to be Reception Commissioners, in addition to the existing Commissioners, for the purposes specified in the said Commission, which Commission continues in full force and virtue, anything herein notwithstanding.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.
