And whereas by a proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, pursuance of the said recried power and authority, did, amongst others, constitute a district for the purposes of the said Act, called the "Bay of Islands District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said proclamation came into operation and took effect on the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine. And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said proclamation as relates to the said district, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such district :

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said proclamation so far as relates to the "Bay of Islands District," and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such district shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act, into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

BAY OF ISLANDS DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the harbour of the Bay of Islands, from Tapeka Head to Cape Brett; on the

north-east by the sea, from Cape Brett aforesaid to the North Head of Ngunguru River; on the southwest by the Ngunguru River aforesaid, and by a line drawn from the source thereof to the south-eastern extremity of the Ruapekapeka Block; thence by the south-castern and southern boundaries of said block to the Otiria River; and on the west by the Otiria River aforesaid, to the Kawakawa River; thence by said river and the harbour of the Bay to Tapeka Head, the point of commencement.

WAIMATE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the north-east by the sea, the midchannel of the Bay, and the mid-channel of the Kawakawa River to its confluence with the Haretu River; on the South by a line drawn from the confluence of the Kawakawa and Haretu Rivers aforesaid to the eastern extremity of the Omapere Lake; on the south-west by a line drawn from the eastern shore of the Omapere Lake aforesaid to the summit of Maungataniwha; and on the north-west by a line drawn from the summit of Maungataniwha to the southern extremity of the southernmost of the Cavalli Islands.

And I hereby declare that this proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information notified for general information, that on the eleventh instant, he received a letter from the Duke of Edinburgh, stating that His Royal Highness had been unanimously advised by his medical attendants that the state of his health would not permit him to venture on the fatigues which his proposed visit to New Zealand would entail. His Royal Highness at first combated this opinion, and finally yielded with great reluctance to the strong representations of Commodore Lambert and of his medical advisers, who combined to urge the necessity of his immediate return to England.

His Royal Highness desires that it may be made known both to the Colonists and to the Maoris, that he feels deep regret and disappointment at having been thus forced to abandon, on the present occasion, his proposed visit to New Zealand. His Royal Highness had looked forward with great pleasure His Royal and interest to his reception, both by the Europeans and the Natives; and had fully intended to carry out the programme submitted to him by the Governor, which included visits to the Native Districts, and to all the principal places in the North, and in the Middle Island.

SIR,—I have to acknowledge the receipt of Sir George Grey's Despatch, No. 124, of 8th November, forwarding an Act which he had reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure "to alter the salary of the Governor of New Zealand." I regret that this subject, if it was to be mooted at all should not have been moved in a proving

at all, should not have been moved in a previous session, in anticipation of the then approaching completion of the Governor's term of service, instead of being raised after his successor had been selected and had accepted the appointment.

I by no means consider that good grounds for the reduction as well as the increase of the salary of a Governor may not frequently exist, but the great point at which to aim is, that the salary should be fixed at such an amount as to secure the services of competent men, and enable them to fulfil properly the social as well as other duties of their station.

The salary of the Governor was originally fixed at £2,500, when the revenue of the Colony was $\pounds 161.287$, and the population, 26,707. It was £161,287, and the population, 26,707. It was increased in 1858 to £3,500, the revenue then being £666,655, and the population 61,224; and again in 1862 it was found expedient by the Colony, without any suggestion from Her Majesty's Government, to recommend a further increase to £4,500. The recommendation was made by the Colonial Government in the following terms:—" Ministers desire to take this opportunity of representing to the Imperial Government that, in the increase which Her Majesty is humbly recommended to sanction in the salary of the Governor, it has by no means been the intention of the General Assembly to measure the personal and pecuniary sacrifices he (Sir George Grey) made in obeying Her Majesty's commands to assume the government of New Zealand, but simply to fix such an official income for the Queen's representative as the circumstances of the Colony justify."

the circumstances of the Colony justify." This salary has continued to be paid accordingly, without remark, and notwithstanding that the late Governor was receiving a supplementary payment of £1,500 per annum, in addition, from Her Majesty's Government. I find no facts set forth in the Ministers' report on the proposed Act to show that the Colony is of less importance than it was five years since, that the duties of a Governor are less, the expenses of living so materially reduced, or the circumstances of the Colony so altered, as to render such a modification as proposed consistent with the due maintenance of the status of a Governor of so important a Colony.

