ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the fifth day of September, 1866.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Electric Telegraph Act, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to make regulations for the transmission and delivery of all despatches, messages, and communications by the Electric Telegraph Lines referred to in that Act: And whereas it is further enacted by the said Act that it shall be the duty of all officers and others employed in the working of any such Telegraph Lines to transmit all messages which may be lawfully transmitted under any such regulations:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with

the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the above recited power and authority, doth hereby make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION.

No message or communication relating to the Customs shall be transmitted by any officer or other person employed in working any Telegraph Line belonging to the New Zealand Government or be allowed by him to be transmitted by such line during any period which shall be specified in any order from the Honorable the Commissioner of Customs, unless under the written authority of the said Commissioner or of some person authorized under his hand in that behalf.
