PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM HENRY EYES, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by delegation from His Excellency the Governor, the power has been given to me as Superintendent, to make appointments under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861:"

Now therefore, I, William Henry Eyes, Esq., the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in exercise of the power and authority so vested in me, do hereby appoint

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND,—DISTRICT OF BAY OF ISLANDS,—RUAPEKAPEKA BLOCK.
Estimated to contain 24,636 acres.

Boundaries — Commencing at a point on the Kauri Nui River, thence southerly and easterly by the survey lines to the Waiotiu River, thence southerly again by that river, thence westerly following the survey lines by Te Ruapekapeka, Tirohia, Oremaitewhenua, and Opuawhango, to the Waiharakeke River, thence up that river to Te Oro, thence north-westerly by a line to a point called Te Hautapu, being the southern extremity of the Kawa Kawa Block, thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of the Kawa Kawa Block to the reserves lying between the last-mentioned block and the Ruapekapeka Block aforesaid, thence by the eastern boundaries of said reserves to the Kawa Kawa River, thence by that river and the southern bank of the Karetu River to the Waitemaringi Reserve, thence following the boundaries of the last-mentioned reserve to the northern bank of the last-mentioned river, thence by that bank and the Kawa Kawa River again and the eastern boundaries of the Pomare (Te Whakau) and Pumanawa Reserves to the south-west angle of GREENWAY'S claim, thence by the southern boundary of that claim to the Kauri.

IN exercise of the authority contained in Section VI. of "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," the Colonial Secretary, on behalf of the Crown, abandons the right to take all or any of the land in the Ngatiruanui Coast Block lying eastward of the western boundary of the Waitotara Block, and of a line North 22½° East, in production of that boundary northwards to the north-eastern boundary of the said Ngatiruanui Coast Block; and the aforesaid land is accordingly excluded from the operations of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment Act, 1864," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865."

NOTIFICATION.—Whereas by "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," it is enacted that instead of the period of six months and eighteen months, prescribed by the seventh section of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," for preferring claims to compensation, the period for such

purpose shall be a period not less than three months nor more than six months, to be prescribed by the Compensation Court, in each case; and due notice of such period for preferring claims shall be given by direction of the Court by advertisement in public newspapers, or otherwise by public notice in the Maori and English language.

And whereas by an Order in Council made by His Excellency the Governor in Council, at Wellington, on the twelfth day of January, 1867, it was ordered that from the date thereof, the district, the boundaries whereof are defined in the Schedule hereto, should be a district within the provisions of the said "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and should be designated by the name of

"THE MOHAKA AND WAIKARE DISTRICT;"

and the lands within the said district, except as therein mentioned, were thereby reserved and taken for the purpose of settlement; and it was declared that all such lands were required for the purposes of the said last-mentioned Act, and were subject to the provisions thereof, from the date of the said Order in Council now in recital.

Now, by the direction of the Compensation Court, it is hereby notified that the period for preferring claims to compensation on account of the taking, as aforesaid, of the said block of land, has been prescribed by the Court to be six months from the said twelfth day of January.
