To Our Trusty and Loving Subject, George Williams, Doctor of Medicine, Greeting:

WHEREAS on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of New Zealand, did issue in Council a Commission in Our name appointing certain persons named therein to inquire into and report upon the Manufacture of New Zealand Flax, as well as the Cultivation of other varieties of Flax, and to recommend the best means of promoting that Manufacture in the Colony of New Zealand:

And whereas it is desirable to appoint an additional person to the aforesaid Commission:

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and by these presents do authorize and appoint you,

GEORGE WILLIAMS,

to be an additional Commissioner for the purposes and with the powers specified in the said Commission, which Commission continues in full force and virtue, anything herein notwithstanding.

In testimony whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of Our said Colony to be hereunto affixed.

Witness Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued at Auckland, in New Zealand aforesaid, on the second day of November, in the year of Our

Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and in the thirty-third year of Our reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fourth clause of "The Native Lands Act, 1867," it is made lawful for the Governor of New Zealand, by Proclamation, to define Districts within which the operation of "The Native Lands Act, 1865," and "The Native Lands Act, 1867," or any of the provisions thereof, shall be suspended:

Now I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, G.C.M.G., Governor of New Zealand, in Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts shall be suspended, and are suspended, within the district described in the Schedule hereto appended.

Given under the Hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Auckland; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this fourteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to divide the Colony into Judicial Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require :

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February, 1861, the Colony was divided into three districts, to be called respectively "The Northern District," "The Middle District," and "The Southern District:"

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of April, 1863, the said Southern District was, for the purposes of the said Act, further divided into two districts, to be called respectively "The Canterbury District" and "The Otago and Southland District:"

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of October, 1865, three new districts, called respectively "The Canterbury District," "The Westland District," and "The Middle District," were formed and constituted :

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October, 1867, the said Middle District was divided into two districts, called respectively "The Wellington District" and "The Nelson District:" And whereas by the said Proclamation of the twelfth day of October, 1865, the Canterbury District was assigned to Henry Barnes Gresson, Esquire, a Judge of the Supreme Court: And whereas by the said Proclamation of the twenty-sixth day of October, 1867, the Nelson District and the Westland District were assigned to Christopher William Richmond, Esquire, a Judge of the Supreme Court: And whereas it is expedient to alter the limits of the said Canterbury District, and of the said Nelson District and Westland District:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority for this purpose vested in me under and by virtue of the said Act, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, proclaim and declare that all that portion of the Colony bounded as follows, namely:— On the South, by the Province of Otago from the mouth of the Waitaki River to the summit of the dividing range between the East and West Coasts, near Mount Aspiring; on the West, by the Watershed between the East and West Coasts to the summit of Mount Humboldt; on the North, by a straight line from the summit of Mount Humboldt to the point at which the Clarence River flows out of Lake Tennyson, and by the south bank of the Clarence River to the Sea; and on the East by the Sea Coast; shall be and the same is hereby constituted a Judicial District for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be called "The Canterbury District;" and that all that portion of the Colony comprised within the Westland District, as defined by the said Proclamation of the twelfth day of October, 1865, except such part thereof as is hereby included in the Canterbury District, shall be and the same is hereby constituted a Judicial District for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be called "The Westland District;" and that all that portion of the Colony comprised within the Nelson District, as defined by the said Proclamation of the twenty-sixth day of October, 1867, except such part thereof as is hereby included in the Canterbury District, shall be and the same is hereby constituted a Judicial District for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be called "The Nelson District."

And in further pursuance of the power and

authority vested in me by the said Act, I do hereby, by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, proclaim and declare that I assign the said Canterbury District to Henry Barnes Gresson, Esquire, a Judge of the Supreme Court; and the said Westland District and the said Nelson District to Christopher William Richmond, Esquire, a Judge of the Supreme Court. And that Circuit Courts shall be holden for the Canterbury, Westland, and Nelson Districts, as hereby constituted, at the times and places heretofore appointed for the holding of Circuit Courts in the Canterbury District, the Westland District, and the Nelson District respectively, as existing immediately before the date of this Proclamation.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare that, on and from a day named in such Proclamation, the provisions of the twenty-first section and sub-sections respectively of the said Act shall be extended to any Gold Field which may be proclaimed after the passing of the said Act; and the same shall be extended accordingly:

And whereas by a Proclamation of the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, published on the sixth day of May, 1868, and by two Orders in Council of the said Superintendent, published respectively on the fifteenth day of September and the twenty-second day of September, 1869, the areas in the Province of Otago described in the Schedule hereto were respectively proclaimed Gold Fields under the said Act:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power in me vested by the said Act, do hereby declare that on and from the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the provisions contained in the said twenty-first section of the said Act, and the sub-sections thereof respectively, shall be extended to the areas so proclaimed Gold Fields as aforesaid, and described in the Schedule following, that is to say—

SCHEDULE.

