To wit.

PROCLAMATION

BY SIR DOMINICK DALY, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Province of South Australia, and the Dependencies thereof, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

(L.S.) D. DALY.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of South Australia, passed in a Session held in the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, No. 12, intituled "An Act to enable the Governor to prevent the importation of Cattle into South Australia under certain circumstances, and for other purposes," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette*, to prohibit the introduction or importation of any cattle or any particular description of cattle, into the said Province, from such places and during such time as should be set forth in such Proclamation: Now therefore, I, the said Governor-in-Chief, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do, in the pursuance of the hereinbefore recited Act, by this present order, prohibit the introduction or importation from the Colonies of Queensland, Western Australia, Tasmania, and New Zealand, of any sheep, unless a permit in writing, signed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, for authorizing such importation or introduction, shall have been first obtained: And I do also proclaim, order, and direct that this my Proclamation shall continue in full force and effect until the same shall be revoked by Proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette*.

Given under my hand and the public seal of the said Province, at Adelaide, this seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.
