**PROCLAMATION**

*Defining Judicial Districts under "The Supreme Court Act, 1860."*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to divide the Colony into Judicial Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the said Colony was for the purposes of the said Act divided into three districts, to be called severally the Northern District, the Middle District, and the Southern District, which said districts are particularly described in the said Proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the said Southern District was for the purposes of the said Act further divided into two districts, to be called respectively the Canterbury District, and the Otago and Southland District, which said districts are particularly described in the said Proclamation; and whereas it is expedient that a new district under the said Act should be formed out of portions of the said Middle and Canterbury Districts: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council shall assign every such district as aforesaid to a Judge or Judges of the Court, who shall have within the same all the powers and jurisdiction thereby given to the Courts: And whereas by the said Proclamations of the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the said Middle and

Canterbury Districts were respectively assigned to ALEXANDER JAMES JOHNSTON and HENRY BARNES GRESSON, Esquires, Judges of the said Courts: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that there shall be held Circuit Courts for the dispatch of civil and criminal business of the Court before one of the Judges thereof at such places and times as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint: And whereas by the said recited Proclamations certain times and places were appointed for holding Circuit Courts as aforesaid within the said Middle and Canterbury Districts respectively:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power for this purpose vested in me under or by virtue of the said Act, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, proclaim and declare that all that portion of the Colony comprised within the following limits, viz.:—from the mouth of the River Awarua, at the western extremity of the boundary of the Provinces of Otago and Canterbury, northwards along the sea-coast to the Five Fingers Rocks between the Rivers Grey and Buller, thence eastward to the summit of Mount Faraday, thence along the watershed between the tributaries of the said Rivers Grey and Buller, thence southward along the watershed between the east and west coast of the Provinces of Nelson and Canterbury to the point where it intersects the said boundary of the Provinces of Otago and Canterbury, thence westward along the said boundary to the commencing point at the mouth of the River Awarua, shall be and the same is hereby constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be called the "Westland District;" and that all that portion of the Colony comprised within the "Middle District," as constituted by the said Proclamation of the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, save and excepting such portion thereof as is hereby included in the Westland District shall be and the same is hereby constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act and be called the "Middle District;" and that all that portion of the Colony comprised

within the Canterbury District, as constituted by the said Proclamation of the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, save and excepting such portion thereof as is hereby included within the Westland District, shall be and the same is hereby constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act and be called the "Canterbury District." And in further pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, I do hereby, with the advice and consent aforesaid, proclaim and declare that I assign the said Westland and Canterbury Districts to HENRY BARNES GRESSON, and the said Middle District to ALEXANDER JAMES JOHNSTON, Esquires, respectively, Judges of the said Court, and that Circuit Courts shall be holden for the Middle and Canterbury Districts at the times and places heretofore appointed, and for the Westland District at the town of Hokitika in every year, on the fifteenth day of January and the fifteenth day of July, or as soon after the said days respectively as conveniently may be, and in case any one of the said days so fixed as aforesaid shall happen to be a Sunday or holiday, then the Court appointed for such day shall be holden on the day following.

#### A PROCLAMATION

##### *Appointing a District for the formation of Jury Lists.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed by the Governor and Legislative Council of New Zealand (Session II., No. 3), intituled "An Ordinance to regulate the constitution of Juries;" and a further Ordinance was passed by the Governor and the said Council (Session III., No. 2), intituled "An Ordinance to make temporary provision for the constitution of Juries;" and whereas it is enacted by "The Jury Law Amendment Act, 1862," that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Colony, define the limits of Districts for the formation of Jury Lists under the said Ordinances:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested by the said recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare the place within the following limits in the Province of Canterbury to be a District for the formation of Jury Lists under the said recited Ordinances, viz.:—A radius of twenty miles round the town of Hokitika.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint polling places for each electoral district within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the principal polling place for the district, and all or any of such polling places at any time to abolish, and to appoint other polling places in lieu thereof. And whereas by another Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that, subject to certain provisions therein contained, every election of the Superintendent or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," aforesaid, and all the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act shall apply to the elections of Superintendents and Members of Provincial Councils:

FOR TOWN OF ONEHUNGA—Court House, Queen Street, Auckland.

FOR THE NORTHERN DIVISION—Post Office, Waiwera.

TO THEIR HONORS THE SUPERINTENDENTS FOR THE TIME BEING OF THE PROVINCES IN THE COLONY OF NEW ZEALAND, GREETING:

WHEREAS it has been proposed that an International Exhibition of Works of Industry and Art should be held in Bombay, which Exhibition it is proposed should be opened on the fourth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

And whereas it has been proposed that a similar Exhibition should be held in Paris in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

And whereas it has been proposed that a similar Exhibition should be held in Melbourne in the early part of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

And I do hereby further authorize you respectively to appoint in the several Provinces of which you are Superintendents, local Committees of such persons as each of you may consider it expedient to appoint for the purpose of encouraging the production of articles to be exhibited.

And I do hereby further authorize you respectively to conduct communication between the Exhibitors and the Commissioners of the several aforesaid proposed Exhibitions.

And I do hereby give and grant you the said Commission, and each of you, power and authority by all lawful means and ways whatsoever to carry out all matters and things tending to the completion of the object of this Commission.

Box No. 1 is provided with a water gauge at the head, and with three feet of perforated iron plate at lower end, under which perforated plate I use another plate with smaller holes.

Box No. 2 is provided with perforated plates for its whole length with baize underneath; the second perforated plate about two feet long, under that plate a smaller perforated plate with one ripple.

Box No. 3 has a grooved bottom, and is provided with three discharging double-perforated plates, three ripples, and two regulating ripples.

Box No. 4 is a dividing box, grooved and provided with copper plates on bottom, with divider at the fork, and perforated plate on top with divider; also, one regulating ripple at A, baize at B, with perforated plate.

Box No. 5 is provided with copper plates for its whole length, which copper plates are dished slightly in the middle; it is also provided towards its lower end with an amalgamating cylinder, revolving in a concentric dip in a sheet iron bottom plate, and driven by water-wheel at head of box; also, two grooved ripples below copper towards the lower end of box.

Box No. 6 has got baize or bullock's hide at top, then copper dip, below that sheet iron, cylinder revolving in concentric dip in sheet iron bottom plate, and driven by water-wheel at head of box, same as No. 5 box, over the baize a perforated plate, over cylinder plain plates.

What I claim is the principle of dividing the fine dirt from the coarse, discharging, separating, and amalgamating set of sluicing boxes by one head of water passing through them.