All that area bounded towards the North-west by a line proceeding from Mount Ida to Kurow Mountain; thence towards the North and East by a line proceeding from Kurow Mountain over Little Domett Peak to Kakanui Peak, and towards the South and West by the boundary of the present Gold Field to Mount Ida, the starting point.

All that area situate in the Province of Otago, containing by estimation one hundred and forty-five

thousand acres, more or less, bounded by a line proceeding from the boundary of the present Gold Field along the southern boundary of Run 28 and the Otakaik Stream to the Waitaki River; thence to the eastern boundary of the Marawhenua Hundred; thence along the said eastern boundary of the Marawhenua Hundred and the northern and western boundaries of the Kakanui Hundred, and a direct line from the south-west corner of the said Kakanui Hundred to Kakanui Peak; and thence northerly along the boundary of the present Gold Field to the starting point.

All that area situate in the Province of Otago, containing by estimation seventy thousand acres, more or less, bounded by a line proceeding from Kurow Mountain to and along the Little Awakino Stream to the Waitaki River; thence southerly to the confluence of the Otakaik Stream; thence westerly along the said Otakaik Stream and the southern boundary of Run 28, to the boundary of the present Gold Field; thence northerly along the said boundary to Kurow Mountain, the starting point.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, make provision for the examination of exported gold, not being gold coin, and respecting the mode of packing and securing the same, and may prohibit the exportation thereof, except from specified ports, and generally may regulate and restrict the export of gold, other than gold coin; and further, that the Governor may from time to time regulate and restrict the carriage of gold, other than gold coin, coastwise, from one port of the Colony to another: And whereas by "The Gold Duty Act, 1858," provision is made for levying a duty upon gold exported from New Zealand:

And whereas by Proclamation dated the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, on the nineteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the Governor did, in pursuance and exercise of the aforesaid power and authority, declare and proclaim that no gold, other than gold coin, should thereafter be shipped from any part of the Colony of New Zealand, either for exportation or to be carried coastwise from one port to another in the said Colony, except gold upon which the said export duty in and by "The Gold Duty Act, 1858," aforesaid, authorized to be levied, shall have been duly levied by and paid to the Collector of Customs for the port from which the same gold shall be first shipped:

And whereas it is expedient to exempt from the above recited restriction, gold, the produce of the Province of Auckland, and to permit the same to be removed from any port within the said Province of Auckland to the Port of Auckland, previous to the duty being paid thereon:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power in me vested for this purpose, do hereby proclaim and declare that gold, the produce of the Province of Auckland, may be shipped and carried coastwise from any port in the Province of Auckland to the Port of Auckland, without the export duty in and by "The Gold Duty Act, 1858," being first levied or paid thereon.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Now the condition of the above-written obligation is such that if the said _____ from time to time, so long as he shall continue and be employed in the said office, shall duly perform the duties of the said office, under the said Act and under "The Mining Companies Limited Liability Act Amendment Act, 1869," and duly account for and pay over all moneys which shall come to the possession or be under the control of himself or his agents, by reason of or by virtue of the said office or employment; and shall from time to time observe and keep all such orders and instructions as he shall receive from the Governor of New Zealand for the time being touching the due performance and execution of the said office; and shall from time to time, and at all times hereafter, so long as he shall hold the said office, well and truly, faithfully and honestly, to the best of his skill and ability, exercise, obey, discharge, and perform all the duties thereof, and also all the powers, directions, duties, and obligations given to, conferred upon, or to be performed and discharged by him under any law for the time being relating to the said office; and shall, when thereunto required, deliver up all books, deeds, orders and decrees of the Judges of the District Court or of the Supreme Court, vouchers and other papers relating to the said office, and also such commission, warrant, or authority as he hath received or shall receive from the Governor, to such person as the Governor shall direct and appoint to receive the same; and shall obey all orders of any Judge of the District Court, or of the Supreme Court, duly made in relation to any books, accounts, papers, and documents, of or belonging to any Company; and shall permit and give every reasonable facility for the audit of his accounts, then this obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue: Provided always that no more than the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds shall be recoverable from each of them the said sureties by virtue of the above-written obligation.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to

delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

And whereas it is further provided that whenever the Governor shall have delegated to the Superintendent of any Province all or any of the aforesaid powers, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to appoint and declare that all costs, charges and expenses, incident to the management and administration of the Gold Fields within such Province shall be regulated by Acts or Ordinances to be passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of such Province:

