A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted, that the fifth part of the said Act, including sections thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, thirty-seven, thirty-eight, and thirty-nine, and that section fifty-two, shall have no force or effect upon any Gold Field until after the Governor shall, by proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, have proclaimed and extended the operation of the said part and sections to the Province wherein such Gold Field shall be situate. And further that such proclamation shall only be made upon the application of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of a Province, and the said part and sections of this Act shall thereafter be of force and effect within such Province only.

And whereas application has been made by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, that the operation of the said part and sections of the said Act be extended to the said Province :

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and extend the operation of the fifth part of the said Act, including sections thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, thirty-seven, thirty-eight, and thirty-nine, and of section fifty-two of the said Act, to the Province of Nelson.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this nineteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Protection of Certain Animals Act Amendment Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that the Act shall not come into force in any Province until proclaimed by the Governor in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and in the *Gazette* of the Province in which it shall be designed that it shall be brought into force, and only from a date to be fixed therein :

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority so vested in me by the above recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that "The Protection of Certain Animals Act, 1866," shall come into force in the Province of Auckland, on and from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this nineteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

THE PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Intestate Estates Act, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that every Curator shall once in every quarter of a year, on a day to be fixed by the Governor in Council, or oftener if

required, produce and pass his accounts in each estate of which he shall be appointed administrator before the Registrar of the Supreme Court, for the judicial district in which the Curator may reside, or such other person or persons as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint for that purpose:

Now therefore His Excellency Sir George Grey, the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in him vested on this behalf, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby fix and appoint the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September, and the thirty-first day of December, in every year, to be the days on which every Curator of Intestate Estates within the Colony shall produce and pass his accounts in each estate of which he has been or shall be appointed administrator before the Registrar of the Supreme Court for the judicial district in which such Curator shall be resident.

THE PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Intestate Estates Act, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that the Colonial Treasurer shall deduct such amount as shall from time to time be fixed by the Governor in Council, but not exceeding five pounds per centum, from the moneys paid to the credit of the Intestate Estates Fund, and the sum so deducted shall be passed to the credit of and shall form part of the general revenue of the Colony:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby order and direct that the sum of five pounds per centum shall be deducted from all moneys paid, or which shall hereafter be paid to the credit of the Intestate Estates

Fund, to form part of the general revenue of the Colony.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by "The Deeds Registration Amendment Act, 1863," I do hereby order, that on and after the first day of April next, the Register of Deeds Offices within the several Provinces of New Zealand shall be open to the public daily, (Sundays, Saturdays, and public holidays excepted), from Ten (10) o'clock a.m. to Four (4) o'clock p.m., and on Saturdays from Ten (10) o'clock a.m. to Two (2) o'clock p.m. But no Deeds shall be received for registration after the hours of Two (2) o'clock p.m. on Saturdays, and Three o'clock p.m. on other office days.

All former Regulations relating to office hours are hereby rescinded.