It is no doubt possible that such reasons, or some of them, may exist or be anticipated as likely to occur, but I have no reason for supposing such to be the case. I have entered at some length upon the question in order to show that there exists no indisposition on my part to consider fully any suggestion on this, a subject of as much importance to the Colony as to the Empire; although the peculiar circumstances of the case render it impossible that I can advise Her Majesty to assent to the present Act.

SIR,—In consequence of a correspondence which has recently passed with the Foreign Office, I think it may be convenient to inform the Governors of Colonies generally, in a circular despatch, of the following principles relative to the appointment of Consuls and Consular Officers.

The appointment of a Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent in any British Colony, intended to be permanent, must, in order to be recognized as permanent, be submitted for the sanction of Her Majesty's Government. But an appointment made by a Foreign Consul of a temporary character, such for instance as that of a person to discharge the duties of a Consular Officer, deceased, or going away on leave, may, if there is no obvious colonial objection to the individual proposed to be appointed, be accepted by the British authorities in the Colony, pending the result of a reference to Her Majesty's Government as to whether such temporary appointment may be recognized.

NOTICE TO MARINERS .- The following re-N marks on and sailing directions for the Waitara River, in the Province of Taranaki, are published for general information.

REMARKS ON THE ENTRANCE TO THE WAITABA RIVER, PROVINCE OF TARANAKI, AND DIRECTIONS FOR VESSELS APPROACHING IT.

THE mouth of the Waitara River is about ten miles | to the N.E. from the Flagstaff at New Plymouth. There is a shifting bar at the entrance having sometimes one and sometimes two channels, the northern channel being principally used. It is high water on the bar at full and change at 9:45. The depth in the main channel at low water spring tides is about two feet. Range of tides from seven to twelve feet.

The flood tide runs two to three knots; the ebb, three to four knots in the entrance of the river. Along shore, flood tide runs to the eastward and ebb tide to the westward from one to two knots.

The general soundings one mile off shore from New Plymouth to Waitara are from five to seven fathoms sand and rocks. A submerged reef, known as the Puketapu Reef, lies about three miles to the west of the entrance and extends to the distance of one mile from the shore. Shoal water extends with rocky bottom for half a mile off shore on each side of the Waitara bight.

A flagstaff with yard and semaphore arm has been erected on the south side of the river, and vessels will be guided in by the Signal Master. Masters of vessels are requested to pay particular attention to the signals from the flagstaff and alter the course of the vessel promptly in the direction towards which the semaphore arm is pointed. When the semaphore arm is dropped the vessel is to be kept steady as she goes. Marryat's code of signals, and the special signals given below, are in use at the Waitara signal station.

Wait for high water :

- A ball at each yardarm, and one on mast half the length of the yard below it.
- Stand on, take the bar Four balls horizontal on yard, two on each side of mast.

Bar dangerous, keep off:

Three bails horizontal on yard, two on any one side of mast and one on the other.

Put to sea:

Two balls horizontal on yard.

No vessel should approach the shore at night within ten fathoms soundings. This depth will carry a vessel outside the points of the reef. In heavy south-west gales no vessel should approach the Wai-tara River. In fine weather a vessel drawing nine feet six inches may enter the river at spring tides. Vessels drawing from seven to eight feet may trade there habitually without difficulty.

Sailing directions for vessels approaching.

From the North.—Bring the summit of Mount Egmont to bear S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and steer on that bearing until White Bluff (Parininihi) bears N.E. by E. The vessel will then be about two miles from the flagstaff at the entrance to the river which will bear S. E. by S. 1/2 S., and by steering on that bearing (or direct for the flagstaff) she will be brought to the anchorage which is three quarters of a mile from the shore, and may anchor, unless otherwise directed by the Signal Master.

From the South .- When abreast of the Outer Sugar Loaf Island (Motumahanga), distant quarter of a mile, steer N.E. until the flagstaff at the Wai-tara bears S.E by S. ½ S. and then steer for the flagstaff until the Outer Sugar Loaf Island is in line with Kate Point (the western point of the Waitara bight) bearing S.W. by W. (westerly.) A vessel will then be in six fathoms sandy bottom and may anchor with safety three quarters of a mile off shore. The Seal Rock (the westernmost of the Sugar Loaf group) should on no account be opened south of the Outer Sugar Loaf (Motumahanga) until the flagstaff

at the Waitara bears S.E. A vessel will thus keep clear of the roll on Puketapu Reef.
