At Wellington, this twentieth day of October, 1869.

Present :

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER, PRESIDING, AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if and whenever he shall have by lease, agreement, or otherwise, by consent of the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has been extinguished, or the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has not been extinguished, obtained power from such Native or other owners to authorize entry on such lands for mining for gold, by Proclamation issued under the third section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to include such land within any Gold Field, or to proclaim such land a Gold Field: And by the said Act it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the preceding sections of the said Act (including the above-recited sections), subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as the Governor may think fit:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power for that purpose vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby delegate to

ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Esq.,

Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, all the powers vested in the Governor by the said recited section of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," to have, hold, and exercise within the Province of Wellington, the said powers hereby delegated to the said Isaac Earl Featherston, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that no Proclamation affecting any lands shall be made by the said Isaac Earl Featherston under the powers hereby delegated to him, unless the Governor shall have obtained power to authorize entry on such lands for mining for gold, in the manner required by the said Act.

as Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, all the powers vested in me under or by virtue of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven, to have, hold, and exercise within the Province of Wellington the said powers hereby given to the said Isaac Earl Featherston, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the delegation aforesaid shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and tenth clause of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866."

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865" (section 4), the Governor may, by any Order in Council, from time to time annul, make void, or alter or vary and make anew, any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations made and published by the Governor under the authority of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," or of this Act, or by the Superintendent of any Province under or in pursuance of any power delegated to him under any

WHEREAS by "The Waste Lands Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, to except from sale, and either reserve to Her Majesty or dispose of in such other manner as for the public interest may seem best, such of the Waste Lands of the Crown in any of the Provinces of the Colony as may be required for the purposes of Military Defence, or for the construction of Trunk Lines of Road, or as sites for Public Buildings for the use of the General Government, or for other purposes of public utility or convenience: And whereas His Excellency the Governor did, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in exercise and in pursuance of the power and authority in that behalf vested in him, on the thirtieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, except from sale and reserve to Her Majesty the Waste Lands of the Crown particularly specified and described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule mentioned, and set opposite the descriptions of the said lands: And whereas doubts having arisen as to the validity of the said Order in Council of the thirtieth of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, His Excellency the Governor did, on the seventh of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, issue a further Order in Council, reserving amongst others the lands specified in the Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient that the first hereinbefore recited Order in Council should be revoked and cancelled, and that the last recited Order in Council should be cancelled so far as relates to the lands described in the Schedule hereto:

SIR,—I am directed by the Council of Legal Educa-
tion to enclose for your information copies of Reso-
lutions passed by the Benchers of the Four Inns of
Court, and by the Council of Legal Education, on
the subject of dispensation of Terms in favour of
Students coming from India or the Colonies.

To the Attorney-General of New Zealand.

*Resolutions of the Four Inns of Court respecting
Students coming from India or the Colonies, with a
view to return to residence there; adopted by Orders
of the several Societies, 1868-1869.*

I. That not more than four Terms under any cir-
cumstances be dispensed with in favour of Students
coming from India or the Colonies, with a view to
return to residence there; but that it is not expedient
to dispense with any Terms for such Students except
on condition of their passing such an Examination
as may be prescribed by the Legal Council from time
to time.

II. Provided that each Inn be at liberty to dispense
with this condition in such very special circumstances
as they may think fit, and that such circumstances be
stated in the Certificate of Call to the Bar given to
every such Student; the Benchers of each Inn, sub-
ject to the foregoing limitations, being guided in the
dispensation of Terms by the circumstances of each
particular case.

III. That the Council of Legal Education be
requested to propose a scheme for the Examinations
contemplated by the foregoing Resolutions.

*Scheme of Examination prescribed by the Council of
Legal Education.*

I. That Students coming from India, with a view
to return to residence there, and seeking for a dis-
pensation of not more than four Terms, shall satis-
factorily pass an Examination in—

1. Hindu and Mahomedan Law;
2. The Indian Penal Code;
3. The Code of Criminal Procedure;
4. The Code of Civil Procedure;
5. The Indian Succession Act; and in such other
Codes and Acts as may from time to time
become law in British India.

In addition to the above Examination, they shall
also pass such Examinations, and abide by all such
Rules and Regulations, as are now in force for
Students seeking a "Pass Certificate" by Exami-
nation for Call to the Bar.

II. That Students coming from the Colonies, with
a view to return to residence there, and seeking
for a dispensation of not more than four Terms, shall
pass such an Examination as is required, and abide by
all such Rules and Regulations as are now in force,
in order to obtain a Certificate of Honour.

