THE following Despatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information, pointing out that Foreigners naturalized in New Zealand, who may be desirous of travelling in Europe, should, before leaving the Colony, provide themselves with some official evidence of their identity and description.

Downing Street, 25th April, 1867. SIR,-With reference to the Circular Despatch from this Department dated the fifth of June, 1866, relative to the case of Foreigners naturalized in any of Her Majesty's Colonies who wish to obtain British passports for foreign travel, I have the honor to inform you that different cases have occurred lately

in which such naturalized Foreigners have applied in this Country for passports, without being in possession either of a passport from the Governor or of any official document from the Colony to establish their identity and character. You will readily perceive that this is calculated to embarrass this Department, and also to cause much private inconvenience to the persons concerned if they should find themselves unable to produce any sufficient evidence of their quality.

I have therefore to suggest that, in every Colony containing naturalized Foreigners who are likely to travel in Europe, it would be convenient that notice should from time to time be given in public news-papers, of the necessity for such persons providing themselves before leaving the Colony with some official evidence of their identity and description.

UPON reading the petition of the abovenamed bank-rupt and David Clark, and the affidavit thereto annexed, and upon hearing the solictor for the said bankrupt, I do order that a meeting of the creditors of the said bankrupt be held at the office of George Brodie, Esq., the Inspector in Bankruptcy, at the Custom House, Dunedin, in the Province of Otago aforesaid, on Saturday, the twelfth day of October, instant, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of investigating the affairs of the said bankrupt, and for recommending to this Court a fit and proper person to be appointed a co-trustee with the said George Brodie, of the estate and effects of the said bankrupt; and I do further order, that failing such meeting and recommendation of a trustee as aforesaid, the real and personal estate of the said bankrupt Terric Miller meeting the said bankrupt, Lewis Miller, mentioned and set out in the schedule annexed to the said petition, be placed under sequestration in the hands of the said George Brodie alone, to be taken and held by him, his heirs, executors, and administrators, respectively, (except the wearing apparel of the bankrupt, his wife and children, which shall be retained by them), upon and for the following trusts and purposes, namely :

2. To retain and pay all expenses properly incurred of and attending such sale, collection, and getting in.

3. To pay the poundage and all other fees payable under the above-mentioned Acts.

4. To pay the costs properly incurred of and incidental to the petition in these matters, and subsequent thereto, such costs to be first taxed; and also all costs and expenses in these matters which have been or shall be ordered by this Court, or by any Judge thereof, to be paid out of the estate of the bankrupt.

5. To distribute the net residue of the said trust moneys between and amongst and for the benefit of all the creditors of the bankrupt who were his

creditors at the time of the presentation of his petition, and who shall duly prove their debts by affidavit filed in the office of the Registrar of this honorable Court within three calendar months from the date of this order, by way of pro rata distribution, subject to existing legal priorities (if any), but so that the creditors shall not receive more than twenty shillings in the pound upon their said respective debts.

6. To pay the ultimate surplus (if any) of the said trust moneys to the said bankrupt.

5. To pay the ultimate surplus (if any) of the said trust moneys to the said bankrupt.

And it is further ordered that the consideration of the matters of the said petition be and the same is hereby adjourned until the eleventh day of November next.