And whereas by instruments in writing, bearing date the twentieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, issued under the Seal of the Colony, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, and in exercise of the before-recited power, hath delegated to the Superintendents of the Provinces of Hawke's Bay and Wellington respectively, in the said Colony, all the aforesaid powers, excepting those before recited to be excepted, to hold and exercise the said powers within the Provinces aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority for this purpose by the said Act conferred, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, appoint and declare that all the costs, charges and expenses, incident to the management and administration of the Gold Fields, within the aforesaid Provinces, shall be regulated by Acts to be passed by the Superintendents and Provincial Councils thereof.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold Field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint

TENDERS will be received at this Office until the twentieth day of December, 1869, from persons willing to supply the New Zealand Government with Stationery, to be delivered free of expense in this Colony, at such Port as the Government may indicate, for the Twelve Months commencing on the first June, 1870.

1. The value of all necessary packages, whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices demanded, and the net weight or quantity only will be paid for.

2. A bond for the sum of £1,000, the Contractor in the sum of £500 and two approved sureties of £500 each, for the due performance of the contract, will be required to be entered into within a month of the acceptance of the contract.

3. The Tenderers will be required to forward samples of the articles marked with an asterisk. Each sample must be indorsed with the number given to it in the Schedule.

4. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the Schedule.

5. In the case of different makers' goods, the Contractors will be required to supply the kind ordered.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution.

7. The Contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantity of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates.

8. The acceptance of the supplies will be subject to the approval of the officers in the various Provinces appointed by the Government. The Contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must without delay give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the Contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the Contractor's account.

10. It will be competent either for the Contractor on his own behalf, or for the Honorable the Colonial Secretary on behalf of the Government, to terminate

the contract by giving notice in writing of three months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

11. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the Contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportional allowance, by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

12. A separate tender having been invited for certain descriptions of Printing Paper, the acceptance of any tender for the same descriptions of paper enumerated herein will be only for such quantities as may be required during the year in addition to the quantities contracted for by such separate tender.

NOTES.

- Mongonui.*—Pleasant weather during the month; though rain fell on eighteen days, the total quantity was considerably below the average. Thunder on 4th, lightning without thunder on 6th and 26th; hail fell on 27th—a rare occurrence at this station. Prevailing wind S.W.
- Auckland.*—Fine weather generally; small rainfall, and winds moderate; the latter part of month was rather wet and squally; thunder on 5th and 29th. Prevailing winds S. and S.W.
- Taranaki.*—On the whole very fine pleasant weather during the month. Stormy on 6th, with hail and rain; storm on 28th from W., with thunder and lightning, and slight rain. Prevailing winds from S.W. and W.
- Wellington.*—Stormy, unpleasant weather from 1st to 6th, from N.W., with rain at times; remarkably fine clear N.W. weather from 7th up to 21st, when wind changed to S.E., and brought rain and strong wind occasionally, which continued till the 25th, the wind often shifting to N.W. The remainder of month was fine, except on 28th, which was stormy, with rain. Earthquake on 30th, two slight shocks at 9 p.m.; twenty days of N.W. wind.
- Nelson.*—Fine weather, with little rain, and winds moderate; there was a heavy fall of rain on 2nd (2.60 inches). Prevailing winds S.W. and N.W.
- Christchurch.*—Very fine, pleasant weather throughout the month; hail on 6th and 28th. Prevailing winds E. and S.W.
- Bealey.*—Early part of month showery and unpleasant, but very fine from 7th to 20th; the remainder of the month was generally wet and disagreeable; thunder on 2nd and 5th; snow on 6th, 24th, and 28th (3 inches on first and last date); hail on 5th. Prevailing wind N.W.
- Hokitika.*—Very stormy weather during the month, often with thunder and lightning, and heavy rain; there was, however, some pleasant weather in middle of month. Prevailing wind N.W.
- Dunedin.*—Very agreeable weather at this station throughout month, except on 28th and 29th, when it was very stormy from S.W., with rain; thunder on 2nd and 21st. Prevailing wind W. and S.W.
- Southland.*—Fine weather during the month; westerly gales on 21st, 26th, 28th, and 29th.

GENERAL REMARKS.

Prevalent westerly winds. The only marked change which appears to have been generally felt was from fine to broken weather on the 21st (full moon), the fine weather having commenced almost at every station with new moon on the 7th.
