A PROCLAMATION

*For the Naturalization of certain Persons.*

**W**HEREAS by "The Naturalization Act, 1865," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been from such specified time, a natural-born subject of Her Majesty, within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed: Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act from the dates hereinafter specified, viz. :—

ELIZABETH FOSBINDER,

from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, native of Prussia, settler; residence, Gladstone, near Invercargill, in the Province of Southland.

ELIZABETH TABELING,

from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, native of Prussia, settler; residence, Gladstone, near Invercargill, in the Province of Southland.

BERNHARD EKENSTEEN,

from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, native of Sweden, merchant; residence, Invercargill, in the Province of Southland.

NATHAN GOLDWATER,

from the first day of December, one thousand eight

hundred and fifty-seven, native of Kollo, Russian Poland, storekeeper; residence, Auckland, in the Province of Auckland.

PHILIPPE AIME MARTIN,

from the twenty-ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, native of France, Roman Catholic priest; residence, Arrowtown, in the Province of Otago.

FRANCIS MALCON,

from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, native of Austria, settler; residence, Wellington, in the Province of Wellington.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public Seal of the Colony, from time to time, to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the Act now in recital, or by "The Gold Fields Act, 1862," or by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1863," except the powers conferred by sections nineteen, thirty-one, thirty-three, and sixty-one, of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1862," and sections nineteen and twenty-nine of the Act now in recital, subject or not

to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers: Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to revoke and annul any Proclamation or Regulation made by the Superintendent of any Province, in exercise of any power delegated to him by the Governor under the provisions of the Act now in recital, and from and after the publication of such Proclamation by the Governor, any such Proclamation or Regulation made by such Superintendent shall become absolutely void and of no effect:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE,  
as Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, all the powers vested in me, under or by virtue of the said "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," the said "Gold Fields Act, 1862," and the said "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1863," except the powers conferred by sections nineteen, thirty-one, thirty-three, and sixty-one, of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1862," and sections nineteen and twenty-nine of the said "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," to have, hold, and exercise, within the Province of Canterbury, the said powers hereby given to the said William Sefton Moorhouse, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the delegation aforesaid shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the sixty-third clause of "The Gold Fields Act, 1862."

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Grey, K.C.B., in exercise of the power and authority so vested in him as Governor as aforesaid, doth by this Order in Council delegate to

WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE,  
Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, so long and so long only as he shall continue to be such Superintendent, all the powers which by the said fourth section of the said Amendment Act the Governor in Council is authorized so to delegate.

*Ahuaturanga Block.*

These are the boundaries of the land starting from Te Weki and Rotopiko, on the Manuwatu River, and

going in a South-east direction across the Makurerua Swamp to Magawharawhara, and on up the slope of Arawaru on the Tararua range of hills. From this point the boundary follows the range of hills North-erly to the Apiti or gorge of the Manawatu, and thence goes along the Western slopes of the Ruahine range of hills to a gorge on the Pohaugina River, called Te Anaowiri, thence to the River Oroua to a place called Te Matoi, and thence follows the down-ward course of the Oroua River to a place called Te Rua Puha, about ten miles by the winding river course above Te Awahuri, the highest Native Settle-ment, where the Rangitikei and Ahuriri path crosses.

From Te Rua Puha the line strikes inland in a Southerly direction to Waikuku, and on by Te Waiti and Te Puka to the starting point at Te Weki, on the River Manawatu.
