A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates' Criminal Jurisdiction Extension and Amendment Act, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, at any time to suspend the operation of the second and third sections of "The Resident Magistrates' Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1862," with respect to any Resident Magistrate's Court, provided always that such suspension shall not be held to prevent the issuing of warrants of distress or commitment, or otherwise enforcing due satisfaction of any judgment obtained in such Resident Magistrate's Court previous to such suspension. And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the first day of August then next ensuing was determined and declared to be the day on and from which the provisions of the said "Resident Magistrates' Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1862," and especially the powers conferred by sections two and three thereof, should be exercised to the limit of jurisdiction of fifty pounds in the Resident Magistrate's Court at Auckland, in the Province of Auckland: And whereas it is expedient to suspend the operation of the said second and third sections of the said Act with respect to the Resident Magistrate's Court at Auckland:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that the operation of the said second and third sections of "The Resident Magistrates' Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1862," shall be suspended with respect to the said Resident Magistrate's Court at Auckland, from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, now next ensuing.

- The Curator for Canterbury—Sub-Treasury, Christchurch.
- The Curator for Nelson—Sub-Treasury, Nelson.
- The Curator for Hawke's Bay—Sub-Treasury, Napier.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the sixteenth day of June, 1866.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time to make regulations for the practice and procedure of the Compensation Courts, and of arbitrations, umpirages, and appeals, under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," "The New Zealand Settlements Act Amendment Act, 1864," and the said "New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," and for establishing scales of fees in relation to all such proceedings; and may from time to time rescind, alter, and amend such regulations:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the said power in him vested for this purpose, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, make and put in force the following rules and regulations for the practice and procedure of the Compensation Courts, and of arbitrations, umpirages, and appeals, under the said recited Acts:

Rules and Regulations for the practice and procedure of Compensation Courts, established under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865."

1. All rules and regulations heretofore made for the practice and procedure of Compensation Courts established under the said Acts are hereby rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

2. No Court shall be held until after two months notice of the intention to hold the same shall have been advertised in the General Government *Gazette*, and one or more newspapers of the Province wherein the Court is to be held.

3. In every case before the Court, the claimant shall be deemed the plaintiff, and the Crown the defendant, and either party may appear by counsel or duly authorized agent.

4. The practice and procedure of the Court, and of counsel and agents, shall be as nearly as possible similar to that of a Resident Magistrate's Court in civil cases.

5. On the application of either party for an adjournment for the purpose of procuring evidence, the Court shall grant an adjournment for the time applied for, or until the next sitting of the Court after the expiration of such time, provided the period of such adjournment do not exceed three months.

6. All evidence given in Court shall be taken down in writing, and a copy thereof, together with the particulars of judgment or award, shall be transmitted without delay to the Colonial Secretary.

7. Upon the application of either party, the Governor in Council may grant a re-hearing of any case, before any three Judges of the Court, provided that when possible two at least of the three Judges in such re-hearing shall not have sat upon the first hearing of the case.

8. The orders or certificates issued by the Court shall be in the forms set forth in Schedules A. B. and C. hereunto annexed.

9. In all cases where a certain amount of land is awarded in compensation, the land shall be selected by the person to whom such compensation shall have been awarded and the agent for the Crown: provided that if they do not agree upon such selection within six months from the date of award, the Court shall decide between the parties in such manner as to it shall seem meet.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Debtors and Creditors Act
 Amendment Act, 1865," it is provided that the
 Governor in Council, may from time to time, frame regu-
 lations for the conduct of business under "The Debtors
 and Creditors Act, 1862," or the said "Debtors and
 Creditors Act Amendment Act, 1865," by Registrars
 of the Supreme Court, sequestrators, trustees, inspec-
 tors, receivers, attorneys, and solicitors, agents,
 auctioneers, and other persons employed in the
 management or winding up of sequestered estates,
 and may impose penalties on persons disobeying such
 regulations not exceeding one hundred pounds for each
 offence; and all registrars, sequestrators, trustees,
 and inspectors, and all receivers, attorneys, solicitors,
 agents, and auctioneers, employed as aforesaid, shall
 be bound to do, observe, and perform all matters and
 things whatever enjoined and required by such regu-
 lations, and the Governor may from time to time
 rescind, alter, or vary any such regulations. And
 whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-
 third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and
 sixty-six, certain regulations were made and put in
 force for the conduct of business under "The Debtors
 and Creditors Act, 1862," and "The Debtors and
 Creditors Act Amendment Act, 1865:" And whereas
 it is expedient to vary Regulation number four of
 such Regulations, and the Schedule thereto:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by
 and with the advice and consent of the Executive
 Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance of
 the said power and authority vested in him for this
 purpose, vary the said Regulation number four, and
 declare, make, and put in force the following as such
 varied regulation, and the forms in the Schedule
 hereto to be the forms referred to in such amended
 regulation:—

"Every inspector shall keep a book of register as
 well as a book that shall show a statement of all
 receipts and expenditure relating to the several

estates under administration, which books shall be
 open during office hours for the inspection of any
 creditor who has proved his debt, and shall be in the
 forms 1 and 2 prescribed in the Schedule hereunto
 annexed."
