A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted, that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent, as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor, at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill; and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein:

And whereas the Acts hereinafter specified have been enacted by the Superintendent of Auckland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Acts were received by the Governor on the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Acts

should be disallowed:

Now therefore I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Acts passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Auckland, namely:—

"The Auckland Rural Districts Act, 1869;"

"The City of Auckland Dog Nuisance Act, 1869;"
"The Thames Gold Fields Public Works Act, 1869."

WHEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted that as soon as conveniently may be after the establishment of a Petty Sessions District, and afterwards from time to time as may be deemed expedient, the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, appoint a meeting of the Justices of the Peace resident in such district to be yearly held within such district, at some specified time and place, for the purpose of choosing a Chairman of Petty Sessions and settling a rota of attendance: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, a Petty Sessions District, hereinafter named, was defined and established:

As payment of interest on new bonds has to be made in London, and the annual drawings will also be made there, those bonds will have to be deposited in the hands of some person resident in the United Kingdom. NOTICE TO MARINERS.

SNAG IN ENTRANCE TO BULLER RIVER.

Marine Department, Wellington, 7th April, 1869.

NOTICE is hereby given, that there is a large snag on the Bar of the Buller River, which, in the present state of the channel, is right in the fairway of the North Channel.

The snag will be removed, or marked by buoys or beacons, as soon as practicable; and in the meantime Masters of vessels are warned of its existence, and requested to observe closely the following directions:-

When entering in daylight, the flagstaff and the beacon carrying the red flag must be kept in one, and, failing this, vessels must be steered in close accordance with the directions of the semaphore arm at the flagstaff.

When entering by night, the (outer) red light and the (inner) bright light must be kept in one, if practicable, or, failing this, the bright light must be opened to the S.W. of the red light (or towards Cape Foulwind).

On no account must the line of the leading lights be crossed towards the N.E. till the vessel is inside the Bar.

Lloyd Bay and Pipon Islands.

CAPTAIN EDWARDS, of the "Melanie," reports the existence, in Lloyd Bay, of a patch of rocks—upon the N.W. edge of which the vessel touched, and where there were about five feet at low water—with the fellowing bearings. Protection Island N. W. the following bearings:—Restoration Island, N. 1 W.; Peaked Red Hill, S. W. 1 W.

Also, of a small pinnacle, about three feet square, awash at low water; the point of Cape Direction bearing E. by S.\frac{1}{4}S.; peak of lump, S. by E.\frac{1}{4}E.; Lloyd Island being at the same time just open to the

northward of Low Island.

He also reports having seen in the same bay two

rocks just awash, bearing from the small sandbank S.E., and from X reef S.W. by S.

Also, near the Pipon Islands the "Melanie" struck on a patch of rocks not laid down in the charts—North Bay Point bearing S. by E. \(\frac{1}{4}\)E., and the east end of Pipon Islands, S. W. by W. \(\frac{3}{4}\)W. As the tide was about half-ebb when she touched, this patch cannot have more than three feet of water upon it at low water.

IN THE MATTER OF A BILL INTITULED "AN ACT TO .AUTHORIZE 'THE CHRISTCHURCH GAS, COAL, AND COKE COMPANY (LIMITED), ' TO MAKE GAS WORKS FOR SUPPLYING THE CITY OF CHRISTCHURCH AND SUBURBS WITH GAS."

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made at the next Session of the General Assembly of New Zealand, for leave to bring in a Bill to authorize "The Christchurch Gas, Coal, and Coke Company (Limited)," incorporated under the provisions of "The Joint Stock Companies Act, 1860," to construct Gas Works for supplying the City of Christchurch and Suburbs with Gas, and for other purposes relating thereto and to the objects for other purposes relating thereto and to the objects for which the said Company has been established.

Copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private

Bill Office on or before the commencement of the Session.

It is intended to apply for the following powers on

behalf of the Company; that is to say—
The Company, under such superintendence as is hereinafter specified, may open and break up the soiland pavement of the several streets and bridges within the limits of this Act, and may open and break up any sewers, drains, or tunnels within or under such streets and bridges, and lay down and place within the same limits pipes, conduits, service-pipes, and other works, and from time to time repair, alter, or remove the same, and also make any sewers that may be necessary for carrying off the washings and waste liquids which may arise in the making of the gas, and for the purposes aforesaid may remove and use all earth and materials in and under such streets and bridges, and may in such streets erect any pillars, lamps, and other works, and do all other acts which the Company shall from time to time deem necessary for supplying gas within the limits hereinafter mentioned, doing as little damage as may be in the execution of the power hereby granted, and making compensation for any damage which may be done in the execution

of such powers.

That the Company may from time to time enter into any contract with any person for lighting or supplying with gas any public or private buildings, or for providing any person with pipes, burners, meters, and lamps, and for the repair thereof, and may also from time to time enter into any contract with the Christchurch City Council, Road Board, or other persons having the control of any of the streets within the limits aforesaid, for lighting the same or any of them with gas, and for providing such Council, Road Board, or persons with lamps, lamp-posts, burners, and pipes for such purpose, and for the repairs thereof, in such manner and upon such terms as shall be agreed upon between the Company and the said Council, Road Board, or

other persons.

That the Company may let for hire any meter for ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed or supplied, and any fittings for the gas, for such remuneration in money as shall be agreed upon between the Company and any person to whom the same may be so let; and such remuneration shall be recoverable in the same manner as the rents or sum due to the Company for gas; and such meters and fittings shall not be subject to distress for rent of the premises where the same may be used, nor to be taken in execution under any process or proceeding of a Court of Law or Equity or in bankruptcy against the person in

whose possession the same may be.

