WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Protection of Animals Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that no native game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in any part of the Colony, except during such months as the Governor shall from time to time by Proclamation appoint in reference to the respective descriptions of native game within the districts mentioned in any such Proclamation:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power in me vested in that behalf by the above-recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that all the native game mentioned in the fifth Schedule to "The Protection of Animals Act, 1867," as amended by the above-recited Act, except quail, may be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in the districts hereinafter mentioned, during the months of April, May, June, July, and August in the present year, and that quail may be hunted, shot, taken, and killed during the months of May, June, and July in the present year, in

Taranaki,
Hawke's Bay,
Wellington,
Marlborough,
Southland, and

The County of Westland.

WHEREAS intelligence has been received of the intended publication of a notice, purporting to be issued by the so-styled Chief Secretary at Bau, Fiji, inviting Volunteers to take military service under Thakobau, styled King of Bau, for the purpose of assisting him in subjugating certain tribes in the interior of Viti Levu, and thereupon to sign a declaration faithfully to serve the said so-styled King Thakobau, his heirs and successors, against all native enemies, and to obey all his and their orders, and the orders of all European Generals and officers set over such Volunteers, and whereby inducements to such service are held out by promises of large grants of land: And whereas it is contrary to law that such service should be entered upon by British subjects without the leave or license of Her Majesty:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, do hereby warn all and sundry Her Majesty's subjects in the Colony of New Zealand, that all persons, being British subjects, who shall, without the leave or license of Her Majesty in that behalf obtained, enter into such service and sign such declaration as aforesaid, or shall contract or engage to enter, to take, or accept such service, or shall engage others to enter into such service, will be guilty of a misdemeanour, and will render themselves

liable to prosecution according to law.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Militia Act, 1858," it is enacted that on the occasions therein mentioned it shall be lawful for the Governor, or such person as he shall from time to time, by warrant under his hand, appoint as his deputy for that purpose, to direct the Officer commanding the Militia of any District, with all convenient speed, to draw out such Militia Force, and that such Militia shall continue on actual service so long as, in the opinion of the Governor, the danger shall render their services necessary:

And whereas, by a warrant under my hand dated the sixteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, I directed Lieut.-Colonel Henry Elmhirst Reader, the Officer commanding the Militia in the Wellington District, to draw out for actual service the whole of the Militia Force within the District of Wellington:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, do hereby proclaim and declare, that in my opinion the danger no longer renders necessary the services of the said Militia Force in the said District, and that the said force shall henceforth cease to be on actual service.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865" (section 4), the Governor may, by any Order in Council, from time to time annul, make void, or alter or vary and make anew, any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations made and published by the Governor under the authority of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," or of this Act, or by the Superintendent of any Province under or in pursuance of any power delegated to him under any of the powers of delegation contained in the said Act: And whereas by section 5 of the said Amendment Act, " as to regulations, appointments, and prohibitory and other declarations made by Superintendents of Provinces in pursuance of any powers delegated under the powers of delegation contained in the said Act or this Act, the power of annulling, making void, or altering or varying and making anew, any such regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations vested in the Governor by this Act, may from time to time be delegated by the Governor in Council, by warrant under his hand, to the Superintendent of any Province:"

And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to William Rolleston, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, all the powers which by the said fifth section of the said Amendment Act the Governor in Council is authorized so to delegate:

And whereas the said William Rolleston, by a Proclamation dated the sixth day of November, 1868, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the eleventh day of November, 1868, did proclaim and declare certain portions of the Province of Canterbury to be infected districts under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865:"

And whereas the said Proclamation was altered and varied by the said William Rolleston by a Proclamation dated the twentieth day of February, 1869, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the second day of March, 1869:

And whereas it is expedient to further alter and

vary the said Proclamation:

Now therefore I, the said William Rolleston, do hereby further alter and vary the said Proclamation in manner following-that is to say, the words "also all that portion of the Province bounded as follows, commencing at a point on the Rangiora Road, the same being the easternmost corner of section No. 1028; thence north-westerly, following the said road along the north-eastern boundary line of sections Nos. 1028, 1655, 355, 355A, 431, and 432, to a branch of the River Cam, opposite the Mill; thence following down the said branch to the road forming the northwestern boundary of the Kaiapoi Native Reserve; and from thence returning along the north-western side of the latter road, a distance of about forty-eight chains, to the commencing point," shall be omitted from the said Proclamation, and the said Proclamation shall be read and construed as if such words had not occurred therein.

This Proclamation shall take effect from and after the day following the date of publication in the New

Zealand Gazette.
