A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament passed in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, cap. seventy-two, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," the several Provinces of Auckland, New Plymouth, Wellington, Nelson, Canterbury, and Otago, are thereby established; and it is enacted that for each of the said Provinces there shall be a Superintendent and Provincial Council:

And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that every Provincial Council shall continue for the period of four years from the day of return of the writs for choosing the same, and no longer: Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New Zealand, by Proclamation or otherwise, to dissolve the same whenever he shall think it expedient so to do:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do by this Proclamation dissolve the Provincial Council of the said Province of Wellington accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Militia Act, 1858," it is enacted that on the occasions therein mentioned it shall be lawful for the Governor, or such person as he shall from time to time, by warrant under his hand, appoint as his deputy for that purpose, to direct the Officer commanding the Militia of any District, with all convenient speed, to draw out such Militia Force, and that such Militia shall continue on actual service so long as, in the opinion of the Governor, the danger shall render their services necessary:

And whereas, by a warrant under my hand bearing date the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, I appointed Donald McLean, Esquire, my deputy for the purpose of directing the Officer commanding the Napier Militia District to draw out for actual service the men of the Militia Force in the said District, and the said Donald McLean subsequently caused the said men to be drawn out for actual service:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said force shall henceforth cease to be on actual service.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the second section of "The Colonial Forces Courts-Martial Act, 1868," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, appoint and declare any portion of the Colony defined in such Proclamation to be a "Disturbed District" within the meaning of the said second section of the said Act; and that during the time that any of the officers or men of the New Zealand Armed Constabulary, embodied under "The Armed Constabulary Act, 1867," shall be stationed, employed, or in any way on service within any district proclaimed under the said section of the said Act as a Disturbed District, all things contained in any Act of the Imperial Parliament which shall then be in force in New Zealand for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better payment of the Army and their quarters, and in the Articles of War made in pursuance of such Act, shall apply to, and the powers thereby created shall be exercised by, such officers and men of the New Zealand Armed Constabulary aforesaid:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the power and authority in that behalf vested in me, do hereby proclaim and declare all that portion of the Colony situated within the Provinces of Auckland, Hawke's Bay, Taranaki, and Wellington, and bounded as follows, that is to say:—All the territory in the North Island of New Zealand comprised between the thirty-seventh and fortieth degrees of South latitude to be a "Disturbed District" within the meaning of the second section of "The Colonial Forces Courts-Martial Act, 1868," aforesaid.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' Districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be: And whereas, by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise

of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him, did proclaim and declare the districts described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation, including amongst other districts the District of Greymouth and the District of Hokitika, to be, on and from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, Resident Magistrates' Districts within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to define and alter the boundaries of the respective Districts of Greymouth and Hokitika in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in me, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Districts of Greymouth and Hokitika, as the same are defined and described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the first day of June one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, be the boundaries of the Districts of Greymouth and Hokitika within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867;" and I do hereby, from the date aforesaid, define and alter the boundaries of the said districts accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

*Greymouth District.*

This district is bounded towards the North-east by the southern boundary of the Province of Nelson, from the mouth of the Grey River to the saddle between the Hurunui and Teramakau Rivers; thence towards the South by the said Teramakau River to its mouth; and thence towards the North-west by the sea to the commencing point at the mouth of the River Grey.

*Hokitika District.*

This district is bounded towards the North by the Greymouth District hereinbefore defined; towards the South-east by the summit of the main range of the southern Alps to the source of the Wanganui River; thence towards the South-west by that river to its mouth; and thence towards the North-west by the sea to the commencing point at the mouth of the Teramakau River.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

1. No prisoner shall, either while within the gaol or while employed on labour outside of the gaol, or while coming from or returning to gaol from such labour, have or hold, or attempt to have or hold, any intercourse with, or receive any communication from any person or persons other than officers of the gaol, without the permission of the Gaoler or a Visiting Justice.

2. If any prisoner shall escape or attempt to escape from the gaol, or from custody while employed on labour outside the gaol, such escape or attempt shall be a breach of the regulations of the gaol; and such prisoner shall, over and above any punishment he may be liable to, for such escape or attempt be liable to be punished for such breach of such regulations.
