Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority in that behalf vested in me, do hereby proclaim and appoint a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident in the Port Albert District to be held within such district, at the Mangawhai Hotel, Mangawhai, at twelve o'clock noon, on the second Thursday in January, 1869, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance: And I do further proclaim the second Thursday in the month of January in each succeeding year to be the day on which, and the Mangawhai Hotel, at Mangawhai aforesaid, to be the place at which, shall thereafter be held the yearly meetings for the Port Albert District, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Public Works Land Act," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to order that any public work to be defined in such Order shall be made, and that, after the publication of such Order in Council in the Government *Gazette*, the Governor may compulsorily take and permanently hold all such lands as may be necessary for the construction of such public work under the provisions in the said

Act contained: Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority in that behalf vested in him, order that the public work hereinafter defined shall be made—that is to say, that a public road shall be laid out and made over all that land described by the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereunto.

The range of barometer in month greatest recorded in ten years, viz., 2:127 inches. The weather was cold during the month.

GENERAL REMARKS. The weather has been unusually stormy throughout the Colony during this month. At Nelson, Christchurch, Hokitika, and Southland, there were very strong N.W. winds on 15th and 16th, with low barometer readings; and the maximum force of the wind for the month at all these stations occurred on the same date (16th). At Southland, the storm was very server. Gales also occurred in the North Island from the same quarter and about the same date. The most remarkable occurrence in this month was a severe earthquake shock, which was felt at all the stations except Mongonui, Otago, and Southland, on the 19th, at 0.15 a.m., and which appears to have come from the eastward, but was felt with greatest intensity as a wave of emergence along the west side of the Island—especially in Nelson and Taranaki, at which places a considerable amount of damage was done to buildings. buildings.