NEW ZEALAND WAR MEDAL.

HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN having been graciously pleased to extend to the Colonial Forces the grant of the Decoration conferred for the War in New Zealand, and the Government having taken steps to receive the Medals, applications in accordance with the Regulations hereafter set forth will be received at the Colonial Defence Office, Wellington, from persons entitled to receive the Medal.

REGULATIONS.

The Medal will be given to all persons, whether belonging to the Local Forces or loyal Native Tribes, who, during the war in New Zealand, were actually under fire in any engagement with the enemy, or were otherwise conspicuous for distinguished service in the field.

It will also be given to the nearest relations of those who were killed in action or died from wounds.

The applications must set forth the name and date of the action or service on which the claim is founded, and specify the names in full of the applicant, his regimental number and rank, and that of the corps to which he belonged, together with the name of his immediate commanding officer and that of the officer commanding in the engagement.

Applications from the relatives of persons killed in action, or who died from wounds, must be accompanied by a statutory declaration showing nature of relationship and claim.

The Medal will not be given to any person who, since the occurrence of the service on which a claim might be founded, has done anything unworthy of a soldier.

All applications must be made through the officer who immediately commanded the applicant in the engagement referred to, or, in the absence of such officer, direct to the Under Secretary for Colonial Defence.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to award the Decorative Distinction instituted by Order in Council dated tenth March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, to the under-mentioned officer, whose claim to the same has been submitted to His Excellency on account of the Act of Bravery performed by him, as stated against his name :—

Bay of Plenty Cavalry Volunteers	Cornet Angus Smith	On the 7th June, 1869, when the party of Cavalry in charge of Cornet Smith was surprised at Opepe by Te Kooti's band, and nine men out of thirteen were killed, Cornet Smith, though suffering from a desperate wound in his foot, set out with the object of finding the tracks of his Commanding Officer, and apprising him and the party with him of their danger, when a less brave or thoughtful man would have proceeded straight to Fort Galatea, which post he would no doubt have reached in forty-eight hours, with comparatively little risk, and with the certainty of getting immediate medical assistance for himself. On his road, Cornet Smith was captured by the rebels, tied up to a tree, and stripped of all his clothing and Crimean medals. He was in this position four days, without food or water, when he managed to release himself, and proceeded to Fort Galatea, which he reached on the 17th June, having been ten days without food or clothing. On account of his wounds he had to go for a considerable distance on his hands and knees, and to risk his life twice by swimming rivers.

THE following Instructions regarding Pilotage Exemptions, and the Pilotage to be charged on Vessels commanded by Masters holding Exemption Certificates, are issued for the guidance of Customs Officers :—

1. Under the second paragraph of the 19th section of "The Marine Act, 1867," the following fees are for the future to be charged :—

For each renewal of a Pilotage Exemption Certificate in respect

of the change of vessel by the master, if the certificate belong to the master, there shall be paid by him a fee of 1 1 0

And for each renewal when the certificate has been paid for by the owners of the vessel, in respect of a change of master for such vessel, provided always that the new master is competent, to the satisfaction of the Harbour Master of each port, to pilot such vessel, there shall be paid by such owner a fee of 1 1 0

2. No vessel exempt from pilotage is to pay more than one full pilotage per annum at any port included in the Exemption Certificate.

3. On a vessel entering a port where pilotage is charged, the name of which is not included in the Exemption Certificate, she shall be charged full pilotage for said port, or some proportional part of full pilotage, according to the original date of the Exemption Certificate, as explained in the next paragraph; but such pilotage is to be considered the Annual Pilotage, provided the master can obtain a certificate from the Harbour Master of such port that he is competent to take his vessel in and out without the aid of a pilot.

4. As by law the date of payment of the "Annual Pilotage" is fixed by the date of the Exemption Certificate, on a new master assuming charge of a vessel and having a certificate of later date than that of the former master, as many twelfths of a full pilotage are to be charged as the new certificate is later than the other in completed months (neglecting fractions of months). This will bring the date of payment of the next full annual pilotage up to the date of the new certificate.

5. Should the master of any exempted vessel be unwell, or should he be unavoidably detained on shore for some good reason, or should two certificated masters change vessels for mutual or for owners' convenience, the vessel (or vessels) may be cleared for one voyage only under the command of the mate or of any acting-master, without pilotage being charged, provided the Harbour Master is satisfied of the competence of the substitute, it being understood that for such voyage the acting-master merely represents the master.
