A PROCLAMATION.

**WHEREAS** by "The Disturbed Districts Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare any district of the Colony a proclaimed district for the purposes of this Act: And whereas within the districts hereinafter described certain aboriginal Natives, subjects of Her Majesty, have, since the month of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, been and are now in open rebellion and engaged in levying war against the Queen, and it is expedient to declare the said districts proclaimed districts for the purposes of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby proclaim and declare the districts of the Colony hereinafter described, that is to say—

**THE EASTERN DISTRICT,**

Bounded on the North-west by the Rangitaiki River, from its mouth at Matata, in the Bay of Plenty, to the overland track from Taupo to Napier; on the South-west and South by the said track to the Mohaka River, and thence by the Mohaka River to the sea; and on the remaining sides by the sea from the mouth of the Mohaka River to the mouth of the Rangitaiki River at Matata.

**THE WESTERN DISTRICT,**

Bounded on the North by the Hangataahua or Stony River, from its mouth to its source, thence by a straight line drawn to the summit of Mount Egmont, thence by a straight line to the source of the Mangonui Stream, thence by the Mangonui Stream to its confluence with the Waitara, thence by the Waitara to the point where it is crossed by the Taumatamahoe track, thence by the said track to the Wanganui River; on the East by the Wanganui River, from the Taumatamahoe track to the sea; and

on the remaining sides by the sea from the mouth of the Wanganui River, to the mouth of the Hangataahua:

to be respectively proclaimed Districts for the purposes of "The Disturbed Districts Act, 1869."

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority for that purpose vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that all that part of the Colony situated in the Province of Hawke's Bay, lying within the following boundary: the sea coast, from the mouth of the River Esk or Waiohinganga to the mouth of the River Waikare; thence the said River Waikare to a point distant nine miles in a direct line from its mouth; thence a straight line drawn north-west, true bearing, till it intersects the northern boundary of the said Province; thence the said northern boundary to its western extremity; thence the western boundary of the said Province to its intersection with the River Mohaka; thence down the said river to its intersection with the Titiokura path from Taupo to Ahuriri; thence the said Titiokura path to the said River Esk or Waiohinganga; thence the said River Esk to its mouth—shall, from and after the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, be a Proclaimed District within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Public Houses Act, 1868" aforesaid.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this first day of September, 1869.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that in every case in which a borough is constituted under the authority of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," within the boundaries whereof is included territory theretofore included in one or more Road Districts, Highway Districts, or other districts of a like nature, the Governor in Council from time to time may order and direct to and upon which of the several bodies, namely, the Council of the Borough and the Boards of the Road Districts, any or all of the rights and liabilities of the Boards of such Road Districts respectively shall belong and attach, and by or against which of such bodies all or any of the actions, suits, or proceedings, pending at the time of the constitution of such borough, by or against the Boards of the Road Districts, or any of them, shall be carried on and prosecuted; and that all or any rates made before the constitution of such borough remaining unpaid shall be paid to and levied and recovered by either of such bodies, and may from time to time award to either of such bodies, to be paid by any other or others of them, such contribution in respect of all or any of the matters aforesaid as shall seem fit: And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the sixteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Town of Greymouth, in the County of Westland, was constituted a Borough, under the authority of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867." And whereas

within the boundaries of the said borough there was included territory theretofore included in the Paroa Road District: And whereas it is expedient that certain payments should be made by the Council of the Borough of Greymouth to the Road Board of the Paroa Road District in respect of the matters aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said recited Act, doth hereby with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, award to the Road Board of the Paroa Road District, to be paid by the Council of the Borough of Greymouth, the sum of one thousand six hundred pounds (£1,600,) as contribution in respect of the matters aforesaid.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this first day of September, 1869.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, certain Harbour and Quarantine Regulations for the several ports and harbours of the Colony of New Zealand were made and promulgated: And whereas it is desirable that certain clauses of the same should be altered and amended:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, and in pursuance of the powers and authorities in him vested by "The Marine Act, 1867," doth hereby order that from and after the date of publication hereof, clauses twenty-nine, thirty-three, fifty-three, and sixty-six of the said regulations shall respectively be amended as hereinafter appears:—

Clause 29. In lieu of clause twenty-nine it is provided that—

The master of every vessel shall anchor or moor where the Harbourmaster or person deputed by him may direct; and he shall not unmoor or quit the anchorage, nor shall he haul his vessel alongside any public pier, wharf, or jetty, without having previously obtained permission from the Harbourmaster or his deputy to do so; and any master offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Clause 33. In lieu of clause thirty-three it is provided that—

All masters or other persons in charge of vessels are immediately to strike yards and masts, to have their jib and spanker booms rigged close in, to moor and clear hawse, to lay out anchors or kedges, to slack down or heave in cables or warps, to heave ahead or astern, and to haul off from any pier, wharf, or jetty when ordered by the Harbourmaster or his deputy to do so; and whether they are lying at anchor or moored anywhere within the port, or are alongside of any pier, wharf, or jetty, are on all occasions when ordered by the Harbourmaster or his deputy to do whatever the said Harbourmaster or Deputy Harbourmaster may consider necessary or expedient with a view to the safety and interest of the whole shipping, and in consideration of the state of the weather, the crowded condition of the port or river, or any other circumstance; and any master offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

Clause 53. In lieu of clause fifty-three it is provided that—

In the absence of any special regulations for any stated wharf, the time allowed to vessels to occupy berths at quays, jetties, or wharves, for the purpose of discharging cargo, shall be (exclusive of Sundays and holidays and the day of removal) as under:—

For ships under 100 tons ...	2 days
„ from 100 to 150 tons ...	4 „
„ „ 150 to 200 tons ...	5 „
„ „ 200 to 250 tons ...	6 „
„ „ 250 to 300 tons ...	7 „

and so on, at the rate of one day additional for every additional fifty tons of the registered burthen of the vessel. But it is provided that the Superintendent may alter the time table given herein to suit the special requirements of any particular port or wharf by supplementary regulations which shall be binding when made, the time table herein being only applicable to any pier wharf or jetty for which no special time table has been fixed by supplementary regulations.

Clause 66. In lieu of clause sixty-six it is provided that—

All watermen, stevedores, carters, or others engaged on any wharf or jetty, or at any public landing-place, shall be under the control and obey the orders of the Harbour or Pier Master; and any person disobeying this regulation, or in any way obstructing the traffic on any wharf or jetty or public landing-place, or making use of abusive or improper language thereon shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
