ORDER IN COUNCIL,

*Appointing Regulations for the Native District of
 "Wharekauri," Chatham Islands.*

G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House, at Wellington, on the
 twenty-eighth day of June, 1865.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled, "The Native Districts Regulation Act, 1858," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint Districts for the purposes of the said Act, being districts over which the Native Title shall not for the time being have been extinguished; And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the District of Wharekauri was appointed for the purposes of the said Act; And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to make and put in force within any such district, Regulations (among other things) for the branding or marking of Cattle, in order to the proof of the ownership thereof, and for the prevention of fraud in relation to the branding or marking of cattle, and for the prevention of larceny of cattle, or of the flesh, hides, or skins thereof, and for the suppression of the nuisance of dogs wandering at large, and for defining and prescribing the rights, duties and liabilities of the owners of dogs, and of all other persons, in relation to dogs wandering at large, and that it shall be lawful by any such regulation to impose penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach or non-observance of any such regulation, and that all such regulations shall be made as far as possible with the general assent of the Native population affected thereby, to be ascertained in such manner as the Governor may deem fitting; And whereas it is expedient to make and put in force the following regulations relating to the branding of cattle and the suppression of the nuisance of dogs within the district aforesaid:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby make and put in force within the said District of Wharekauri, the following regulations, that is to say—

1. All horses, cattle, and sheep to be branded before attaining the age of one year. All unbranded at the expiration of that period to become the property of the public.

2. A register of all brands shall be kept, the fee for registry to be two shillings and sixpence sterling (2s. 6d.)
3. All persons now in possession of brands shall register the same before the first of June next.
4. All persons not now in possession of brands shall register the same on or before the first of April, 1867.
5. All horses, cattle, and sheep, above the age of one year, found unbranded after the first of April, 1867, shall become the property of the public.
6. Any person convicted of defacing the brand on any animal, shall suffer a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds sterling.
7. No stranger, whether White man or Maori, shall shoot or destroy cattle without the consent of the Native assessor of the village.
8. The books of registry of brands and the moneys resulting therefrom, shall be kept in the hands of the persons appointed for each district and presented to the Runanga at each meeting.

The persons appointed for each district are—
 Tangari Te Umu, for Waitanga, and Pamariki
 Raumori, for Kaingaroa.

- (1.) All dogs to be registered in a book kept for that purpose before the expiration of one year of age.
- (2.) The fee for registry for each dog shall be five shillings (5s.)
- (3.) All dogs shall be kept tied with a chain or rope.
- (4.) All dogs wandering at large shall be seized by the constable, to whom payment shall be made by the owner of Two shillings. Should the owner refuse to pay the dog to be destroyed.
- (5.) For all property destroyed by dogs a fair compensation shall be paid.
- (6.) All dogs found chasing or worrying sheep, cattle, pigs, and poultry, may be destroyed by the owners of the same whether the dog is registered or not.
- (7.) All dogs wandering on a sheep run only may be destroyed whether registered or not.
- (8.) All registers and fees arising therefrom shall be in the charge of the constable of each village, and shall be presented to the Runanga at each meeting.

And doth hereby order and appoint that this Order shall take effect from and after the twenty-eighth day of June, 1865.

ORDER IN COUNCIL,

Directing investment by Trustees of sums held by them for the purposes of a sinking fund under "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861," "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861-2," and "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1862."

At the Government House, at Wellington, the twenty-eighth day of June, 1865.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861," passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, provision was made for raising a loan of Fifty thousand pounds, for the public service of the said Province and for the liquidation of its public debt;

And whereas by "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861-2," provision was made for the appointment by the Governor of Trustees for receiving such sums as by the said Ordinance are required to be paid to them;

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Ordinance it is further provided that every sum so paid should be invested on the security of debentures issued by the General Government, or otherwise as His Excellency the Governor and the Superintendent should direct;

And whereas by "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1862," provision was made for raising a loan of Five hundred thousand pounds for the public service of the Province of Otago, and for providing a sinking fund for the liquidation thereof;

And whereas by the said Ordinance it was provided that certain sums should be from time to time paid to two trustees, to be from time to time appointed by His Excellency the Governor, for the purpose of forming a sinking fund as aforesaid.

And whereas by the same Ordinance it was further provided that every sum so paid should be invested on the security of debentures issued by the General Government, or otherwise as His Excellency the Governor and the Superintendent should direct;

And whereas Alfred Rowland Chetham Strode, of Dunedin, and John Jones, of Waikouaiti, have been duly appointed trustees under and by virtue of the powers in the said respective Ordinances in that behalf contained;

And whereas the said Trustees have received and now hold for the purposes of the said sinking funds by the said respective Ordinances provided for certain sums as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, for the purposes of "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861," and "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861-2," the sum of One thousand seven hundred and twenty-one pounds eleven shillings, and for the purposes of "The Otago Loan Ordinance, 1862," the sum of Ten thousand two hundred and seventy-five pounds.

And whereas it is expedient that the said sums of One thousand seven hundred and twenty-one pounds eleven shillings, and Ten thousand two hundred and seventy-five pounds, should be respectively invested on the security of debentures issued by the General Government:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power vested in him by the said recited Ordinances doth hereby with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, order and direct that the said sums of One thousand seven hundred and twenty-one pounds eleven shillings, and Ten thousand two hundred and seventy-five pounds, respectively, shall be invested on the security of debentures issued by the General Government.
