A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted that as soon as conveniently may be after the establishment of a Petty Sessions District, and afterwards from time to time as may be deemed expedient, the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, appoint a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident in such district to be yearly held within such district, at some specified time and place, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and in exercise of the power in that behalf vested in him, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, did define and establish certain Petty Sessions Districts, including amongst other districts the Waipaoa District and the Ngaruroro District, in the Province of Hawke's Bay:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers in that behalf vested in me, do hereby proclaim Thursday, the fifteenth day of October instant, to be the day on which, and the Resident Magistrate's Court House at Waipaoa to be the place at which, shall be held the yearly meeting for the Waipaoa District for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight; and the third Thursday in the month of October in every succeeding year to be the day on which, and the Resident Magistrate's Court House at Waipaoa aforesaid to be the place at which, shall thereafter be held the yearly meetings for the District of Waipaoa aforesaid, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions, and settling a rota of attendance. And I do further proclaim Wednesday, the fourteenth day of October instant, to be the day on which, and

McHardy's Hotel, at Havelock, Ngaruroro, to be the place at which, shall be held the yearly meeting for the Ngaruroro District for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight; and the second Wednesday in the month of October in every succeeding year to be the day on which, and McHardy's Hotel aforesaid to be the place at which, shall thereafter be held the yearly meetings for the Ngaruroro District, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions, and settling a rota of attendance.

**W**HEREAS by a Governor's Order, dated the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Port of Havelock, in the Province of Marlborough, was declared to be no longer a Port for the purposes of "The Customs Regulation 1858.:"

And whereas it has become expedient to annul the said Order, and to re-appoint the Port of Havelock to be a Port for the purposes of the above-mentioned Act:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power in me for this purpose vested by "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," do hereby appoint that, on and from the date hereof, there shall be within the Province of Marlborough a Port to be called

THE PORT OF HAVELOCK,

the limits whereof shall be as follows:—The waters of Pelorus Sound, inside of a straight line drawn from Whakamawahi Point, between Kanaroa Bay and Hikuraki Sound to Tewero Point, together with the site of the Town of Havelock.

That your Petitioners are desirous that the City of Wellington should be constituted a Borough, under an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, dated 10th October, 1867, and being 31 Victoria, No. 24, intituled "An Act to provide for the establishment of Municipal Corporations," and that the boundaries of the City of Wellington, for the purposes of this Petition, should be the same as the limits thereof are settled and described in the plan of the Town of Wellington, Port Nicholson, annexed to a certain Crown Grant of the New Zealand Company, dated the 27th day of January, 1848, under the Seal of the Colony, and under the hand of Sir George Grey, the then Governor-in-Chief of the Colony, and which Crown Grant was registered at Wellington on the 19th day of June, 1850, No. 204; and also such portions of the Harbour of Wellington as are comprised in a certain Crown Grant thereof, dated the 16th day of October, 1855; and also the Town Belt, the Canal and Basin, and the Public Reserves belonging to the said city of Wellington.

That the said City of Wellington has been or is reputed to have been incorporated by an Act of the Provincial Council of Wellington, Session 14, No. 9, intituled "An Act to incorporate the Board of Works for the City of Wellington and for other purposes."

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to constitute the City of Wellington a Borough under the provisions of the said Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, to be bounded as hereinbefore set forth.

TENDERS will be received at this Office until the thirtieth of November, 1868, from persons willing to supply the New Zealand Government with Stationery, to be delivered free of expense in this Colony, at such Port as the Government may indicate, for the Twelve Months commencing on the first June, 1869.

1. The value of all necessary packages, whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices demanded, and the net weight or quantity only will be paid for.

2. A bond for the sum of £1,000, the Contractor in the sum of £500 and two approved sureties £500 each, for the due performance of the contract, will be required to be entered into within a month of the acceptance of the contract.

3. The Tenderers will be required to forward samples of the articles marked with an asterisk.

4. The supplies are to be according to sample and of the particular manufacture indicated in the Schedule.

5. In the case of different makers' goods, the Contractors will be required to supply the kind ordered.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution.

7. The Contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantity of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates.

8. The acceptance of the supplies will be subject to the approval of the officers in the various Provinces

appointed by the Government. The Contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to, but in that case he must without delay give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the Contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the Contractor's account.

10. It will be competent either for the Contractor on his own behalf, or for the Honorable the Colonial Secretary on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract by giving notice in writing of three months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

11. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the Contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportional allowance, by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

12. A separate tender having been invited for certain descriptions of Printing Paper, the acceptance of any tender for the same descriptions of paper enumerated herein will be only for such quantities as may be required during the year in addition to the quantities contracted for by such separate tender.
