleased in watching the way in which he worked his men.

I beg to bring the name of Sergeant O'Connor, 57th Regt., to the Lieutenant General's notice

as being conspicuous for his soldierlike bearing under my own observation.

I need not call the attention of the Lieut-General to Major Greaves, D.A.Q.M. General to the Field Force, who is so conspicuous on all occasions for his energy and daring, but I feel it my duty to record my thanks to him, as also to Captain Leech, D.A.A. General, for their assistance.

I cannot conclude without recording the debt we all owe to Staff Field Surgeon Home, whose anxiety to be ready to aid any wounded led him to be always up with the advance, and I know that his kind attention and sympathy to the wounded during this campaign is much felt by the soldiers.

I estimate the loss to the enemy at 40 killed.