That the Clerk, Engineer, or other officer duly appointed for the purpose by the Company, may at all reasonable times enter any building or place lighted with gas supplied by the Company in order to inspect the meters, fittings, and works for regulating the supply of gas, and for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed or supplied; and if any person hinder such officer as aforesaid from entering and making such inspection as aforesaid at any reasonable time, he shall for every such offence forfeit to the Company a sum not exceeding five pounds.

That if any person supplied with gas neglect to pay the rent due for the same to the Company, the Company may stop the gas from entering the premises of such person, by cutting off the service-pipe or by such means as the Company shall think fit, and recover the rent due from such person, together with the expense of cutting off the gas, and the cost of recovering the rent by action in any Court of Law of competent juris-

That in all cases in which the Company are authorized to cut off and take away the supply of gas from any house, building, or premises under the provisions of this Act, the Company, their agents or workmen, after giving forty eight-hours' previous notice in writing to the occupier, or if no occupier, then after leaving such notice on any portion of the premises, may enter into such house, building, or premises between the hours of nine in the forenoon and four in the afternoon,

and remove and carry away any pipe, meter, fittings or other works, the property of the Com-

Company may make bye-laws or regulations provided the same shall not be repugnant to this Act or to "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," or to any bye-law or regulation which may now or hereafter be made thereunder, or to any Road Board Act or Ordinance of the General Assembly or of the Province of Canterbury, or to any bye-law or regulation which may now or hereafter be made thereunder respectively, and may impose any penalty not exceeding the sum of five pounds for the breach of any bye-law or regulation of the Company.

The limits within which such Gas Works as afore-

said are intended to be made extend to and include all lands lying within a radius of five miles from the centre of the Market Place, in the City of Christchurch.

Such Gas Works as aforesaid are intended to be made and maintained in and through the City of Christchurch, and portions of the Avon, Riccarton, Templeton, Spreydon, Halswell, and Heathcote Road

Boards Districts.

The plans and book of reference, and copy of this notice to be inserted in the *Gazette*, will be deposited for public inspection at the Office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Province of Canterbury, in the City of Christchurch, on or before the 6th day of April instant, and will, on or before the commencement of the Session, be deposited in the Office of the Colonial Secretary and in the Private Bill Office.

Mongonui.—High wind from N.E. on the 24th, and heavy rain; very strong gale from S.W. on the 28th; lightning on the 12th, but no thunder. Unusually heavy rainfall at this station, 2.65 inches recorded on 25th for previous twenty-four hours; during the latter part of the month very stormy weather.

Auckland.—As will be seen from the above table, the rainfall at this place has been unusually great, and storms of great violence have occurred during the month. The Observer remarks, "On the afternoon of the 9th rain commenced and continued without cessation till 8 a.m. on the 12th, the quantity registered being on 10th, 1.743; 11th, 6.392; and 12th, 0.860 inches, attended with thunder and vivid lightning, but little wind. There was a violent gale on 20th from E., which changed to N.E. and abated on night of 24th; 1.588 inch of rain recorded on morning of 24th. Another severe storm took place on 27th, commencing from E.; barometer fell from 29.831 on 26th to 29.207 on morning of 27th, there was very heavy rain; on afternoon of 27th there was a lull in the storm, and wind changed suddenly to W., when it blew with greater fury than ever during evening and night; on 28th it moderated."

Taranaki.—Gale on 14th from N.W., with rain, and from 15th to 17th stormy weather from S.E.; thunder on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 6th. The rainfall was heavy also at this station. There were four days of fog.

Napier.—Strong wind on 16th from S., no rain, and on the 23rd from N.E., also without rain; thunder and lightning on 3rd. Very heavy rainfall, particularly on the 10th (1.75 inch for previous twenty-four hours); on 11th (1.54 inch); on 27th (2.12 inches); and 28th (2.78 inches). Slight earthquake on 11th at 10.30 a.m., and on 27th at 11 p.m.

Wellington.—Strong wind on 14th from S.E.; severe gale on 27th and 28th from same quarter, with heavy rain on 27th, 1.800 inch in twenty-four hours; foggy also on 27th; sixteen days of S.E. wind; slight earthquake on the 11th. On the whole, disagreeable and wet weather at this station dur

disagreeable and wet weather at this station.

Nelson.—The weather at this station during the month has been fine; rainfall below the average, and wind moderate; smart shock of earthquake at 10.13 a.m. on 11th.

Christchurch.—Strong E. wind on 24th, and on 28th stormy from S.W., with heavy rain; thunder-storm on the 6th; slight earthquake on 11th at 10.15 a.m.; fine during the early part of the month, but rough and wet towards the end.

Hokitika.—Gale on 23rd and 24th from N.E., with rain and thunder and lightning on 24th; also gale on 25th from S.W. Up to the 22nd the weather was on the whole fine; slight shock of earthquake on 11th at 10.14 a.m.

Dunedin.—Very fine weather during the month, light winds and small rainfall; high barometer readings; fog on 18th.

Southland.—Observer remarks that this was a very fine, dry, and calm month, no gales, hail, or fog; thunder on the 5th, and slight earthquake on 10th at 3 a.m.

slight earthquake on 10th at 3 a.m. GENERAL REMARKS.

Several storms of great violence have occurred at most of the stations in the North Island during this month, particularly at Auckland, and the rainfall in every case is considerably greater than the average for previous years. The rain in Auckland on the 11th (6:329 inches), and the force of the wind on the 28th for previous twenty-four hours (1,229 miles), exceed greatly any previous daily records in that Province. The weather in the South has been on the whole fine, with slight rain.
